The NBEA Bronze Championship is a sanctioned Bronze competition member of Equestrian Canada (EC), 11 Hines Rd. Suite 201 Ottawa, Ontario, K2K 2X1 and is governed by the rules of EC. Every class offered herein is covered by the current rules and specifications of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book.

Equestrian Canada Statement of Principle

Equestrian Canada (EC), the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction.

EC is committed to:

- upholding the welfare of the horses, regardless of monetary value, as a primary consideration in all activities:
- requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment;
- ensuring that owners, trainers and exhibitors and their agents exercise appropriate care and responsibility in handling, treatment and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose;
- providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort and safety;
- continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- requiring owners, trainers and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competition;
- reviewing, revising and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horses.
- In determining whether conduct or treatment is cruel, abusive or inhumane, the standard to be applied will be the conduct or treatment expected of a reasonable person who is informed and experienced in equine training and exhibition procedures.
- Individuals who interact with horses must also adhere to EC's policies as they relate to horse welfare.

The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive nor inhumane.

Every entry at an EC sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible (see definition in entry form section) that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC Constitution and the applicable rules of EC and additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in the EC sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition. A801.

SHOW RULES

Administration:

- 1. All entry forms due no later than five (5) days prior to the show as entries may need to be limited in some classes for safety and management purposes.
- Any late entries received after the October 2th date will be charged an additional administration fee of \$50.00 per horse.
- 3. Entries:

4. Payments:

Make all cheques payable to "New Brunswick Equestrian Association" and must accompany signed entry form(s). E-TRANSFERS may be sent to equinenb@gmail.com. No password is required by us; please do not set one up. Note should indicate transfer is for NBEA Champs.

- 5. No post-dated cheques accepted. NSF cheques will be charged \$50 administration fee.
- 6. No entries will be accepted by telephone or fax.
- 7. All entries must be complete and made in writing (Article A801.4). The show numbers will not be issued if all the required signatures are not complete and payment is not made in full.
- 8. Hunter and Jumper Classes are entered by division only.
- **9.** Post entries will be accepted up to one hour prior to the class and will be subject to an additional \$5 charge per class or division.
- **10.** Scratches will not be reimbursed.
- 11. Official protests must be made in writing to the secretary of the competition, signed and accompanied by a \$111.00 cash deposit within 48 hours of competition of the class, Equestrian Canada Article A1204.
- 12. Ribbons 1st to 6th place. Each division will declare a Champion and Reserved. If there are four or more competitors in the division, Champion will receive \$100 and Reserve will receive \$50. Presented at the completion of each division.
- **13.** Equestrian Canada Rule A814: Annex Section G 1-1.2 The competition organizing committee must provide every entry with a competition number that must be worn and visible at all times anywhere out of the stable at the event location, whether the horses is being hand walked or ridden.
- **14.** Show Committee reserves the right to measure any pony or horse entered in the show. IF you have a pony who needs a measurement card please contact the show office before the competition.
- 15. Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of Equestrian Canada and will be held and judged in accordance with the Equestrian Canada Rule Book. Any incident requiring a ruling which cannot be referenced to the EC Rule Book, will be rendered by the Show Committee.
- 16. If less than four entries are received for any class, the show committee reserves the right to cancel or combine classes where the rules are applicable.
- 17. Entry forms must be signed by exhibitor, owner and person responsible. If the owner or exhibitor is under 19 years of age, the entry must be signed by a parent or legal guardian who assumes all responsibility and risk as stated on the form and by these rules and regulations. The entry form for all sanctioned competitions shall also be signed by the person responsible for the care, training, custody and performance of the horse. The person responsible may be the trainer, owner, rider, agent or coach. The parent or guardian must sign the entry form if there is no other person responsible. The person responsible is to be present at the competition and if they cannot attend, must appoint a representative who is present on the show grounds and must notify the competition secretary. Article A1011. With the exception of a parent or (Glossary page 88., Section A, see A213.2), the person responsible who signs an entry form must hold an EC or USEF individual license. (See

A203.5).

