The Cadence Stables show is sanctioned as a Bronze competition member of Equestrian Canada (EC), 308 Leggit Drive, Suite 100, Ottawa, Ontario, K2K-1Y6 and is governed by the rules of EC. Every class offered herein is covered by the current rules and specifications of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the rules of EC.

### STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLE

Equestrian Canada (EC), the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to the humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction. All Persons shall be committed to:

- upholding the welfare of all horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities;
- requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and compassion, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment;
- ensuring that all Equestrians including owners, trainers and competitors, or their respective
  agents, use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their own
  horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose;
- providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure;
- providing current information on Code of Practice for the Care and Handling of Equines and other equine health and welfare initiatives;
- continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare; requiring owners, trainers and competitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions; and

 actively promoting the development and adherence of competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a person who is informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and competition procedures would determine to be neither cruel, abusive, nor inhumane.

**Code of Conduct**: Equestrian Canada 's Code of Conduct and Ethics policy, found in the General Regulations, is to promote a safe and positive environment within Equestrian Canada programs, activities and events, by making all Persons aware that there is a expectation at all times of appropriate behaviour, consistent with the values of Canada, Section A General Regulations page iii.

### **SHOW RULES**

### Administration:

- 1) All entry forms due no later than five (5) days prior to the show as entries may need to be limited in some classes for safety and management purposes.
- 2) Any late entries received after 5 days prior to the show date will be charged an additional administration fee of \$35.00 per horse.
- 3) All information must be completed and all forms signed and accompanied by payment for the entry to be accepted.
- 4) Drop off or mail show forms to: Megan Craft c/o Les Écuries de la Cadence Stables, 1280 Charters Settlement Road, NB E3C 1W3.
- 5) Make all cheques payable to "Cadence Stables".
- 6) All cheques must accompany entry form(s).
- 7) Copies of sport license, NBEA membership, negative coggins (within 2 years) and proof of vaccinations (Flu, Rhino, Tetanus and Strangles) must accompany entry form. No post-dated cheques accepted. NSF cheques will be charged \$50 administration fee.
- 8) No entries will be accepted by telephone or fax.
- 9) All entries must be made in writing (Article A801.4) and paid in full. The show numbers will not be issued if all the required signatures are not complete.
- 10) Administration Fee and drug fee will be charged: \$35 for administration and \$3.50 for Bronze Drug Fee).
- 11) Hunter Classes are paid by division only whether you enter one or all classes.
- 12) Jumper Classes are paid for on a class basis.
- 13) Post entries will be accepted up to 3 classes before scheduled class and will be subject to an additional \$5 charge per class or division.
- 14) Scratches will not be reimbursed.
- 15) Official protests must be made in writing to the secretary of the competition, signed and accompanied by a \$100.00 cash deposit within 48 hours of competition of the class, Equestrian Canada Article A1204.

- 16) Ribbons 1st to 6th place. Championship prizes awarded to high point Horse/Rider combination accumulated at the show for Intro and Beginner Hunter, Jumper Divisions. Other championship prizes may be given if entries in other divisions are large enough.
- 17) Competition number must be worn and visible at all times anywhere out of the stable at the event location, whether the horse is being hand walked or ridden. Section G Annex 1 page 101 1.2.
- 18) No pony shall be shown in any performance class where height is a restriction A1102 they must have the information recorded in the Horse Recording or a temporary measurement card available prior to the start of the class or the entry will not be allowed to compete. See G111 Pony Measurement. All foreign ponies must have an EC pony measurement card. ARTICLE G111 PONY MEASUREMENT 4. Ponies eight years and over that have been officially measured in this process will be issued an official measurement card. 5. Ponies under eight years of age must be measured annually and will be issued a temporary measurement form. Show Committee reserves the right to measure any pony or horse entered in the show. If you have a pony which requires a measurement contact the competition prior to the event
- 19) If less than four entries are received for any class, the show committee reserves the right to cancel or combine classes.
- 20) Entry forms must be signed by competitor, owner and person responsible (Article A801). If the owner or exhibitor is under 19 years of age, the entry must be signed by a parent or legal guardian who assumes all responsibility and risk as stated on the form and by these rules and regulations. Parents and guardians are entitled to sign their children's entry forms without being EC members or holders of a Sport License. The entry form for all sanctioned competitions shall also be signed by the person responsible for the care, training, custody and performance of the horse.

