Per Article A 801

Every entry at an EC sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition. (ARTICLE A602.7)

Statement of Principles

Statement of Principles – Horse Welfare

- EC supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction.

EC is committed to:

- upholding the welfare of the horse, regardless of monetary value, as a primary consideration in all activities;
- requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect, and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment;
- ensuring that owners, trainers, and exhibitors and their agents exercise appropriate care and responsibility in the handling, treatment, and transportation of their horses, as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose;
- providing for the continuous well being of the horse by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, and safety;
- continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- requiring owners, trainers, and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions; and,
- reviewing, revising, and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

In determining whether conduct or treatment is cruel, abusive or inhumane, the standard to be applied will be the conduct or treatment expected of a reasonable person who is informed and experienced in equine training and exhibition procedures.

Individuals who interact with horses must also adhere to EC's policies as they relate to horse welfare.

General Rules

Entries:

1. Send entries to: Deanna Phelan 570 Broad Rd. Geary NB E2V 3W3 or drop off at NBEA office by September 12, 2022
2. Late entries will not be accepted.
3. Each horse/rider combination must submit separate entries.
4. All entries must be complete and signed before numbers will be issued.
5. Payment must be received with all entries. All cheques are to be made payable to: Capital Region Equestrian Association. No post dated cheques. All entries to be mailed to 570 Broad Rd Geary, NB E2V 3W3 or dropped off at the NBEA office or Geary Hill Stable Questions please call 506-461-1649)
6. Competitors are allowed to enter only **two** Jumper Divisions or Hunter Divisions.

Show Office and Committee:

7. Opens 1hr prior to show and will remain open 30min after the last class.

Prizes:

8. Ribbons presented from 1st to 6th place.
9. No fee for substitution of a horse (A603). No substitution of riders will be permitted.
10. Other than as specified in Article A805.2, a competition may reserve the right to refuse an entry providing the reason for refusal is clearly stated in the prize list (see Article A805.4). The show committee has the right to refuse any entry that is not in good standing with NBEA, Equestrian Canada or the competition venue.
11. Vaccines: All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations.
12. Falls: After being eliminated for a fall, the rider may not remount in the ring. Any rider who does remount in the ring after a fall will be eliminated from all classes in that ring for the remainder of the day. A rider who remounts after a fall and takes another obstacle will be disqualified from the remainder of the competition.
In the case of a fall of an athlete anywhere within the grounds of the event during the hours of competition operation, the athlete must be checked by the Competition's medical service, before the athlete may continue to compete in the next round or competition.
This rule is applicable to all competitors (including foreign) at EC sanctioned events and applies to falls/accidents that occur at the event location.
13. Hors Concours: is not permitted in Hunter classes (G401.7) Hors Concours entries may be accepted at the competition committee's discretion but are subject to the same scoring rules as a regular entry with respect to falls, elimination, etc. Such entries are not judged and are not eligible for the jump off. A horse or pony that has competed Hors Concours is not allowed to compete subsequently in the same ring on the same day.
14. Helmets: All riders are required to wear protective helmets that are ASTM approved with a fixed harness while mounted anywhere on the show grounds . At all EC -sanctioned competitions, anyone mounted on a horse on the competition grounds, including foreign competitors, must wear approved headgear (see Glossary in General Regulations, Book A), with safety harness correctly fastened at all times.
15. Drug Test: Any horse entered in any class at this competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location.
16. Protests: must be made in writing and addressed to the secretary of the competition at which the

matter under consideration occurs, must be signed and must be accompanied by a deposit of \$100 cash within 48 hours of the competition. See conditions for complaints and protest of rule book Section A General Regulations.

17. **Abuse:** The abuse or inhumane treatment of a horse by an individual sport license holder or other person at an EC-sanctioned competition shall not be tolerated under any circumstances. 2. The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which, a person informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and competition procedures, would determine to be cruel, abusive or inhumane. Any treatment or practice that causes undue stress, and/or pain, is deemed abusive.

19. **Rule books:** EC rule book is available on the Equestrian Canada website Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book. (A602.2).
20. Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of Equestrian Canada and will be held and judged in accordance with the Equestrian Canada Rule Book. Any incident requiring a ruling which cannot be referenced to the EC Rule Book, will be rendered by the Show Committee.
21. Competitors, owners and persons responsible - Equestrian Canada Bronze Sport License and NBEA membership are required to compete in Bronze classes. Riders from the USA must have the equivalent USEF membership or otherwise purchase a temporary Sport License. Equestrian Canada Bronze License is NOT required for exhibitors competing only in Lead Line. An EC Sport License is required for competitors, owners or lessees and individuals accepting legal responsibility for an entry in EC sanctioned competitions. A203 Bronze memberships may be purchased online at www.equestriancanada.ca . Your receipt will be proof of memberships. Temporary one-day memberships are no longer available . Lead line riders: are exempted from EC Sport License requirements. These children may not cross-enter any other class or division at the same competition. The horses are not restricted. The owners of horses competing only in these divisions are not required to have EC Sport Licenses, and horses competing only in these divisions are not required to have and EC Horse Recording.
22.