- **18.** Management has the right to expel any rider, owner or spectator deemed to be in their sole discretion disruptive to the show at any time.
- 19. Dogs must be leashed or caged while on the show grounds. The Owners are solely and expressly responsible for their dogs and the dog's behavior. Owners of loose dogs will be charged \$75.00 to retrieve their pets.
- **20.** Absolutely "NO" smoking permitted on show grounds.
- 21. The show office will open one (1) hour prior to the start of the show and close 1/2 hour at the end of the show.
- 22. Bronze Sport licenses are required for all classes and can be purchased at www.equestrian.ca

Entry Fees:

The following entry fees apply to competitors who have **not attended a Bronze competition** in New Brunswick in 2023:

The entry fees for individual classes/ jumping divisions are:

Hunter (Intro, Beginner, Low) Divisions	\$60.00
Jumper Divisions	\$40.00
Individual Classes (not part of Hunter/Jumper divisions)	\$20.00

All class/division fees will be waived if the competitor has competed in a NBEA sanctioned Bronze competition during the 2023 show year. No admin fee will be charged, and the NBEA will pay the drug fee.

Exhibitor Requirements:

- 1. Equestrian Canada Bronze Sport License and NBEA membership are required to compete in Bronze classes. Equestrian Canada Bronze License is NOT required for exhibitors competing only in Lead Line.
- 2. Bronze memberships may be purchased online at www.equestrian.ca Your receipt will be proof of memberships. Temporary one-day memberships are no longer available.
- 3. Any horse, in any class at a competition, may, while on the competition grounds, be selected for equine medication control testing. (Article A602.5) Equine medication control testing fee is \$4.00.
- Coggins test must be sent in with your entry forms. Coggins tests with a stamped date within 2023 will be accepted.
- 5. All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations
- 6. Non-showing horses: All non-competing horses brought on the property during the competition must have a signed blank entry and owners and non-competing riders must have a current NBEA membership. Anyone riding non competing horses which have been brought on to the show grounds must wear a number issued by the office.
- 7. Amateur Owners must have current credentials (Article A902). A photocopy of the current amateur card must be attached with entry A802.5 e).
- 8. As per Equestrian Canada rule article A805, the Show Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry, except as provided in 805.2 (a,b,c,d,e).
- 9. The show will forfeit 75% of the entry fee less the fees for classes completed if the horse entered is withdrawn due to unsoundness or sickness provided a veterinarian's certificate is produced, dated no later than the closing day of the show and received within 10 days of the show date.
- 10. All riders, grooms, attendants and handlers must be neatly dressed on entering the ring.
- 11. When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries, must be in good- standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments.

SAFETY RULES:

1. Protective Headgear

- a. <u>All competitors</u> must wear ASTM (American Society for Testing Materials), SEI, EN, AS/NZS or BSI approved helmets, with safety harness correctly fastened, at all times while mounted on the competition grounds.
- Juniors showing any horse in a jog for soundness must wear approved protective headwear with the attached safety harness fastened.
- c. EC makes no representation or warranty expressed or implied about any protective headgear and cautions riders that serious injury or death may result despite wearing such headgear as all equestrian sports involve inherent dangerous risk and adds no protective helmet can protect against all foreseeable injuries.
- d. All violations which occur outside the competition arena will be reported to the judge/jury who will levy the applicable penalty.
- e. All violations which occur in the competition arena will be acted upon by the judge(s) who will levy the applicable penalty.