The person responsible may be the trainer, owner, rider, agent or coach. The parent or guardian must sign the entry form for the minor/owner if there is no other person responsible. The person responsible is to be present at the competition and if they cannot attend, must appoint a representative who is present on the show grounds and must notify the competition secretary. Such substitute Person Responsible shall place his or her name on the entry form forthwith and thereby shall assume full responsibility for the performance of the duties. Article A1011.

The person responsible who signs an entry form must hold an EC or USEF individual license. When the competitor is a Junior/minor owner, the competitor cannot be the Person Responsible and the Person Responsible may be a parent/guardian. Parents/guardians are not required to have an EC Sport License or EC Registered Participant status provided they agree to abide by the rules and penalties in the Rule Book and acknowledge that they are liable under the penalty provisions of the Rules for any violations of the EC rules by their minor child. Foreign entries must sign an affidavit (Article A213.1).

21) Per Article A801, every entry at an EC-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and

horses shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC-sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC-sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition.

- 22) Management has the right to expel any rider, owner or spectator deemed to be in their sole discretion disruptive to the show at any time.
- 23) Dogs must be leashed or caged while on the show grounds. The Owners are solely and expressly responsible for their dogs and the dog's behavior. Owners of loose dogs will be charged \$75.00 to retrieve their pets.
- 24) Absolutely "NO" smoking permitted on show grounds.
- 25) The show office will open one (1) hour prior to the start of the show and close 1/2 hour at the end of the show.
- 26) Bronze classes do not require Horse Recording. Bronze Sport licenses are required for all Bronze classes and can be purchased at www.equestrian.ca. Article A 207.
- 27) No fee for substitution of a horse (A603).

### **Services Offered**

- 1) A limited number of Box Stalls are available at a cost of \$30.00 per stall per night, bagged shavings are for sale \$7.00 per bag. Stalls are to be cleaned out at the end of the show. Priority will be given to exhibitors traveling from outside the Fredericton area.
- 2) Hay is available at \$5.00 per bale.
- 3) Warm up area will be available on the show grounds one hour before the competition on the day of competition. No horses may warm-up over fences in the competition arena regardless if the arena is unlocked or unattended.
- 4) Cadence Stables main ring is 230' x 130'.

### **Directions:**

To get to Les Écuries de la Cadence Stables take the Exit 285A at New Maryland continue on Hwy 101 through New Maryland and keep to the right from Hwy 101 onto Charters Settlement Road (there will be a fork in the road) Drive to the end of the road (approx. 6km). The stables are on the right-hand side.

