from a sponsor, owner/rider of horses trained to supporting your training experience.)
Coaching Experience
At least two years coaching experience producing students competing at Second Level or higher, with a minimum score of 60% at Gold shows (Any documentation providing evidence such as: Name/date of shows, names of judges, copy of judge's sheet. Please provide a letter(s) from a sponsor/parent/rider supporting your coaching experience.)
<u>HUNTER/JUMPER</u>

To have successfully completed courses at a minimum of two (2) shows at 3'6" (1m10) in the hunter or jumper divisions at Silver or Gold shows (Any documentation providing evidence such as: Name/date of shows, name of judges a letter(s) from a sponsor/coach/show official supporting your competitive experience.) Training Experience
To have prepared a horse which has successfully completed courses at a minimum of two (2)
shows at 3' 6" (1m10) in the hunter and or Jumper divisions at Silver or Gold shows (Any documentation providing evidence such as: Name/date of shows, name of judges, a letter(s) from a sponsor, owner/rider of horses trained to supporting your training experience.)
Coaching Experience
At least two years coaching experience producing students who have successfully completed courses at 3'0" (90cm) in the hunter or jumper divisions at Silver or Gold shows (Any documentation providing evidence such as: Name of show, name of judges, a letter(s) from a sponsor/parent/rider supporting your coaching experience.)
<u>EVENTING</u>
Competitive Experience
Personal experience at the CNC 1*/National Preliminary Horse Trials level. (Any documentation providing evidence such as: Name/date of events, name of judges a letter(s) from a sponsor/coach/show official supporting your competitive experience.)
Training Experience
Practical experience in developing a young horse to the CNC 1*/National Preliminary Horse Trials level. (Any documentation providing evidence such as: Name/date of events, a letter(s) from a sponsor, owner/rider of horses trained to supporting your training experience.)
Coaching Experience
A minimum of two (2) students currently at the national Training Horse Trials level or above and working towards competing at a CNC 1*/National Preliminary Horse Trials competition. To complete evaluation, the candidate must have coached or be coaching at least one student at the CNC 1*/national Preliminary Horse Trials level.
