It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition. Statement of Principles

Equestrian Canada (EC), the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to the humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction.

EC is committed to:

- upholding the welfare of all horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities;
- requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and compassion, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment;
- ensuring that owners, trainers and competitors, or their agents use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their own horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose;
- providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure;
- continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- requiring owners, trainers and competitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competition; and
- reviewing, revising and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

The Standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive, nor inhumane.

GENERAL RULES

 Please send all entries to Chantal Richard – 307 route 617, Burtts Corner, NB E6L 2S3. Contact info: 506-260-7178 or <u>nbeazone3@gmail.com</u>. If sending entry electronically ONLY SCANNED COPIES of entry forms will be accepted, NO PICTURES of entry forms.

2. **COVID-19 restrictions:**

- a. No spectators will be allowed on premises. Social distancing rules will be strictly enforced. Please do not stand and talk in groups on the ground or on the horses.
- b. Each competitor can be accompanied by one person. This person must register on the entry form and provide contact information. Substitutions are at the discretion of the show committee, and full contact information will have to be provided for every person arriving on site.
- c. Each person (including accompanying person, volunteers, and competition staff) arriving on site will have to go through the main gate checkpoint where they will be screened for Covid-19 risk factors. The show committee reserves the right to refuse entry to anyone who exhibits symptoms or who answers yes to any of the risk assessment questions. The show committee reserves the right to ask anyone to leave the premises if they exhibit symptoms or do not respect social distancing. Hand sanitizing stations (including wash station) will be provided on site.
- d. Each person must exit through the main gate checkpoint and notify the attendant that they are leaving the show grounds.
- e. .All competitors <u>MUST</u> leave the grounds once their portion of the show has ended. A limited number of riders will be accepted for each class.
- f. The competition reserves the right to limit entries. The show committee reserves the right to cancel the show if insufficient entries are received or if Covid-19 restrictions in the province of New Brunswick return to Orange Phase.
- g. Competitors who have Covid-19 symptoms are not to attend the show and will be given a full refund. Their contact information will be shared with local health authorities for tracing purposes.
- 3. Show Office opens at 7:30 am. Show starts at 9 am. Arrive at 8 to be screened prior to entering premises. Post entries will not be accepted due to Covid-19 restrictions.
- 4. No fee for substitution of a horse (A603). No substitution of riders will be permitted.

5. Stabling is not available due to Covid-19 restrictions.

- 6. Show Committee Members are Nicole Beaulieu, Cindy Brown, Marie-Claude Michaud, Cyndi Mitchell, and Chantal Richard.
- 7. Other than as specified in Article A805.2, a competition may reserve the right to refuse an entry providing the reason for refusal is clearly stated in the prize list (see Article A805.4) The show committee has the right to refuse any entry that is not in good standing with NBEA, Equestrian Canada or competition venue.
- 8. This EC-sanctioned competition and all its competitors shall be governed by the current rules of EC. "Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book." General Regulations and Rule Book for General Performance classes may be read on EC website.
- 9. All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations."
- 10. Each horse/rider combination must submit separate entries. <u>All entries must be complete and signed</u> <u>before numbers will be issued.</u>

- 11. Entry fees are \$15.00 per class (English and Western),\$25.00 for the Cadence Classic, \$25.00 per Jumper Division and \$25.00 Hunter Divisions entered. **Payment must be received with all entries.**
- 12. All cheques are to be made payable to: Zone 3 Horse Show (no post-dated cheques). Email money transfers may be sent to nbeazone3@gmail.com (password: zoneshow)
- 13. Competitors are allowed to enter only <u>two</u> Jumper Divisions or Over Fences Hunter Divisions.

*Jump offs will immediately follow each division

Jumper classes are a timed event. Riders are permitted to walk the course. Eliminations - for falls off horse, rider or both in class; second refusal or exceeding the time limit. *Riders may jump one single obstacle after elimination providing it is part of the course and it is not due to a fall. (Section F page 65)

14. Heights or distances of the jumps will not be adjusted for ponies.

*Maximum height for ponies in Hunter classes is 2'6"

