






Funding For Riders Who Are New to Sanctioned Competition

As part of this year's LTED program, the NBEA will be funding up to **fifteen new riders** to attend their first sanctioned shows in 2022.

-  5 hunter/jumper competitors
-  5 dressage competitors
-  5 eventing competitors

HOW TO:

Step 1. Submit your program registration form.

Step 2. Enter your sanctioned competition & send a copy to the NBEA. Submit **no** fees.

Step 3. Compete and have fun!

Step 4. The NBEA will confirm with the competition secretary that you competed, and will send a cheque for the full cost of your entry directly to the show organizers.*

IMPORTANT

- Riders will be funded on a first registered/first competed basis.
- Riders must be NBEA members
- Riders must have no record of having competed in any sanctioned competition before.
- All fees payable with the competition entry will be covered – class or division fees, drug & admin fees, levies, and stabling. (Coaching will not be covered).
- *Only the sanctioned competitions listed below are eligible* for funded entries. Thank you to those organizers for working with the NBEA to make this program possible! Non-sanctioned competitions of any kind are not eligible – see graphic below.
- Cancellation fees charged by competitions for entered riders withdrawing from the show will not be covered by the NBEA.

The NBEA Championships offers free entries to anyone who has competed at one sanctioned show during the year. This program will qualify 15 riders to attend!

Attending two sanctioned competitions qualifies riders to earn year-end awards and prizes!

** NOTE: DNB dressage shows will work differently, since their online entry system requires payment. We'll reimburse the rider after the competition, once confirmation has been received from DNB.*

Sanctioned Competitions

Equestrian Canada has approved and licensed the competition.

- ✓ Safety checks, risk management measures, biosecurity procedures, and written emergency plans are in place for riders, volunteers, officials, spectators, and horses.
- ✓ Insured
- ✓ Every mounted rider must wear approved helmet & have liability insurance through PTSO membership
- ✓ Horses must have minimum vaccinations
- ✓ Certified officials – judge, steward, TD, course designers, etc. All have earned accreditation through rigorous training over time
- ✓ Run under EC rules – written by experts in the discipline for safety, fair play, and consistency
- ✓ Dressage shows will use current USDF/EC tests
- ✓ Competition organizers receive tools and support
- ✓ Correct waivers and declaration documents are used
- ✓ Results are reported and counted toward year-end awards
- ✓ Registered coaches with first aid, safety & ethics training, insurance
- ✓ Free promotional services – postings on PTSO and NSO websites, newsletter notices, etc.



Unsanctioned Competitions

No governing body ensures safety or compliance with any regulations or expectations.

- ✓ Safety checks & measures and emergency plans may not be in place
- ✓ Biosecurity measures to protect humans and horses may not be followed
- ✓ May not be insured; riders may not be insured
- ✓ Helmets may not be required
- ✓ Horses may not be immunized
- ✓ May not utilize certified officials – judge, steward, TD, course designers, etc. Persons acting in these capacities may have little or no training in best safety practices; may not be insured
- ✓ No consistent rules – any rules can be invented & put in place, varying from show to show
- ✓ Dressage shows may *not* USDF/EC tests
- ✓ Any person may act in a coaching capacity regardless of first aid, safety & ethics training, insurance
