



Phase 1 - Provincial/Territorial (PT) Level Competition Manager Information

Prize List Information: The J.C. Anderson Legacy Medal is a skills-based jumper medal series with the intent to identify athletes who have the potential to become Canada's next high performance athletes.

Eligibility: The class will be open to current Provincial/Territorial Sport Organization (PTSO) and Equestrian Canada (EC) member athletes age 25 and under as of December 31 of each year. Athletes shall declare their intent to compete in the J.C. Anderson Legacy Medal class to their respective PTSO by their first qualifying competition. A \$25.00 fee per horse/athlete combination must accompany the declaration. PTSO's will manage respective athlete declarations. Athletes competing must be members of a Canadian Provincial Sport Organization including USEF Athletes.

Class Conditions: This class is designed as a jumper type equitation class, held in the main jumper ring over a jumper course at 1.20m – 1.25m with spreads from 1.20m to 1.30m. The class will be run as a Table A with two Rounds, the 2nd Round being a jump-off style round. There will be a time allowed and time faults will be reflected in the judge's overall score as minus one point (1) for every second over. Each rail will incur 4 points subtracted from the overall score. A second refusal will eliminate. Based on results from 1st Round, The top 10 athletes will return for the 2nd Round.

Course: The Course may include Natural fences, and/or a Liverpool. No work off is required but remains at the judge's discretion. Start and finish markers must be provided and an audible tone will be used. The Course Designer is encouraged to set an efficient time allowed in the 2nd round.

Horse & Equipment: Stallions are allowed per EC jumper division rules. A jumper type horse with jumper equipment is allowed and will not be penalized. Same tack must be used if a work off is required.

Judging: The class will be judged under the current rules and standards of the EC: this class is judged on the athlete's equitation style, technical merit, and judgment. In the 2nd round of the competition (the jump off), judging will be based on all of the above plus the execution of an efficient, time saving pace and track while minimizing knockdowns. One (1) point will be subtracted from the athlete's overall score for each second taken over the time allowed and four (4) points will be subtracted for each knockdown on course in both rounds. Judges are asked to walk the course when possible and where there are striding options the judges are asked not to penalize any option that might be used to achieve the best result appropriate to the individual horse/rider combination. The open numerical scoring system will be used, with a score announced after each round. Top 8 winners will be placed using combined scores from the 1st and 2nd Rounds for an overall placing.
