# General Information on Competition in New Brunswick

A list of all sanctioned competitions in New Brunswick can be found on the <u>NB Sanctioned</u> <u>Shows</u> web page.

Prize lists and entry forms are uploaded there as soon as they are approved. Listings are also found on the NBEA <u>Calendar</u>.



# What is sanctioning?

A sanctioned competition has been approved by a governing body and will adhere to its rules and safety requirements. EC and NBEA sanctioning ensures the competition meets standards, carries liability insurance, and uses officials that have acquired national training.



# Why should I attend sanctioned competitions?

- These competitions all run under the same *Equestrian Canada* rules (see the links below)
- Points can be earned throughout the season toward year-end awards
- Officials are certified
- Safety and first aid personnel are on site
- Biosecurity measures are observed, and fair play is governed through equine medications control testing.

# Why should I sanction my show?

- Access to templates for entry forms and prize lists
- Printed rule books
- Two governing bodies to assist you
- Access to funding
- Provincial and national points tabulation
- Certified officials
- National and provincial website listings
- Lower insurance rates

## Memberships required

A competitor requires an annual NBEA membership to compete in all sanctioned show. In addition, an *Equestrian Canada* Sport License is that matches the category of shows is required - Bronze or Gold. Some disciplines, such as dressage, may require membership to their provincial body as well.

Horses in Gold competitions also need an EC horse recording number.

### Vaccinations Required

ARTICLE A519 VACCINATIONS All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have been administered **Equine Influenza** and **Equine Herpes Virus** (1&4) vaccinations within 6 months (+21 days grace period) before arrival at the event. No horse shall receive vaccination within 7 days prior to arrival at the event. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be asked to leave event site at the discretion of Competition Management.

Most competitions in New Brunswick will also ask for strangles vaccination and a negative Coggins test as well. Competitions are free to ask for more, if they choose. Read prize lists carefully, and discuss your vaccination program with your veterinarian.

### Year-End Awards

Horses and riders, or drivers, that have competed and placed in the top six spots at a minimum of two EC-sanctioned competitions offering eligible classes will have their points count toward year end awards in Bronze (provincial) and Gold (national) categories.

How are points earned and calculated for year-end awards?

Points for placing in the class are multiplied by the number of horses competing in that class, and added all season. Points are earned by the rider for equitation classes, and by the horse for all other classes.

```
1<sup>st</sup> place - - - - 6 pts
2<sup>nd</sup> place - - - 5 pts
3<sup>rd</sup> place - - - - 4 pts
4<sup>th</sup> place - - - - 3 pts
5<sup>th</sup> place - - - - 2 pts
6<sup>th</sup> place - - - - 1 pt
```

#### EXAMPLE:

Points awarded for a class of 10 horses:  $1^{st}$  place (6 x 10) 60pts  $2^{nd}$  place (5 x 10) 50 pts  $3^{rd}$  place (4 x 10) 40 pts

#### HOW TO:

Step 1. Submit your program registration form.

Step 2. Enter your sanctioned competition & send a copy to the NBEA. Submit no fees.

Step 3. Compete and have fun!

Step 4. The NBEA will confirm with the competition secretary that you competed, and will send a cheque for the full cost of your entry directly to the show organizers.

#### IMPORTANT

- · Riders will be funded on a first registered/first competed basis.
- Riders must be NBEA members
- Riders must have no record of having competed in any sanctioned competition before.
- All fees payable with the competition entry will be covered class or division fees, drug & admin fees, levies, and stabling. (Coaching will not be covered).
- Only the sanctioned competitions listed on the registration document are eligible for funded entries. Thank you to those organizers for working with the NBEA to make this program possible! Non-sanctioned competitions of any kind are not eligible.
- Cancellation fees charged by competitions for entered riders withdrawing from the show will not be covered by the NBEA.

The **NBEA Championships** (October 8th and 9th at the PLP) already offers free entries to anyone who has competed at <u>one</u> sanctioned show during the year. This program will qualify 15 riders to attend!

Attending any two sanctioned competitions qualifies riders to earn year-end awards and prizes!