Parents and Guardians: A parent or guardian must sign the entry form of a minor child/Junior competitor (under 18 years of age). Parents/guardians are not required to have an EC Sport License provided they agree to abide by the rules and penalties contained in the Rule Book and acknowledge that they are liable under the penalty provisions of the Rules for any violations of the EC Rules by their minor child.
23. When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self coached. Coaches from other countries, must be in good-standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments.

Misc. Rules:

- 24. Withdrawals:** The show will forfeit 75% of the entry fee less the fees for classes completed if the horse entered is withdrawn due to unsoundness or illness provided a veterinarian's certificate is produced, dated not later than the closing day of the show and received within 10 days of the show date.
- 25. Cross Entries:** where permitted in the rules are allowed.
- 26.** Ring numbers must be worn and visible at all times.
- 27.** Lunging will not be permitted in the warm up if there are riders in the arena.
- 28.** NO SMOKING on the property.
- 29.** Dogs are NOT allowed on the show grounds.
- 30.** The Show Committee, its officials, volunteers and Geary Hill Stables does not assume responsibility for accidents or illness to horses, riders, spectators or any other persons in attendance.
- 31.** Classes with less than 3 entries may be combined or canceled at the discretion of the show committee.
- 32. Age Categories:**
 - a. Except as modified by discipline/breed sport rules, individuals are juniors until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18.
 - b. Junior A: Riders/drivers are classified as Junior A from the beginning of the calendar year in which they turn 16 until the end of the calendar year in which they turn 18.
 - c. Junior B: Riders/drivers are classified as Junior B from the beginning of the calendar year in which they turn 13 until the end of the calendar year in which they turn 15.
 - d. Junior C: Riders/drivers are classified as Junior C until the end of the calendar year in which they turn 12.

JUMPER DIVISION

Miscellaneous, not rated for EC awards

See Equestrian Canada jumper rules. Junior, amateur or non-pro riders may not compete in draw reins or German martingales.

G502. A horse/rider combination is permitted unlimited upward movement through divisions, but downward movement is restricted to only one level. These movements are based on the level of the first class in which they competed. G603, 604 and 605

Distances will not be adjusted for horses and ponies. Max height and width to be 2' (0.60m). Fences may be low verticals . Open to seniors riding horses or large ponies and juniors riding horses or ponies of any height.

Over fences: A simple hunter course of at least 8 fences with no combinations. Emphasis of judging on manner, obedience and style. Trotting to fences will not be penalized. Distances will not be adjusted for horses and ponies. Max height and width to be 2'3" (0.70m). Fences may be low verticals and oxers. Majority of fences to be 18" (0.70m). Open to seniors riding horses or large ponies and juniors riding horses or ponies of any height.

The class will proceed at least once around the ring at each gait – walk and trot and on command, reverse and repeat. Riders will line up on command. The judge may ask questions about tack or horsemanship that would be suitable to the ability and age of the riders in the class.

An individual test may be requested prior to the group class routine on the flat. This pattern may include a simple figure of eight pattern or similar simple pattern provided by the judge and posted at least one hour prior to the class. Rider who do not perform the individual test will not be eliminated and may proceed to the class routine on the flat. Riders entering this division are not allowed to enter any other classes in the show.

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

Person Responsible:

The Person Responsible (PR) for a horse must be an adult who has, or shares responsibility for the care, training, custody, and performance of the horse and who has official responsibility for that horse under EC Rules. The PR is liable under the penalty provisions of the applicable EC Rules for any rule violations. Every entry form for an EC sanctioned competition must identify the PR and be signed by the PR. The Person Responsible is ultimately responsible for the condition, fitness and management of the horse and is alone responsible for any act performed by himself/herself or by any other person with authorized access to the horse in the stables, elsewhere on the grounds, or while the horse is being ridden, driven or exercised.

A: For adult entries into EC sanctioned competitions the PR shall be either the trainer, the owner of the horse or the competitor who rides or drives the horse during the EC sanctioned competition.

B: For Junior entries into EC sanctioned competitions the Junior competitor cannot be the PR. For Junior entries the PR may be either the trainer, the owner of the horse, or a parent/guardian of the Junior competitor.

Person Responsible (PR) must sign the competition entry form. PR must be an EC Sport License holder in good standing OOR in the case of a junior – minor owner, a parent/guardian is entitled to sign as PR.

Parents and Guardians are entitled to sign their children's entry forms without being EC members or holder of a Sport License, provided they agree to abide by the rules and penalties contained in the Rule Book. However, the owner of the horse must hold a valid EC Sport License and the owner's EC Sport License number must be included on all entry forms.

NOTE: Person Responsible who are prevented from performing their duties by reason of illness or other cause, or who must be absent from any competition where horses under their care are entered and stabled shall immediately notify the competition secretary and at the same time, appoint a substitute.
