The NBEA Bronze Championship is a sanctioned Bronze competition member of Equestrian Canada (EC), 11 Hines Rd. Suite 201 Ottawa, Ontario K2K 2X1 and is governed by the rules of EC. Every class offered herein is covered by the current rules and specifications of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book.

Equestrian Canada Statement of Principle

Equestrian Canada (EC), the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction.

EC is committed to:

- upholding the welfare of the horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities;
- requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment;
- ensuring that owners, trainers and exhibitors or their agents use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose:
- providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure;

continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;

requiring owners, trainers and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competition;

reviewing, revising and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horses.

The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive nor inhumane.

Every entry at an EC sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible (**see definition in entry form section**) that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC Constitution and the applicable rules of EC and additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in the EC sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition. A801.

SHOW RULES

Administration:

1. All entry forms due no later than five (5) days prior to the show as entries may need to be limited in some classes for safety and management purposes.

No entries accepted after October 54th

Entries:

Payments:

Make all cheques payable to "New Brunswick Equestrian Association" and must accompany signed entry form(s).

No post-dated cheques accepted. NSF cheques will be charged \$50 administration fee.

No entries will be accepted by telephone or fax.

All entries must be complete and made in writing (Article A801.4). The show numbers will not be issued if all the required signatures are not complete and payment is not made in full.

Hunter and Jumper Classes are entered by division only.

NO Post entries will be accepted.

Scratches will not be reimbursed.

Official protests must be made in writing to the secretary of the competition, signed and accompanied by a \$100.00 cash deposit within 48 hours of competition of the class, Equestrian Canada Article A1204.

Ribbons – 1st to 6th place, Trophies for 1st, High Point Prizes.

Equestrian Canada Rule A814: Competition numbers must be worn and visible at all times in show ring and in exercise areas.

Show Committee reserves the right to measure any pony or horse entered in the show.

Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of Equestrian Canada and will be held and judged in accordance with the Equestrian Canada Rule Book. Any incident requiring a ruling which cannot be referenced to the EC Rule Book, will be rendered by the Show Committee.

If less than four entries are received for any class, the show committee reserves the right to cancel or combine classes where the rules are applicable.

Entry forms must be signed by exhibitor, owner and person responsible. If the owner or exhibitor is under 19 years of age, the entry must be signed by a parent or legal guardian who assumes all responsibility and risk as stated on the form and by these rules and regulations. The entry form for all sanctioned competitions shall also be signed by the person responsible for the care, training, custody and performance of the horse. The person responsible may be the trainer, owner, rider, agent or coach. The parent or guardian must sign the entry form if there is no other person responsible. The person responsible is to be present at the competition and if they cannot attend, must appoint a representative who is present on the show grounds and must notify the competition secretary.

Article A1011. With the exception of a parent or (Glossary page 90, Section A, see A213.2), the person responsible who signs an entry form must hold an EC or USEF individual license. (See A203.4).

Management has the right to expel any rider, owner or spectator deemed to be in their sole discretion disruptive to the show at any time.

Dogs must be leashed or caged while on the show grounds. The Owners are solely and expressly responsible for their dogs and the dog's behavior. Owners of loose dogs will be charged \$75.00 to retrieve their pets.

Absolutely "NO" smoking permitted on show grounds.

The show office will open one (1) hour prior to the start of the show and close 1/2 hour at the end of the show.

Horse can start arriving at 8:00a.m. and with regards to parking please watch for signage.

Bronze Sport licenses are required for all classes and can be purchased at www.equestrian.ca

Warm up area will be available on the show grounds. Warm up area is an enclosed sand ring. No lunging when riders are in the warm up ring.

Entry Fees: ARE FREE if you have competed at one of the shows listed on the front page. YOU only have to pay the administration fee and the drug fee. If you have NOT shown at any of the listed shows you are welcome to enter and will be charged the fees below.

The following entry fees apply to all competitors:

The class/division fees will be waived if the competitor has competed in a NBEA sanctioned Bronze competition during the 2021 show year.