### **Exhibitor and Owner Requirements**

- 1) Equestrian Canada Bronze Sport License and NBEA membership are required to compete in Bronze classes. Riders from the USA must have the equivalent USEF membership or otherwise purchase a temporary Sport Licence. Equestrian Canada Bronze License is NOT required for exhibitors competing only in Lead Line.
- 2) Bronze memberships may be purchased online at <a href="www.equestriancanada.ca">www.equestriancanada.ca</a>. Your receipt will be proof of memberships. Temporary one-day memberships are no longer available.
- 3) Any horse entered in any class at a competition, may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location. (Article A602.5)
- 4) COGGINS TEST must be shown at office when picking up ring numbers. Coggins tests with a stamped date within two years of competition date will be accepted.
- 5) Horses must show proof of annual vaccinations for rabies, tetanus, flu and strangles. This includes any horse (non-competing) brought onto the property.
- 6) Non-showing horses: All horses brought on the property during the competition must have a signed entry blank and owners must have a current NBEA membership. Anyone riding non-competing horses which have been brought on to the show grounds must wear a number issued by the office and have a current NBEA membership. Non-showing horses must meet coggins and vaccination requirements.
- 7) Amateur Owners must have current credentials (Article G108). An eligible temporary sport license holder may compete in amateur classes provided an Amateur Affidavit has been completed and is on file with the competition secretary (A208.4). A photocopy of the current amateur card must be attached with entry A802 .5 e).
- 8) As per Equestrian Canada rule article A805, the Show Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry, except as provided in 805.2 (a, b, c, d, e). The competition may refuse any entry failing to comply with the Prize List regulations or any competitor or owner who is determined to have failed to adhere to the standard of sportsmanship behaviour outlined in the Code of Conduct (A805.3).
- 9) The show will forfeit 75% of the entry fee less the fees for classes completed if the horse entered is withdrawn due to unsoundness or sickness provided a veterinarian's certificate is produced, dated no later than the closing day of the show and received within 10 days of the show date.
- 10) All riders, grooms, attendants and handlers must be neatly dressed on entering the ring. ARTICLE G109 DRESS. Dress code for jumpers G109 polo shirts are acceptable attire in the jumper ring.

### **SAFETY RULES:**

### 1) ARTICLE G102 HEADGEAR

a. At all EC-sanctioned competitions, all competitors, including foreign competitors in EC National classes, must wear approved headgear, (see Glossary in General Regulations, Book A), with safety harness correctly fastened, at all times while mounted on the competition grounds.

- b. Juniors showing any horse in a jog for soundness must wear approved protective headwear with the attached safety harness fastened.
- c. Failure to comply with G102.1 or G102.2 in the exercise area and/or the competition arena will result in the following penalties:
  - i. 1st violation at competition: warning.
  - ii. 2nd violation at same competition: disqualification from the competition and forfeiture of all fees and prize monies.
- d. EC makes no representation or warranty expressed or implied about any protective headgear and cautions riders that serious injury or death may result despite wearing such headgear as all equestrian sports involve inherent dangerous risk and adds no protective headgear can protect against all foreseeable injuries.
- e. All violations which occur outside the competition arena will be reported to the judge/jury who will levy the applicable penalty.
- f. All violations which occur in the competition arena will be acted upon by the judge(s) who will levy the applicable penalty.
- g. For all competitors, if the harness comes undone or the hat falls off, the rider must retrieve and/or do up the hat, with assistance if necessary, before the next obstacle is taken. There will be no penalty other than the loss of time. Failure to do up the harness or retrieve protective headgear immediately results in elimination.
- 2) The show committee does not accept responsibility for accidents or illness to horses, riders, grooms, spectators or any other persons.
- 3) Exhibitors competing for provincial points are requested to enter the animal in the name of the member of the family who is the official Equestrian Canada member.

### 4) ARTICLE G101 EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES

It is mandatory that all national and provincial competitions have on site emergency medical services with a minimum of advanced first aid and basic cardiac life support (BCLS). Jumping in competition and warm-up areas should be suspended if the sole medic onsite is handling an emergency she/he cannot leave.

### 5) ARTICLE G103 FALLS

After being eliminated for a fall, the rider may not remount in the ring. Any rider who does remount in the ring after a fall will be eliminated from all classes in that ring for the remainder of the day. A rider who remounts after a fall and takes another obstacle will be disqualified from the remainder of the show.

### 6) ARTICLE G104 IN-GATE

In all classes, trotting or cantering through the in-gate without prior permission is forbidden. The penalty for contravening this rule is either a fine or elimination from the class, at the discretion of

the judge. Under special circumstances, a steward or judge may give permission for a horse to trot into the ring, but not out of the ring.

### 7) ARTICLE G105 STALLIONS

- 1. Junior B and C riders must not ride or handle stallions anywhere on the competition grounds. Jr. A riders may ride manageable stallions in jumper classes only. A stallion ridden by a Junior must be accompanied at all times by a competent adult/handler Person Responsible.' and 4. Stallions may not be ridden in Pony Jumpers.
- 2. Manageable stallions ridden by seniors are eligible for all senior classes.

