Bio-Security

a. The show will be conducted in compliance with the COVID precautions in force at the time. The latest restrictions will be posted before the show and during the show day.

b. Competitors are advised not to bring horses to the show that exhibit any symptoms of illness.

- c. Competitors are advised not to share equipment between horses.
- d. Direct contact between horses is discouraged.
- e. Competitors are advised as to the risk of grazing horses where other horses have grazed.

f. Stalls will be cleaned.

- g. If you have a horse that shows any indication of illness you must notify the competition office. Examples:
 - An equine with a body temperature more than 39°C;
 - Persistent cough and/or labored breathing at rest;
 - Abnormal nasal discharge;
 - An equine that is ataxic or recumbent;
 - An equine with persistent diarrhea;
 - An equine with oral or coronary band vesicular or ulcerative lesion; and
 - An equine that demonstrates either aggressive behavior or stupor.

h. As directed by competition management, owners will be asked to quarantine horses that show signs of illness.

Show Rules

- 1. **ABUSE OF HORSES WILL NOT BE TOLERATED.** Any act deemed abusive towards an animal or individual is strictly prohibited and shall result in immediate expulsion from the show grounds, forfeiting all fees paid.
- 2. A provincial sport membership (i.e.NBEA/NSEF) is **MANDATORY**. Photocopy of provincial membership card must accompany entry form.
- 3. All cheques are to be made payable to the **NB MORGAN HORSE CLUB**. No postdated cheques will be accepted after the official closing date for entries July 4, 2023.
- 4. Owner's full name, complete address, and postal code must be on entry form.
- 5. **There is no fee for Championship Halter classes**. The first and second place winners from each Open Breed Halter class will be asked to return to the ring for the Open Breed Championship class.
- 6. Ribbons will be awarded to five places. Trophies or prizes may be presented in some classes.
- 7. One entry form per horse and rider combination.
- 8. Juniors Individuals are juniors until the end of the calendar year in which they reach 18. Juniors are not permitted to show stallions at this event.
- 9. Amateur classes are open to senior amateur exhibitors only. NBMHC Definition Senior riders who receive no remuneration for teaching riding lessons, or training horses/ponies for others.
- 10. An open class is one which is open to all horses of any age irrespective of the ribbons previously won and in which there are no qualifications for the rider/driver.
- 11. It is strongly recommended that all horses be inoculated against influenza, rhino-pneumonitis and strangles. Any persistent coughing or obviously ill horse will be barred from the show grounds for their own and others protection. It is strongly recommended that the horses have a current negative coggins test.
- 12. A judge must order from the ring any unruly or unsafe horse or rider.
- 13. There will be no refund of class fees unless the horse is withdrawn due to serious illness or injury to the horse (veterinary certification required) or serious illness, injury or death in the exhibitor's family. In these cases 75% of entry fees 100% of stabling fees and number fees will be refunded. No refund on administration fee. If horse is already on competition grounds only 75% of entry fees will be refunded. A suitable horse may be substituted.
- 14. <u>Scratches</u> Exhibitors must notify the show secretary and/or in-gate attendant in a timely matter well before the class if they withdraw their horse from a class or change rider/driver. Classes begin no later than <u>5 minutes</u> after the last horse leaves the ring from the previous class.
- 15. <u>Tack holds</u> Exhibitors must notify the show secretary and/or in-gate attendant a minimum of three exhibitor attended classes prior to the requested hold. Conduct of hold: The gate will be closed after previous class exits ring and will stay closed until the competitor who requested the hold is ready or the allotted hold time has expired. The gate will then be opened and all competitors will enter the ring. Tack hold will be an additional three minutes added to time allowed between classes.
- 16. Competitors' numbers must be worn and visible at all times in the schooling and exercise rings, as well as the competition ring. There will be a charge of \$5.00 each for back numbers. This will be refunded when the numbers are returned to the show secretary at the end of the show.
- 17. The indoor show ring will be open the day prior to the commencement of the show and will close at 9:00 PM that night. Possible other times TBA.
- 18. Warm up ring & in gate: Priority is for horses in the next class. Please be courteous and do schooling and early warm up in

the cattle penning ring. **No lunging in arena any time a mounted rider is present. No Lunging during competition hours.** There will be no conduct in the warm-up area or in-gate area, which disturbs or creates a hazard to the horses or handlers.

