## **Biosecurity Protocol for LTED & Clinic Participants**

### **Before attending the event:**

- Ensure neither you nor any member of your household is exhibiting any Covid-19 symptoms. Anyone who has a fever, Covid 19 symptoms, has tested positive for Covid 19, or has been in contact with someone who has tested positive for Covid 19 cannot participate.
- Read and be sure you understand any materials shared with you by the venue owner and event organizer.
- Complete any self-declaration documentations or online screening tools required.
- Sign and submit all waivers & release documents provided.
- Pack your own sanitizing hand wipes, disinfectant, food and beverages, as well as any equipment you and your horse might need.
- Register and pay using electronic means. Do not bring cash or cheque to the venue.
- Check and stick to your posted arrival and ride times. Plan to depart shortly after your horse is cooled out and ready to travel.
- If you are bringing a helper, ensure s/he has complied with all of the above as well. No other friends/family/spectators should attend.
- Leave your dog at home.



## At the venue:



- Read and observe all signs and posters at entrances and throughout the competition venue displaying best practices and guidelines.
- Strictly observe a two-metre physical distance protocol. Physical Distancing
- Use only your own equipment. There is to be no sharing of supplies, horse clothing, towels, equipment or tack (including lead shanks etc.) Towels and equipment are not to be draped over fences or any other common area.
- Do not touch other horses or pets.
- Wash/sanitize your hands often.
- Keep your movement and contact within the stable to a minimum. Disinfect any contacted surfaces before departure.
- Observe good cough/sneeze etiquette (into your elbow)
- Park trailer so there is at least 5m between each one.
- Be respectful and helpful to anyone who has been assigned to check that the venue's biosecurity plan is being followed.

Remember that you are participating at your own risk, you are liable, and must take personal responsibility for the safety of others and yourself. Comply with all best practices and guidelines in effect at the event.
