BRONZE NBEA YEAR END AWARDS – 2018

Classes in which a rider or horse places $1^{st} - 6^{th}$ and earns points leading to a Championship or Reserve Championship year end award.

English classes: Equitation, Road Hack, Pleasure

Pony Equitation, Pony Road Hack, Pony Pleasure

Beginner Hunter Intro Hunter

Heritage Low Hunter

Age Divisions for Equitation, Road Hack and Pleasure are Senior, Junior and Junior C

Age Divisions for Pony: Junior and Junior C riders. Only Junior riders may ride ponies in the pony division. Junior A riders may only ride large ponies.

Beginner and Intro Hunter: Open to Junior and Senior riders. Juniors of any age may show any height pony in these classes. A pony shown by an adult in these classes may not be shown by a Junior at the same competition. Adults may only ride large ponies.

Heritage Low Hunter: Open to Junior and Senior riders riding horses. Competition organizers may request the descriptions for these Hunter classes from the NBEA or read the document on the NBEA website.

Equitation points are achieved by the rider and all other English classes are based on the placing of the horse or pony. Riders may only enter one equitation class per discipline at any competition.

A Junior rider maintains junior age status until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18. Junior C riders are such until the end of the year in which they turn 12.

Western classes: Showmanship, Equitation, Pleasure

Pony Equitation, Pony Pleasure, Pony Showmanship

Barrel Racing, Trail

Age Division for Showmanship is Jr and Jr. 13 yrs and under.

Age Division for Equitation and Pleasure is Senior, Junior and Jr. 13yrs and under.

Age Division for Pony Division: Junior and Junior 13 yrs and under.

Age Division for Barrels: Senior, Junior and Jr. 13 yrs and under

Equitation and Showmanship points are earned by the rider. All other western points are based on the placing of the horse or pony. Riders may enter only one equitation class per discipline at any competition.

Points will be tabulated by multiplying the point value of the placing by the number of horses/ponies in the class. Points are tabulated from the results submitted by the show secretary to the NBEA. Competitions are encouraged to identify, in the Prize List, the classes from which results are submitted for tabulation of NBEA year end awards.

Note to Competition Managers

All competitions that are including point classes in their Prize List, for NBEA year end awards, are required to notify the NBEA by March 31st. The competition will be identified on the website as a competition where points may be accrued.

Competition managers who cannot meet this deadline may offer point classes for the riders to gain points but it is possible that the website list will not be edited after April 1st. Competitions may not submit points or offer point classes to gain NBEA awards if they do not notify the NBEA 60 days prior to their competition date.