- 19. Horses shall be shown at all gates both ways of the ring.
- 20. Horses must be shown without artificial appliances. Anything that alters the intended use of equipment as provided for in the description of appointments for a given class is considered to be an artificial appliance. Gag bits are prohibited. The use of leg chains, rollers, hock hobbles or similar devices on the show grounds during or before a show are prohibited and the show committee shall bar violators from participation for the remainder of the show, and they shall forfeit all entry fees and winnings for the entire show. Ear plugs are legal.
- 21. Rider attire should be suitable to the saddle being ridden.
- 22. PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR and SAFETY VESTS. Any competitor may wear protective headgear or Safety Vest in any Division, Section or class without penalty from the judge. Junior Exhibitors must wear proper fitting, approved protective headgear, with safety harness correctly secured, at all times while mounted on the competition or event grounds. Show Rule Junior Exhibitors are to wear protective headgear during schooling and warm up. Junior Exhibitors participating in classes which allow western hats may wear traditional headgear during their class changing from protective headgear dismounted when the class preceding enters the competition arena.
- 23. Stallions MUST be under control at all times. Junior exhibitors are not permitted to show stallions at this event.
- 24. The show reserves the right to cancel a class if there are less than three entries.
- 25. Hors Concours entries will not be permitted in the competition.
- 26. For insurance purposes, all horses must have a stall. No tying to trailers.
- 27. Parking available on the grounds. Please park horse trailers between barn 3 and the hockey arena or next to the barns. For safety reasons we would like to keep the warm-up area uncluttered. Travel trailers parked by the ball field may not be moved during competition hours.
- 28. Entries may leave the show grounds following their last class.
- 29. The show committee reserves the right to refuse any entry.
- 30. **PROFESSIONAL SERVICES:** Payment for professional service or consultations performed by the Show Veterinarian, Farrier or Photographer will be the responsibility of the exhibitor only. **NBMHC will not be held responsible for these services**.
- 31. Championship Awards (High Point Basis) Points will calculated on horse rider/driver combination in the following divisions.
 - Champion All Breed Junior Exhibitor Classes 44, 64, 75, 88, 105 and 119.
 - Champion Small Equine Driving Classes 41, 45, 55, and 66.
- 32. The term Junior and Senior used in class description refers to age of the Exhibitor.
- 33. PLP Barn Rules must be followed.
- 34. Entry forms must be signed by exhibitor, owner and person responsible. If the owner or exhibitor is a junior, the entry must be signed by a parent or legal guardian who assumes all responsibility and risk as stated on the form and by these rules and regulations. The entry form for all sanctioned competitions shall also be signed by the person responsible for the care, training, custody and performance of the horse. By definition, The Person Responsible is the individual responsible and accountable for the care, training, custody and performance of the horse. The Person Responsible may be the trainer, owner, rider, driver, agent or coach. The Person Responsible must be an adult. **The person responsible is to be present at the competition and if they cannot attend must appoint a representative and notify the competition secretary.**

All Breed Halter

- 9. All Breed Halter Mares 2 & Under
- 10. All Breed Halter Mares 3 & Over
- 18. All Breed Halter Geldings 2 & Under
- 19. All Breed Halter Geldings 3 & Over
- 20. All Breed Halter Championship (Mares & Geldings) To qualify for this class, horses must place first or second in class 9, 10, 18, or 19. (There is no entry fee)

All Breed English (Hunter seat)

Appointments: Hunter style equipment including balanced seat or forward seat saddle, and snaffle, pelham, kimberwick, or full bridle. If a full bridle is used, it must be of hunter type, and excess length of curb shank will be penalized. Breast plates are permissible but martingales are prohibited. Mane and tail may be braided in traditional hunter style. No discrimination will be made against a full, unbraided mane or tail.

