

Jumper Qualifying Criteria

For Atlantic Canada Equestrian Championship

October 7 & 8, 2017 – Prince Louise Park, Sussex, NB

Team Composition

• Team of 4 riders for the 1.0m and a different team of 4 riders for the 1.10m, can send a team of 3 just no drop score.

Eligibility

- Team is open to junior and senior riders
- Riders must declare their intention by submitting the declaration form and \$25 declaration fee prior to the first competition in which scores will be counted.
- Stallions will be permitted but must be ridden by adults
- Horse and rider must have competed in a min of 3 classes of their respected division they are trying out for
- Substitution of a horse and rider combination may be considered in the case of lameness however both horse and rider must have competed at the level in the 2017 show season, and approval is at the discretion of the selection committee.
- A rider is eligible for both teams if they have two different horses they are competing on.
- Riders must a current member of NBEA and NB resident.

Team Qualification

- New Brunswick competitions must be EC bronze or gold sanctioned.
- Outside of NB, competitions must be EC gold sanctioned.
- Competition performance scores will be converted to a point system that will be sued to determine overall standings and team selection.
- Scores will count from 4 competitions in NB and other sanctioned jumper shows in PEI and NS. Rider will be asked to put their 5 best competitions scores (class scores) forward.
- NB horse shows that can be used for qualifying: GHS May 27-28 and June 17-18 Foshay July 1 and August 12, Zone 3 General Performance Show July 29 and Carmaz Stables Show August 20
- Scores will be used from 1.0m and 1.10m classes. Both horse and rider may have jumped in higher divisions.
- Deadline to submit scores for qualifying classes is August 30th.

Team Selection

- Team selection will be completed shortly after deadline of August 30th and riders will be notified.
- Expenses may be subsidized to some extent by the NBEA, but riders must be prepared for the possibility of covering a significant portion of their personal costs and their horses' expenses.