### 8) ARTICLE A808 and G501 HORS CONCOURS

- 1. "Hors Concours" entries may be accepted at the competition committee's discretion but are subject to the same scoring rules as a regular entry with respect to falls, elimination etc. Such entries are not judged and are not eligible for the jump off.
- 2. A horse or pony that has competed "Hors Concours" is not allowed to compete subsequently in the same ring on the same day.
- 3. "Hors Concours" entries will follow the last regular entry in the class.
- 4. "Hors Concours" is not allowed in the EC Hunter Division. G201.3
- 9) Cell phones, IPODS, etc. are not recommended to be used while riding. See ARTICLE G114)
- 10) Any horse that becomes out of control shall be eliminated from the competition at the discretion of the judge.
- Lunging will not be permitted in the warm-up ring if there are any riders in the warm up ring.
- 12) Schooling Rules: reference Hunter/Jumper schooling rules see Annex 1 page 101 Section G rule book. FEI Schooling Rules will be in place.

### **BRONZE HORSE SHOW**

New Brunswick riders must have a NBEA membership. Bronze Competition Sport License must be purchased from Equestrian Canada – printed receipt will be accepted as proof of membership.

Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rules.

Horses entering Intro Hunter, Pre-Beginner Hunter, Beginner Hunter and Heritage Low Hunter at Bronze sanctioned competitions may only enter 2 of 3 divisions (Example: Intro and Pre-Beginner Hunter, or Pre-Beginner and Beginner, or Beginner and Heritage Low Hunter).

Open to Junior and Senior riders. Juniors of any age may show any height pony in these classes. A pony shown by an adult in these classes may not be shown by a Junior at the same competition. Adults may only ride large ponies.

In order for under saddle classes to count for awards, a horse must show and complete at least one over-fences class in the corresponding division.

HUNTER DIVISION

Conduct of Hunter classes G401

Miscellaneous, not rated for Equestrian Canada Awards

Entry Fee: \$60 per division (2 over fences + 1 under saddle)

### Intro Hunter:

### Over fences:

A simple hunter course of at least 8 fences with no combinations. Emphasis of judging on manners, obedience and style. Trotting to fences will not be penalized. Distances will not be adjusted for horses and ponies. Maximum height and width of fences to be 22" (0.55m). Fences may be low verticals or cross rails. The majority of fences will be 18" (0.45m). Open to seniors riding horses or large ponies and juniors riding horses or ponies or any height. A pony shown in judged classes by an adult may not be shown by a junior in a judged class at the same competition.

### Under Saddle:

To be shown at walk, trot and canter, both ways of the ring. No more than eight horses will be asked to hand-gallop at one time. Horses /ponies must have completed the course in at least one over fences class in their respective division. In order for under saddle classes to count for awards, a horse must show and complete at least one over fences class in the corresponding division.

### Pre-Beginner Hunter: (2'3") 0.70m

### Over fences:

To complete a hunter-type jumping course of at least 8 obstacles not to exceed 2'3" (0.70m) in height. To be judged on obedience, jumping form and general way of going. The class is open to seniors riding horses or large ponies and juniors riding horses or ponies. The course may, but is not required, to be adjusted in height and distance for ponies. Juniors of any age may show any height of pony in miscellaneous, non-point classes. A pony shown in judged classes by an adult may not be shown by a junior in a judged class at the same competition

### **Under Saddle:**

To be shown at walk, trot and canter, both ways of the ring. No more than eight horses will be asked to hand-gallop at one time. Horses /ponies must have completed a course in at least one over fences class in their respective division. In order for under saddle classes to count for awards, a horse must show and complete at least one over-fences class in the corresponding division.

### Beginner Hunter:

### Over fences:

To complete a hunter-type jumping course of at least 8 obstacles not to exceed 2'6" (0.75m) in height. To be judged on obedience, jumping form and general way of going. The class is open to seniors riding horses or large ponies and juniors riding horses or ponies. The course may, but is not required, to be adjusted in height and distance for ponies. Juniors of any age may show any height of pony in miscellaneous, non-point classes. A pony shown in judged classes by an adult may not be shown by a junior in a judged class at the same competition.