- 44. **All Breed English Equitation Junior** (*hunt seat*) Pattern to be posted. Rider to be judged on equitation. See show rule 8 for age definition.
- 47. **All Breed English Equitation Senior** (*hunt seat*) Pattern to be posted. Rider to be judged on equitation.
- 64. All Breed Road Hack Junior (hunt seat) To be judged at walk, trot, road trot, canter, hand gallop both ways of the ring. See show rule 8 for age definition.
- 66. All Breed Road Hack Senior (hunt seat) To be judged at walk, trot, road trot, canter, hand gallop both ways of the ring.
- All Breed English Pleasure Junior (hunt seat)
 To be shown at a walk, trot, extended trot, canter, and extended canter both ways of the ring. See show rule #8 for age definition.
- 78. All Breed English Pleasure Senior (hunt seat)To be shown at a walk, trot, extended trot, canter, and extended canter both ways of the ring.
- 82. All Breed English Pleasure Championship (hunt seat)

Open to junior and senior exhibitors. To be shown at a walk, trot, extended trot, canter, and extended canter both ways of the ring. To qualify for this class, horses must have entered, shown, and been judged in class 75 or 78.

All Breed Showmanship

Showmanship classes demonstrate the exhibitor's ability to fit or prepare as well as show a horse to a designated person The Showmanship class is to be judged 40% on preparation and 60% on Showmanship. Halter and lead .

88. All Breed Showmanship Junior

Pattern to be posted. See show rule 8 for age definition.

- 89. All Breed Showmanship Senior Pattern to be posted.
- 90. All Breed Showmanship Championship

Open to junior and senior exhibitors. Pattern to be posted. To qualify for this class, horses must have entered, shown, and been judged in class 88 or 89.

All Breed Western

Appointments: Western tack and any standard Western bit must be used in all classes. A standard Western bit is defined as having a shank with a maximum length overall of 8.2 inches. Mouthpiece must be round, oval or egg shaped smooth. Standard snaffle bits and Bosals are permitted in any class on a **junior horse (five-years-old and under).** Hackamore bits, cavesson type nosebands, martingales, and tie- downs are prohibited. Mechanical hackamores are prohibited.

Attire: *Rider may wear properly fitting protective safety headgear without penalty from the judge.* Exhibitors must wear appropriate Western attire, including long sleeve shirt with a collar, Western hat and cowboy boots. Spurs and chaps are optional.

105. All Breed Horsemanship Junior

Pattern to be posted. Rider to be judged on equitation. See show rule 8 for age definition.

108. All Breed Horsemanship Senior

Pattern to be posted. Rider to be judged on equitation.

119. All Breed Western Pleasure Junior

Judged at walk, jog, and lope both ways of the ring. Horses age 6 and over must be shown one handed in a shank bit. Emphasis on mangers, and performance. See show rule 8 for age definition.

121. All Breed Western Pleasure Senior

Judged at walk, jog, and lope both ways of the ring. Horses age 6 and over must be shown one handed in a shank bit. Emphasis on manners, and performance.

129. All Breed Western Pleasure Championship Open to junior and senior exhibitors. Judged at walk, jog, and lope both ways of the ring. Horses age 6 and over must be shown one handed in a shank bit. To qualify for this class, horses must have entered, shown, and been judged in class 119 or 121.

All Breed Adult Amateur

Open to senior <u>amateur</u> <i>competitors. (rule # for 9 definition)

- 59. All Breed Adult Amateur Road Hack (hunt seat or saddle seat)
- To be judged at walk, trot, road trot, canter, hand gallop both ways of the ring.

72. All Breed Adult Amateur English Pleasure (hunt seat)

To be shown at a walk, trot, extended trot, canter, and extended canter both ways of the ring.

112. All Breed Adult Amateur Western Pleasure Judged at walk, jog, and lope both ways of the ring. Horses age 6 and over must be shown one handed in a shank bit. Emphasis on manners, and performance.