Exhibitor Requirements:

- Equestrian Canada Bronze Sport License and NBEA membership are required to compete in Bronze classes. Equestrian Canada Bronze License is NOT required for exhibitors competing only in Lead Line.
- Bronze memberships may be purchased online at www.equestrian.ca Your receipt will be proof of memberships. Temporary one-day memberships are no longer available.
- Any horse, in any class at a competition, may, while on the competition grounds, be selected for equine medication control testing. (Article A602.5) Equine medication control testing fee is \$4.00.
- Coggins test must be sent in with your entry forms. Coggins tests with a stamped date within 2021 will be accepted.
- Horses must show proof of current vaccinations for rabies, tetanus, flu and Strangles. All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations."
- Amateur Owners must have current credentials (Article A902). A photocopy of the current amateur card must be attached with entry A802.5 e).
- As per Equestrian Canada rule article A805, the Show Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry, except as provided in 805.2 (a,b,c,d,e).
- The show will forfeit 75% of the entry fee less the fees for classes completed if the horse entered is withdrawn due to unsoundness or sickness provided a veterinarian's certificate is produced, dated no later than the closing day of the show and received within 10 days of the show date.
- All riders, grooms, attendants and handlers must be neatly dressed on entering the ring.

SAFETY RULES:

1. Protective Headgear

- <u>All competitors</u> must wear ASTM (American Society for Testing Materials), SEI, EN, AS/NZS or BSI approved helmets, with safety harness correctly fastened, at all times while mounted on the competition grounds.
- Juniors showing any horse in a jog for soundness must wear approved protective headwear with the attached safety harness fastened.
- EC makes no representation or warranty expressed or implied about any protective headgear and cautions riders that serious injury or death may result despite wearing such headgear as all equestrian sports involve inherent dangerous risk and adds no protective helmet can protect against all foreseeable injuries.
- All violations which occur outside the competition arena will be reported to the judge/jury who will levy the applicable penalty.
- All violations which occur in the competition arena will be acted upon by the judge(s) who will levy the applicable penalty.
- For all competitors, if the harness comes undone or the hat falls off, the rider must retrieve and/or do up the hat, with assistance if necessary, before the next obstacle is taken. There will be no penalty other than the loss of time. Failure to do up the harness or retrieve protective headgear immediately results in elimination.
- The show committee does not accept responsibility for accidents or illness to horses, riders, grooms, spectators or any other persons.
- Exhibitors competing for provincial points are requested to enter the animal in the name of the

member of the family who is the official Equine Canada member.

- **FALLS:** 1. After being eliminated for a fall, the rider may not remount in the ring. Any rider who does remount in the ring after a fall will be eliminated from all classes in that ring for the remainder of the day. A rider who remounts after a fall and takes another obstacle will be disqualified from the remainder of the competition.
 - 2. In the case of a fall of a horse or pony, Article A517.4 will apply. The officiating steward, judge, technical delegate, president of the ground jury or appointed competition veterinarian has the authority to remove a horse from the event for a period of up to 24 hours, if in their reasonable opinion the horse is unfit to compete, or where, in their reasonable opinion, there is a safety concern regarding the horse. The official's decision is final and cannot be appealed.
 - 3. In the case of a fall of an Athlete anywhere within the grounds of the event during the hours of competition operation, the Athlete must be cleared by the Competition's medical service, before the Athlete may continue to compete in the next round or Competition. The competitor is solely responsible for ensuring the onsite medical assessment takes place. This rule is applicable to all competitors (including foreign) at EC sanctioned events and applies to falls/accidents that occur at the event location.
- **IN-GATE:** In all classes, trotting or cantering through the in-gate without prior permission is forbidden. The penalty for contravening this rule is either a fine or elimination from the class, at the discretion of the judge. Under special circumstances, a steward or judge may give permission for a horse to trot into the ring, but not out of the ring.

STALLIONS: Stallions are permitted at this competition but only if shown by Senior competitors **HORS CONCOURS**: "Hors Concours" is not allowed at this competition

The use of Cell phones, IPODS, etc. is not allowed while riding.

Any horse that becomes out of control shall be eliminated from the competition at the discretion of the judge.

Schooling Rules for Hunter/Jumper: see Annex 1 page 104 Section G rule book.

Rules for this competition may be downloaded for free on Equestrian Canada's Website or ordered from the NBEA office. Read: Section G for Hunter, Jumper, Equitation, Hack and refer to Section A for Equestrian Canada's General Regulations

Bronze competitors require NBEA membership and EC Bronze membership or higher. NBEA Membership may be purchased at nbea.ca. Bronze Membership may be purchased from Equestrian Canada (www.equestrian.ca). Printed receipt will be accepted for proof of Equestrian Canada membership.

Substitutions: a substituted horse must have competed in a Bronze show in 2021.