- f. For all competitors, if the harness comes undone or the hat falls off, the rider must retrieve and/or do up the hat, with assistance, if necessary, before the next obstacle is taken. There will be no penalty other than the loss of time. Failure to do up the harness or retrieve protective headgear immediately results in elimination.
- 2. The show committee does not accept responsibility for accidents or illness to horses, riders, grooms, spectators or any other persons. In the case of a fall of a horse or pony. Article A 517.4 will apply. The officiating steward, judge, technical delegate, president of ground jury or appointed competitions veterinarian has the authority to remove a horse from the event for a period of up to 24 hours, if in their reasonable opinion the horse is unfit to compete, or where, in their reasonable opinion, there is safety concern regarding the horse. The official's decision is final and cannot be appealed.
- **3.** Exhibitors competing for provincial points are requested to enter the animal in the name of the member of the family who is the official Equine Canada member.
- 4. FALLS: In the case of a fall of an Athlete anywhere within the grounds of the event during the hours of competition operation, the Athlete must be checked by the Competition's medical service, before the Athlete may continue to compete in the next round or Competition. The competitor is solely responsible for ensuring the onsite medical assessment takes place. This rule is applicable to all competitors (including foreign) at EC sanctioned events and applies to falls/accidents that occur at the event location. After being eliminated for a fall, the rider may not remount in the ring. Any rider who does remount in the ring after a fall will be eliminated from all classes in that ring for the remainder of the day. A rider who remounts after a fall and takes another obstacle will be disqualified from the remainder of the show.
- **5. IN-GATE:** In all classes, trotting or cantering through the in-gate without prior permission is forbidden. The penalty for contravening this rule is either a fine or elimination from the class, at the discretion of the judge. Under special circumstances, a steward or judge may give permission for a horse to trot into the ring, but not out of the ring.
- 6. STALLIONS: Stallions are permitted at this competition but only if shown by Senior competitors
- 7. HORS CONCOURS: "Hors Concours" is not allowed at this competition
- 8. The use of Cell phones, IPODS, etc. is not allowed while riding.
- 9. Any horse that becomes out of control shall be eliminated from the competition at the discretion of the judge and Steward. A 1307.8 A Judge must order from the ring any unruly or unsafe horse and/or rider or driver or anyone whose actions threaten to endanger other competitors, their entries or the public. A1311.2.d Stewards PREVENT problems by: Barring unmanageable horses or ponies from the schooling rings..
- 10. Schooling Rules for Hunter/Jumper: see Annex 1 page 102 Section G rule book.
- 11. Rules for this competition may be downloaded for free on Equestrian Canada's Website or ordered from the NBEA office. Read: Section G for Hunter, Jumper, Equitation, Hack and refer to Section A for Equestrian Canada's General Regulations
- 12. Bronze competitors require NBEA membership and EC Bronze membership or higher. NBEA Membership may be purchased at nbea.ca. Bronze Membership may be purchased from Equestrian Canada (www.equestrian.ca). Printed receipt will be accepted for proof of Equestrian Canada membership.
- 13. Substitutions: a substituted horse must have competed in a Bronze show in 2023

Bio-Security.

- a. Competitors are advised not to bring horses to the show that exhibit any symptoms of illness.
- b. Competitors are advised not to share equipment between horses.
- c. Direct contact between horses is discouraged.
- d. Competitors are advised as to the risk of grazing horses where other horses have grazed.
- e. If you have a horse that shows any indication of illness you must notify the competition office. examples:

An equine with a body temperature more than 39°C Persistent cough and/or laboured breathing at rest

Abnormal nasal discharge

An equine that is ataxic or recumbent

An equine with persistent diarrhea

An equine with oral or coronary band vesicular or ulcerative lesion

An equine that demonstrates either aggressive behaviour or stupor

f. Owners will be asked to quarantine as directed by competition management any horses that show signs of illness.

Costs incurred for veterinarian care are the responsibility of the equine owner.

HUNTER DIVISION

(Miscellaneous Hunter Divisions not rated for EC Awards)

Note: Horses Entering Bronze Hunter Divisions may only enter 2 of 3 divisions (i.e., Intro and Pre-Beginner Hunter OR Pre-Beginner and Beginner or Beginner and Heritage Low Hunter)

INTRO HUNTER

Entry Fee: \$60 for division (2 over fences and 1 under saddle)

Prize: Ribbons (1st - 6th)

Division Champion and Reserve ribbons. If there are four or more competitors in the division, Champion will receive \$100; Reserve will receive \$50

Class #1 Intro Hunter #1 – (Over fences: A simple hunter course of at least 8 fences with no combinations. Emphasis of judging on manners, obedience and style. Trotting to fences will not be penalized. Distances not to be adjusted for horses and ponies. Maximum height and width to be 22" (0.55m). Fences may be low verticals or oxers. Majority of fence to be 18" (0.45m). Open to seniors riding horses or large ponies and juniors riding horses or ponies of any height.