All Breed Green Horse/Green Rider

Green Horse/Green Rider classes are open to horses or riders in their first two years of showing under saddle. These classes will be walk/trot, walk/jog only. A senior horse (age 6 and up) may be shown in a snaffle bit in these classes only. Green Horse or Green Rider showing in this division may not show in any other classes at this competition with the exception of halter and showmanship. **Must declare on the entry form if the rider is green or the horse is green.**

50. All Breed Green Horse Equitation #1 (English or Western)

Pattern to be posted. Rider to be judged on equitation.

- 68. All Breed Green <u>Horse</u> Pleasure #1 (English or Western) To be shown at a walk, and trot/jog both ways of the ring.

<u>Green Rider</u>

All Breed Lead Line

Appointments: Rider must wear properly fitting approved safety protective headgear and boots with a heel are required. Hunt seat, Saddle seat, and Western tack are acceptable. Open to riders who are at least two and have not reached their 7th birthday as of January 1. Leaders must be a minimum of 16 years of age. Safety is of the utmost importance in presentation, tack and attire. It is required that equipment fit the rider with rider's feet in the stirrups. Stallions are prohibited. Entries will be led both ways of the ring, only at a walk.

- 67. All Breed Lead Line (English or Western)
- Rider must wear properly fitting protective headgear. Boots with a heel are required. 114. All Breed Lead Line (Costume - English or Western) Description of the second second

Dress Up time!!! Rider must wear properly fitting protective headgear. Boots with a heel are required.

All Breed Carriage Driving

(Open to entries that are not eligible for Small Equine or Miniature Horse – must be over 12.2 hands)

Class Specifications

CARRIAGE DRIVING CLASS GENERAL RULES

A. Horses to enter ring at a trot. Horses must be serviceably sound and all driving horses must be three years or older.

B. Drivers should strive to present an appropriate turnout indicated by the balance and pleasing appearance of the combination of horse to vehicle.

C. The only person to control the horse is the driver, under penalty of disqualification. No change of driver is permitted during any class. D. Drivers and their passengers should conform to the type of turnout and Suggested appropriate attire: Gentlemen to wear a hat, coat or jacket, shirt and pants, and tie; ladies to wear a dress, tailored suit, skirt or slacks with blouse, vest or jacket. Hats optional. Gloves and aprons or lap robes are optional in all classes. All exhibitors may choose to wear a helmet instead of a hat.

F. Boots or wraps of any description and ear plugs shall not be used on any horse in the show ring.

G. An appropriate driving whip shall be carried (in hand or in vehicle) at all times while driving. Failure to do so will result in disqualification. The overall length of the whip for a single horse should be long enough to reach its shoulder. Excessive length beyond the shoulder is not allowed. H. Safety

1. No horse shall be left unattended while put to a vehicle. Disqualification for the balance of the show may result at the show manager's discretion.

2. Drivers must drive on the rail at a safe distance behind horse and cart in front. Passing is permissible but the driver should return to the rail as soon as possible.

3. A judge must excuse from competition any unsafe vehicle, equipment, or horse for that class.

4. Headers: A header is an appropriately attired (proper footwear, no shorts or tank tops and should always be neat and clean.) capable person 16 years of age or over. This attendant shall take NO action that will affect the performance of any horse. Only one header is allowed per horse. The header must not have a whip and shall remain at least two (2) paces distant from the head of the horse when the judge is inspecting the horse, and at all other times unless assistance in controlling the horse is needed. Adult (19 years of age or older) headers are mandatory for all youth drivers and optional for all other drivers.

5. Blinders are required.

6. No entry may leave the ring after judging has begun without permission from the judge. If an accident or equipment failure occurs which needs medical attention or repair, those involved shall remain in position and all other entries shall move to the center of the arena.

7. During a class, minor adjustments to harness may be made upon permission from the judge. A groom may assist with the adjustment without penalty. After judging has begun, no attendant may enter the arena without the permission of the judge. Only one time out per class/per horse once horse has entered the ring. Maximum time not to exceed three (3) minutes. Official time outs must be declared by the judge. More than one time out per exhibitor shall result in disqualification.

9. No youth may drive a stallion.

11. A driver must never allow passengers to enter a vehicle until he/she is seated with the reins in hand and must never dismount while passengers are in the vehicle.