HUNTER DIVISION

(Miscellaneous Hunter Divisions not rated for EC Awards) G201-G407

Note: Horses Entering Bronze Hunter Divisions may only enter 2 of 3 divisions (i.e., Intro and Pre-Beginner Hunter OR Pre-Beginner and Beginner or Beginner and Heritage Low Hunter)

INTRO HUNTER

Entry Fee: \$60 for division (2 over fences and 1 under saddle)

Prize: Ribbons (1st – 6th), trophy (1st)

Class #1 Intro Hunter #1 – (Over fences: A simple hunter course of at least 8 fences with no combinations. Emphasis of judging on manners, obedience and style. Trotting to fences will not be penalized. Distances not to be adjusted for horses and ponies. Maximum height and width to be 22" (0.55m). Fences may be low verticals or oxers. Majority of fence to be 18" (0.45m). Open to seniors riding horses or large ponies and juniors riding horses or ponies of any height.

Class #2 Intro Hunter #2

Class #3 Intro Hunter Under Saddle – To be shown at walk, trot and canter, both ways of the ring. No more than eight to hand-gallop at one time. (To be eligible for awards horses/ponies must have completed the course in at least one fences class in their respective division.)

Pre-BEGINNER HUNTER

Entry Fee: \$60 for division (2 over fences and 1 under saddle)

Prize: Ribbons $(1^{st} - 6^{th})$, trophy (1^{st})

Class #5 Pre- Beginner Hunter #1 – (To complete a hunter-type jumping course of at least 8 obstacles not to exceed 2'3" (0.70m) in height. To be judged on obedience, jumping form and general way of going. Open to seniors riding horses or large ponies and juniors riding horses or ponies. The course may, but is not required, to be adjusted in height and distance for ponies.) Juniors of any age may show any height of pony in miscellaneous, non-point classes.

Class #6 Pre- Beginner Hunter #2

Entry Fee: \$60 for division (2 over fences and 1 under saddle)

Class #9 Beginner Hunter #1 – (To complete a hunter-type jumping course of at least 8 obstacles not to exceed 2'6" (0.75m) in height. To be judged on obedience, jumping form and general way of going. Open to seniors riding horses or large ponies and juniors riding horses or ponies. The course may, but is not required, to be adjusted in height and distance for ponies.) Juniors of any age may show any height of pony in miscellaneous, non-point classes.

• Equitation classes are divided by age groups as follows: Individuals are juniors until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18. Article A901.

Routine on the flat: Article G1007. Riders will proceed at least once around the ring at each gait – walk, trot and canter, reverse and repeat. At the judge's discretion, they may be asked to execute an individual test.

Class #35 Jr. "A" Hunter Seat (not to jump) Equestrian Canada

Riders are such from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16 until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18.

Class #36 Jr. "B" Hunter Seat (not to jump) Equestrian Canada

Riders are such from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 13 until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 15.

Class #37 Jr. "C" Hunter Seat (not to jump) Equestrian Canada

Riders are such until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 12.

Class #38 Adult Amateur Hunter Seat (not to jump) Equestrian Canada

Members will be classified as Senior from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 19.

ENGLISH HACK DIVISION

Entry Fee: \$20 per class

Prize: Ribbons (1st - 6th), trophy (1st)

• To be shown at a flat-footed walk, normal trot and easy canter; not to gallop; light contact to be maintained. b) To be judged on 45% performance, 40% manners and 15% conformation.

To be shown at a flat-footed walk with a reasonably loose rein, trot, strong trot, easy canter and hand gallop. Only 8 horses to hand gallop at one time.

TIES

Intro/Beginner/Low Hunter Divisions

In the case of a tie the championship and/or reserve shall be awarded to the horse that has accumulated the most points over fences. If there is still a tie, the tied horses shall be shown at walk, trot and canter to determine champion and reserve. Tossing a coin to break the tie is permissible if all participants agree. In the event that all tied horses are declared unsound, selection of the winner amongst such tied horses shall be left to the discretion of the judge(s).

Jumper Divisions

G506.3. In the case of a tie for the Champion/Reserve, the highest placing in the largest prize money class of the division will be used. If all classes have same prize money, the last class of the division will be used.

Miscellaneous Divisions

Ties for the High Point Championship will be awarded based on placing in the English Pleasure.

For the purpose of these Rules, the Person Responsible is normally the trainer, owner or the competitor who rides or drives the horse during an event, or a parent or legal guardian in the case of junior competitors. The Person Responsible is ultimately responsible for the condition, fitness and management of horse and is alone responsible for an act performed in the stables by himself or herself or by any other person with authorized access to the horse, or while the horse is being ridden, driven or exercised. The Person Responsible must hold a valid EC Sport License in good standing at the same level or higher in which the horse is competing. However, when the competitor is a Junior, the competitor cannot be the person responsible and the Person Responsible may be a parent/guardian.

The person responsible is to be present at the competition and if they cannot attend must appoint a representative and notify the competition secretary.