- 15. Hors concours is not permitted in Hunter classes. (F1411) Hors Concours entries may be accepted at the competition committee's discretion but are subject to the same scoring rules as a regular entry with respect to falls, elimination etc. Such entries are not judged and are not eligible for the jump off. A horse or pony that has competed Hors Concours is not allowed to compete subsequently in the same ring on the same day.
- 16. Prizes for all 1st place winners. Ribbons presented from 1st to 6th place. Due to Covid-19 restrictions, ribbons and prizes will not be given in the show ring. A table will be set up where sanitized prizes and ribbons can be collected by riders. Disposable gloves will be provided.
- 17. Judges decision is final.
- 18. Entries must be received by <u>July 6, 2020.</u> Late entries will not be accepted.
- 19. At this competition, all riders are required to wear protective helmets that are ASTM approved with a fixed harness while mounted anywhere on the show grounds. This rule applies to English and Western riders.
- 20. Any horse entered in any class at this competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location.
- 21. All entries must attach a copy of the following: <u>NO EXCEPTIONS</u>
 - a. **Proof of current year vaccinations & COGGINS within 1 year of the show date.** *mandatory vaccinations are tetanus, flu, rabies, rhino & strangles

- b. **2020 EC Bronze Sport License (or higher)** Bronze EC memberships may be purchased from EC at <u>www.equinecanada.ca</u> (*Lead line class is exempted from EC Sport License requirements.*)
- c. **2020 NBEA Membership -** All riders including those schooling horses on the competition grounds must also be NBEA members.
- 22. Cross Entries where permitted in the rules are permitted.
- 23. Protests must be made in writing and addressed to the secretary of the competition at which the matter under consideration occurs, must be signed and must be accompanied by a deposit of \$100 cash within 48 hours of the competition. See conditions for complaints and protest of rule book Section A General Regulations.
- 24. Stallions are not permitted
- 25. Ring numbers must be worn and visible at all times in the schooling and exercise areas as well as in the competition ring.
- 26. The show will forfeit 75% of the entry fee less the fees for classes completed if the horse entered is withdrawn due to unsoundness or illness provided a veterinarian's certificate is produced, dated not later than the closing day of the show and received within 10 days of the show date.
- 27. Any actions towards a horse deemed abusive or excessive by a judge, steward or show committee members by an exhibitor or anyone anywhere on show grounds may be given an official warning or may disqualified from the competition. Article A517
- 28. The Show Committee, its officials, volunteers or Les écuries de la Cadence Stables does not assume responsibility for accidents or illness to horses, riders, spectators or any other persons in attendance.
- 29. Classes with less than 3 entries may be combined or cancelled at the discretion of the show committee.
- 30. The show schedule may change due to the number of entries in each part of the show. A final schedule will be published on or before July 9th, 2020.
- 31. EC rule book is available on the Equine Canada website at: <u>www.equinecanada.ca</u>. Any questions regarding EC rules and regulations please contact our show Steward Dawn Brown at arali@nbnet.nb.ca. The competition will be conducted under the rules of EC General Performance Section F. Miscellaneous class descriptions are provided in the Prize List.
- 32. Lunging will not be permitted in warm-up area if there are riders warming up.
- 33. **NO SMOKING** anywhere on the competition grounds.
- 34. Dogs are not allowed on the show grounds.
- 35. Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of Equine Canada and will be held and judged in accordance with the Equine Canada Rule Book. Any incident requiring a ruling which cannot be referenced to the EC Rule Book, will be rendered by the Show Committee.

36. JUNIOR/YOUTH

a. Except as modified by discipline/breed sport rules, individuals are juniors until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18.

b. Junior "A". Riders/drivers are classified as Junior "A" from the beginning of the calendar year in which they turn 16 until the end of the calendar year in which they turn 18.

c. Junior "B". Riders/drivers are classified as Junior "B" from the beginning of the calendar year in which they turn 13 until the end of the calendar year in which they turn 15.

d. Junior "C". Riders/drivers are classified as Junior "C" such until the end of the calendar year in which they turn 12.

e. In Western classes, individuals are youths until the end of the calendar year in which they turn 19. See also discipline/breed sport rules.

General Performance Hunter Divisions (Articles F 1401 - 1410.and F 1701):

- 37. Hunter 18" Over fences: A simple hunter course of at least 8 fences with no combinations. Emphasis of judging on manners, obedience and style. Trotting to fences will not be penalized. Distances will not be adjusted for horses and ponies. Maximum height and width to be 18" (0.55m) Fences may be low verticals or oxers. Open to seniors riding horses or large ponies and juniors riding horses or ponies of any height.
 - 1. Hunter 18" #1
 - 2. Hunter 18" #2

3. Hunter 18" Under Saddle: To be shown at walk, trot canter, both ways of the ring. No more than eight to hand-gallop at one time

- 38. Hunter 2'3" Over fences: A simple hunter course of at least 8 fences with no combinations. Emphasis of judging on manners, obedience and style. Trotting to fences will not be penalized. Distances will not be adjusted for horses and ponies. Maximum height and width to be 2'3" (0.55m) Fences may be low verticals or oxers. Majority of fences to be 18" (0.7m) Open to seniors riding horses or large ponies and juniors riding horses or ponies of any height.

