## **Statement of Principal**

Equine Canada, the National Federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction.

Equine Canada is committed to:

- Upholding the welfare of horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities.
- Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment.
- Ensuring that owners, trainers, exhibitors and their agents use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any Purpose.
- Providing for the continuous well being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, sanitation and safety as a matter of standard operating procedures:
- Providing current information on Code of Practice for the Care and Handling of Equines and other equine health and welfare initiatives.
- Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- Requiring owners, trainers and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules and to work with industry regulations in all equestrian competitions.
- Actively promoting the development and adherence of competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a responsible person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive nor inhumane.

## **Code of Conduct**

EC rules address the following general areas:

- Welfare of the horse
- Safety of horse and human athlete
- Administration of competitions
- Code of conduct for officials and competitors
- Drug and medication control
- Individual breed and discipline rules

## **Carmaz Stables Horse Show Rules**

Carmaz Stables Horse Show is a sanctioned Bronze competition, member of Equine Canada, 308 Legget Dr, Suite 100, Ottawa Ontario, K2K 1Y6 and is governed by the rules of EC.

Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC rulebook. (A602.2)

### **ENTRIES:**

- 1) Entries are asked to be in by June 12<sup>th</sup>. Any entry received, and not postmarked by that date, will be considered a late entry and subject to the \$15 per horse late fee on top of the regular fees.
- 2) All information must be completed on the show form and all forms signed for the entry to be accepted
- 3) Cheques are made payable to "Carmaz Stables Horse Show". No postdated cheques please. NSF cheques will be charged a \$50 admin fee. For the convenience of the competitors, we will also accept emailed entries if only accompanied or followed by an email money transfer. - 4) Entries can be mailed to Carmaz Stables c/o show secretary, 45933 Homestead road, River Glade NB, E4Z 6J4 or emailed to [carmazstables@mail.com](mailto:carmazstables@mail.com). See above for e-transfer info.
- 5) All entries must be made in writing (Article 801.4). Competition numbers will not be issued if all the required signatures are not complete. Entries must include copies of memberships ( EC bronze and PTSO) and proof of vaccinations ( rabies, flu, rhino, and tetanus)
- 6) Post entries will be accepted up to one hour prior to the class and will be subject to an additional charge of \$5 on top of the regular class fee or division fee
- 7) Entry forms must be signed by the exhibitor, owner and person responsible. If the owner or exhibitor is under 19 years of age, the entry must be signed by a parent or legal guardian who assumes all responsibility and risk as stated on the form and by these rules and regulations. The entry form for all sanctioned competitions shall also be signed by the person responsible for the care, training, custody and performance of the horse. The person responsible may be the trainer, owner, rider, agent or coach. The parent or guardian must sign the form if there is no other person responsible. The person responsible must be present at the competition and if they cannot attend, must appoint a representative who is present on the show grounds and must notify the competition secretary (Article A1011) With the exception of a parent ( see A214.2), the person responsible who signs an entry form must hold a EC or USEF individual license. (A203.5)
- 8) Foreign entries must sign an affidavit ( Article A404).
- 9) Bronze classes do not require passports or Jump Canada levy. EC bronze competition do not count for EC National Awards.
- 10) Bronze sport licenses are required for all bronze classes and can be purchased at [www.equinecanada.ca](http://www.equinecanada.ca).

11) Entry fees are \$15/class or \$40/division. Carmaz Classic is \$30. Scratches will not be reimbursed.

**Equine Medication Control:**

12) Any horse, in any class at the competition, may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location (Article A602.5).

13) Equine Medication Control Fee: \$3.50

**General Information:**

14) Official protests must be made in writing to the secretary of the competition, signed and accompanied by a \$100 cash deposit within 48 hours of completion of the class ( EC Article A1204)

15) Hors Concours entries are not allowed.

16) Competition numbers must be worn and visible at all times in the show ring and in the warmup ring ( EC Article A814)

17) Ribbons to 6<sup>th</sup> and some classes may have money payouts or prizes

18) Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of Equine Canada and will be held and judged in accordance with the Equine Canada rule book. Any incident requiring a ruling which cannot be referenced to the EC rule book, will be rendered by the show committee.