### Under Saddle:

To be shown at walk, trot and canter, both ways of the ring. No more than eight horses will be asked to hand-gallop at one time. Horses /ponies must have completed a course in at least one over fences class in their respective division. In order for under saddle classes to count for awards, a horse must show and complete at least one over-fences class in the corresponding division.

### **Heritage Low Hunter:**

### Over fences:

### Under Saddle:

To be shown at walk, trot and canter, both ways of the ring. No more than eight horses will be asked to hand-gallop at one time. Horses must have completed a course in at least one over fences class in their respective division. In order for under saddle classes to count for awards, a horse must show and complete at least one over-fences class in the corresponding division.

Entry Fee: \$20 per class

Prize: Ribbons only

Equitation classes are divided by age groups as follows: Individuals are juniors until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18. Article A901.

Routine on the flat: Article G1007. Riders will proceed at least once around the ring at each gait — walk, trot and canter, reverse and repeat. At the judge's discretion, they may be asked to execute an individual test.

27) Hunt seat equitation B & C Flat (not to jump) Equestrian Canada

Junior B Riders are such from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 13 until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 15 (12, 13, 14 on Jan 1 of this year). Junior C Riders are such until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 12.

28) Hunt Seat equitation A Flat (not to jump) Equestrian Canada

Riders are such from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16 until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18 (15, 16, 17 on Jan 1 of this year).

29) Hunt Seat equitation Amateur Senior flat (not to jump) Equestrian Canada as set out in article G1006.1 Members will be classified as Senior from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 19 (18 or older on Jan 1 of this year).

Entry Fee: \$20 per class

1. English Pleasure: To be shown at a flat-footed walk, normal trot and easy canter and not to gallop; light contact with the horse's mouth; to be judged on performance, manners and conformation.

Road Hack: Horses to enter ring at a walk. To be shown at a flat-footed walk with a reasonably loose rein, trot, strong trot, easy canter and hand gallop. Only 8 horses to hand gallop at one time. To be judged on performance, substance, conformation and manners.

30) Lead Line Equitation (miscellaneous class not rated for EC awards). This class is open to children not entered in any other class. An EC membership is not required to enter this class. A Senior NBEA member must be holding the leadline and accompany the rider in the warm-up and competition rings. Approved protective headgear and boots with a heel are required. For rider under 10.

New in 2018, the NBEA is offering year end award for a new division for our young, beginner riders. This division is open to riders until the end of the year in which they turn 12 years old. The Walk/Trot Division will offer two classes: Equitation and Pleasure. Miscellaneous — Not rated for EC Awards in this division.

<u>WALK/TROT DIVISION – 12 years and under - Miscellaneous, not rated for Equestrian Canada</u>
Awards. Riders who enter the Walk/Trot Under 12 division may not cross enter, at the same competition, into classes which require the rider to canter or ride over fences.

The Walk/Trot Division will offer two classes: Equitation and Pleasure. The division is open to riders, 12 years of age and younger, up until the end of the year in which they turn 12. Riders who enter the Walk/Trot Division may not cross-enter, at the same competition, into classes which require the rider to

canter or ride over fences. Horse and rider must have competed in at least two Equestrian Canada Sanctioned competitions in this miscellaneous walk/trot 12 and under division for points to count.

38) Walk-Trot Equitation: The class will proceed at least once around the ring at each gait — walk and trot and on command, reverse and repeat. Riders will then line up on command. The judge may ask questions about tack or horsemanship that would be suitable to the ability and age of the riders in the class.

An individual test may be requested prior to the group class routine on the flat. This pattern may include a simple figure of eight pattern or a simple pattern provided by the judge and posted at least one hour prior to the class. Riders who do not perform the individual test will not be eliminated and may proceed to the class routine on the flat.

### 39) Walk-Trot English Pleasure

- a) To be shown at a flat-footed walk and normal trot
- b) To be judged on 45% performance, 40% manners and 15% conformation