Class #2 Intro Hunter #2

Class #3 Intro Hunter Under Saddle – To be shown at walk, trot and canter, both ways of the ring. No more than eight to hand-gallop at one time. (To be eligible for awards horses/ponies must have completed the course in at least one fences class in their respective division.)

Pre-BEGINNER HUNTER

Entry Fee: \$60 for division (2 over fences and 1 under saddle)

Prize: Ribbons (1st - 6th)

Division Champion and Reserve ribbons. If there are four or more competitors in the division, Champion will receive \$100; Reserve will receive \$50

Class #4 Pre- Beginner Hunter #1 – (To complete a hunter-type jumping course of at least 8 obstacles not to exceed 2'3" (0.70m) in height. To be judged on obedience, jumping form and general way of going. Open to seniors riding horses or large ponies and juniors riding horses or ponies. The course may, but is not required, to be adjusted in height and distance for ponies.) Juniors of any age may show any height of pony in miscellaneous, non-point classes.

Class #5 Pre-Beginner Hunter #2

Class #6 Pre-Beginner Hunter Under Saddle.

BEGINNER HUNTER

Entry Fee: \$60 for division (2 over fences and 1 under saddle)

Prize: Ribbons (1st – 6th)

Division Champion and Reserve ribbons. If there are four or more competitors in the division, Champion will receive \$100; Reserve will receive \$50

Class #7 Beginner Hunter #1 – (To complete a hunter-type jumping course of at least 8 obstacles not to exceed 2'6" (0.75m) in height. To be judged on obedience, jumping form and general way of going. Open to seniors riding horses or large ponies and juniors riding horses or ponies. The course may, but is not required, to be adjusted in height and distance for ponies.) Juniors of any age may show any height of pony in miscellaneous, non-point classes.

EQUITATION DIVISION

Entry Fee: \$20 per class Prize: Ribbons (1st – 6th)

Equestrian Canada rule section G1001-1009

- Equitation classes are divided by age groups as follows: Individuals are juniors until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18. Article A901.
- Routine on the flat: Article G1007. Riders will proceed at least once around the ring at each gait walk, trot and canter, reverse and repeat. At the judge's discretion, they may be asked to execute an individual test.

Class #25 Jr. "A" Hunter Seat (not to jump) Equestrian Canada A rider who is 15, 16, 17 on January 1 of current year.

Class #26 Jr. "B" Hunter Seat (not to jump) Equestrian Canada A rider who is 12, 13, or 14 on January 1 of current year..

Class #27 Jr. "C" Hunter Seat (not to jump) Equestrian Canada A rider who is under 12 on January 1 of current year..

Class #28 Adult Amateur Hunter Seat (not to jump) Equestrian Canada

Members will be classified as Senior from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 19.

ENGLISH HACK DIVISION

Entry Fee: \$20 per class

Prize: Ribbons (1st - 6th)

Division Champion and Reserve ribbons. If there are four or more competitors in the division, Champion will receive \$100; Reserve will receive \$50

ARTICLE G204. 5-6 In case of a tie the championship and/or reserve shall be awarded to the horse that has accumulated the most points over fences. If there is still a tie, the tied horses she be shown at a, walk, trot and canter to determine champion and reserve. Tossing a coin to break the tie is permissible if all participants agree. In the event that all tied horses are declared unsound, selection of the winner amongst such tied horses shall be left to the discretion of the judge.

Jumper Divisions

Article G 505

In the case of a tie for the Champion/Reserve, the highest placing in the largest prize money class of the division will be used. If all classes have the same prize money, the last class of the division will be used.

Miscellaneous Divisions (HACK)

Ties for the High Point Championship and Reserve will be shown in hand and judged on conformation