6. Hunter 2'3" Under Saddle

- 39. Entries in this division are limited to 2'3" and 2'6" Hunter Divisions.
- 40. **Hunter 2'6"** (To complete a hunter-type jumping course of at least 8 obstacles not to exceed 2'6" (0.75m) in height. To be judged on obedience, jumping form and general way of going. Open to seniors riding horses or large ponies and juniors riding horses or ponies. The course may, but not required to be adjusted in height and distance for ponies.

- 9. Hunter 2'6" Under Saddle
- 41. Entries in this division may only enter two of three divisions (Cadence Classic counts as a division).
- 42. **Hunter 2'9"- (**0.85m) Open only to **horses** ridden by a Junior or Senior Rider. Horses judged on obedience, jumping form and general way of going.

43. Cadence Classic (Miscellaneous – not rated for EC awards) Entry Fee 25\$

13. Shown at a canter over 8-12 fences for first round and a shortened course for those who qualify for round 2. May include combinations, broken lines and roll backs. Max height 2'6". Top 6 from round one to return in order of 6th position up to 1st with both rounds receiving scores. Top score from both rounds will be the winner. First prize is a cooler donated by Les écuries de la Cadence Stables.

Routine on the flat: Article F2105. 14. Jr. "A" Hunter (not to jump) 15. Jr. "B" Hunter Seat (not to jump) 16. Jr. "C" Hunter Seat (not to jump) 17. Senior Hunter Seat (not to jump)

18. Walk/Trot Equitation (Miscellaneous – not rated for EC awards)

The class will proceed at least once around the ring at each gait – walk and trot and on command, reverse and repeat. Riders will then line up on command. The judge may ask questions about tack or horsemanship that would be suitable to the ability and age of the riders in the class.

An individual test may be requested prior to the group class routine on the flat. This pattern may include a simple figure of eight pattern or similar simple pattern provided by the judge and posted at least one hour prior to the class. Riders who do not perform the individual test will not be eliminated and may proceed to the class routine on the flat.

If the rider is under 18 years of age, the parent or guardian must complete the areas requiring name, date and signature.

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

Person Responsible:

The Person Responsible (PR) for a horse must be an adult who has, or shares responsibility for the care, training, custody, and performance of the horse and who has official responsibility for that horse under EC Rules. The PR is liable under the penalty provisions of the applicable EC Rules for any rule violations. Every entry form for an EC sanctioned competition must identify the PR and be signed by the PR. The Person Responsible is ultimately responsible for the condition, fitness and management of the horse and is alone responsible for any act performed by himself/herself or by any other person with authorized access to the horse in the stables, elsewhere on the grounds, or while the horse is being ridden, driven or exercised.

A: For adult entries into EC sanctioned competitions the PR shall be either the trainer, the owner of the horse of the competitor who rides or drives the horse during the EC sanctioned competition.

B: For Junior entries into EC sanctioned competitions the Junior competitor cannot be the PR. For Junior entries the PR may be either the trainer, the owner of the horse, or a parent/guardian of the Junior competitor.

Person Responsible (PR) must sign the competition entry form. PR must be an EC Sport License holder in good standing OR in the case of junior – minor owner, a parent/guardian is entitled to sign as PR.

Parents and Guardians are entitled to sign their children's entry forms without being EC members or holder of a Sport License, provided they agree to abide by the rules and penalties contained in the Rule Book. However, the owner of the horse must hold a valid EC Sport License and the owner's EC Sport License number must be included on all entry forms.

NOTE: Person Responsible who are prevented from performing their duties by reason of illness or other cause, or who must be absent from any competition where horses under their care are entered and stabled shall immediately notify the competition secretary and at the same time, appoint a substitute. Such substitute Person Responsible shall place his or her name on the entry form forthwith and thereby shall assume full responsibility for the performance of the duties. The Person Responsible and the owner acknowledge that the Person Responsible represents the owner with respect to the horses entered in the competition in matters relating to entries, scratches for any reason, equine medication control and any act performed on any horse under the care and custody of the Person Responsible. For complete reference see Article A 1011. 1 c) and 2.

I hereby certify that every horse, rider, and/or driver is eligible as entered and agree for myself, and my representatives to be bound by the Constitution and Rules of Equestrian Canada at this competition. It is hereby recognized that all equestrian sports involve inherent risk and that no helmet or protective equipment can protect against all foreseeable injury. I hereby accept the risk and hold harmless Les écuries de la Cadence Stables, EC, NBEA, the competition, their officials, organizers, agents, volunteers, employees and their representatives. The person responsible (PR) agrees to the release of any information on the entry form to EC.