19) Management has the right to expel any rider, owner or spectator deemed to be in their sole discretion disruptive to the show at any time

20) We ask that no dogs be on the property.

21) Medical First Aid kit located in the porch in the canteen. 911 for all serious injuries.

22) Canteen on site

23) All riders, grooms, attendants and handlers must be neatly dressed on entering the ring. Article G109 Dress. Dress code for jumpers G109 – polo shirts are acceptable attire in the jumper ring.

24) Per Article A801, every entry at an EC sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and each horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition.

25) Limited stalls are available. Please call ahead for availability. Preference will be given to those traveling the furthest. Can also contact local barns if our barn gets full. \$35 for Sunday. \$55 for Sat. night and Sunday (arrival after 6pm sat ). \$75 for Fri. night, sat for the CSHA inspection and for the show Sunday.

**Hunter Divisions:** Miscellaneous, not rated for EC awards. Open to seniors riding horses or large ponies and juniors on horse or pony. A pony shown by an adult must not be shown by a junior at the same competition. Juniors of any age may show any height of pony in misc., not point classes. Article G306 2&3. Distances will not be adjusted for ponies. G201, G202. Must have completed one over fences class to qualify for the under saddle class. G318

Entry fees are \$15/class or \$40/division. Carmaz Classic is \$30

**Crossrail Division:** Shown at a trot or canter over 7-8 crossrails; maximum height 18". Emphasis will be placed on a) horses ridden in a safe and controlled manner b) a correct and effective path to and away from the fences c) jumping style.

**Intro Division:** Shown at a trot or canter over 7-8 low verticals or oxers; maximum height 22". Emphasis will be placed on a) horses ridden in a safe and controlled manner b) a correct and effective path to and away from the fences c) jumping style

**Beginner Division:** Shown at a canter over 8-10 fences consisting of verticals and oxers with a max height of 2'6". To be judged on obedience, form and general way of going.

**Low Division:** Shown at a canter over 8-10 fences. Max height 2'9". To be judged on obedience, form and general way of going.

Class 13. To be shown at a canter over 8-12 fences for first round and a shortened course for the second round. May include combinations, broken lines and roll backs. Max height 2'6". Top 8 from the first round to return in order of 8<sup>th</sup> position up to 1<sup>st</sup> for the second round. Numerical scoring from both rounds will be use. Top score from both rounds will be the winner.

**Jumper Divisions** Not rated for EC Awards. Equine Canada rules G701-708 FEI Article 201-227. See EC jumper rules. Junior, amateur or non pro riders may not compete in draw reins G502. A horse/rider combination is permitted upward movement through divisions, but downward movement is restricted to only one level. These movements are based on the level of the first class in which they compete. G604.3

**ASSUMPTION OF RISKS**

I am aware and understand that activities involving these horses involve many risks, dangers and hazards, including, but not limited to the following:

1. Horses, which are powerful and potentially dangerous animals, may change their behavior at any time and may, without warning, jump, run wildly, buck, kick, bite or step on people or things;
2. Horses may collide with other horses or objects or trip, stumble or fall even if being led, ridden or driven, or attended to;
3. Negligence ( which means, in general terms, a failure to exercise ordinary or proper care) of other riders or drivers my or my child’s own failure to ride safely, within my or my child’s ability or within designated areas and trails;
4. Equipment may fail;
5. Weather conditions can change and can sometimes be dangerous;
6. The nature of the terrain can change and has certain risks associated with it including, but not limited to, exposed natural objects, trees, streams and creeks;
7. The activities can sometimes be in remote areas and injuries or illness may occur and it may be a considerable distance to doctors, hospitals or any other type of assistance; and
8. Negligence on the part of A PROPERTY OWNER AND/OR THE PROVIDER OR THEIR STAFF. I am also aware that the risks, dangers and hazards referred to above exist throughout the trail, stable, practice and other areas and many are unmarked. I understand and acknowledge that no amount of caution, experience or instruction can eliminate all of the risks involved and I freely accept and fully assume all such risks, dangers and hazards and the possibility of personal injury, death, property damage and damages or loss resulting there from.

**RELEASE OF LIABILITY, WAIVER OF CLAIMS AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT**
