All Disciplines

- Minimum of one score must come from an eligible competition in New Brunswick.
- An Athlete may receive scores on multiple horses.
- An athlete must declare the horse with which he/she will compete at the CIEC by August 17th using the Horse

Declaration Form

- An athlete and horse will/did **not** compete at the NAJYRC in 2015.
- Stallions may be shown by Senior Athletes only.
- An athlete must declare before entering his/her first qualifying competition.
- An athlete must submit scores after each competition using the Score Submission Form.
- The final date for qualifying competitions is Sunday, August 30th.
- Final date to submit scores is Tuesday, September 1st.
- An athlete who is selected to compete at the CIEC may declare a horse that was not ridden during any of the CIEC Qualifying Classes and has met all discipline specific eligibility criteria

Reining Specific Qualifying Criteria

- New Brunscwick sanctioned competitions must be NRHA competitions
- Outside of NB, sanctioned competitions must be NRHA competitions and must meet all eligibility criteria as described throughout.
- All one-handed classes using NRHA patterns 1-11 from a sanctioned competition will be CIEC Qualifying classes.
- All CIEC Qualifying Classes must be judged by an NRHA judge.
- Three minimum scores of 65 must be submitted to NBEA using the Score Submission form. Those scores will be averaged to determine Team Members.
- A Senior athlete whose name appears on the NRHA 2015 Ineligibility Lists as a Limited Non-Pro or Rookie Pro is **not** eligible to compete at the CIEC.
- An athlete who is selected to compete at the CIEC may declare a horse that was not ridden during any of
 the CIEC Qualifying Classes. That horse must have had a minimum score of 68 in any one-handed
 class (using NRHA patterns 1-11) judged by an NRHA judge in the past two years (2014 or 2015).

Reining Team Selection Process

The top two junior athletes and top two senior athletes with the highest average from the top 3 scores will be selected for the team.

In the event of a tie, the three scores of the tied athletes will be compared. The athlete who achieved the single highest score will be named to Team NB. In the event that there is still a tie, the athlete with the next highest score will be named to Team NB. This process will continue until the tie is broken