12. It is permissible to talk to your horse(s) in a subdued tone of voice. Any tendency on the part of the driver to shout, whistle, or talk loudly to the horse should be curtailed. The driver should strive to control the horse's movements with minimal vocal aids.

13. Check reins optional -in all classes.

40. ALL BREED OBSTACLES

To be driven over a prescribed course of obstacles. The number of obstacles shall be proportionate to the dimensions of the driving area. Not to exceed 20 obstacles. 2. After passing the starting line, the driver shall proceed through each obstacle in order to the designated finish line. 3. Course faults are assessed as penalty seconds and are added to the driver's elapsed time. Placings are determined on a low total time basis. Ties for first will be decided by a drive-off

52. ALL BREED CARRIAGE DRIVING TURNOUT

To be judged primarily on the suitability of the horse to provide a pleasure drive. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, slow trot, working trot, and strong trot. (See class 58 specifications for description of gaits). The horse must stand quietly and rein back readily. To be judged 70% on the condition, fit and appropriateness of harness, vehicle, spares, appointments, neatness and appropriateness of attire. 30% on manners and way of going.

56. ALL BREED CARRIAGE DRIVING WORKING

To be judged primarily on the suitability of the horse to provide a pleasure drive. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, slow trot, working trot, and strong trot. To stand quietly both on the rail and while in lineup and to rein back. All entries chosen for a workout may be worked both ways of the ring at any gate requested by the judge, and may be asked to execute a figure of eight. To be judged: 70% on performance, manners and way of going of the horse; 20% on the condition, fit of harness and vehicle; 10% on neatness of attire.

WALK – a four beat gait -A free, regular and unconstrained walk of moderate extension is ideal. The walk is energetically, but calm, with an even determined pace.

TROT –a two beat diagonal gait.

SLOW TROT: The horse should maintain forward impulsion while showing submission to the bit. The trot is slower and have some collection There should be willingness to be driven on the bit while maintaining a steady cadence.

WORKING TROT: The pace between the strong and the slow trot, more round than the strong trot. The horses go forward freely and straight. The hind feet touch the ground in the foot prints of the fore feet. The degree of energy and impulsion displayed at the working trot denotes clearly the degree of suppleness and balance of the horses.

STRONG TROT: This is a clear, but not excessive, increase in pace and lengthening of stride while remaining well balanced. Excessive speed will be penalized.

HALT: Horses and vehicle to be brought to a complete stop without abruptness or veering. The horses should stand attentive motionless and straight. The weight should be evenly distributed over all four leg. The horse should be ready to move off at the slightest aid from the driver.

REIN BACK: Rein back is a backward movement in which the legs are raised and set down simultaneously in diagonal pairs. First - The horse must move backward at least four steps in an unhurried manner with head flexed and straight, pushing the vehicle back evenly in straight line the driver using quiet aids and light contact. Second - Move forward willingly to the first position using the quiet aids.

104. ALL BREED CARRIAGE DRIVING REINSMANSHIP

A. Reinsmanship is shown to a two wheeled vehicle as described in B. Entries are judged primarily on the rein handling ability and skill of the driver. 75% of the score is on the handling of the reins and whip, control, posture, and overall working appearance of the driver. 25% is on the condition of the harness and vehicle and neatness of attire. Control is judged by the consistency of movement at various gaits; smooth, rapid gait changes consisting of three to four steps to be in the called gait; accuracy of performing the requested maneuver on the rail or by the complete, symmetrical pattern requested for individual work.

C. At no time should the horse appear to be out of control or heavily checked up.

D. Whip must be in hand at all times when the driver is in the ring.

E. Two methods of reinsmanship performance may be used as chosen by the judge:

1. Drivers are first judged as a group both ways of the arena at a walk, collected trot, halt, back, and working trot. Drivers are then asked to each do an individual "work off" or pattern set by the judge. Pattern to be used is not posted prior to the class, but is conducted as directed verbally by the judge during the class. The same pattern is driven by each participant in the class.

a. Perform a figure eight in the direction designated by the judge, with a salute at the beginning and end of the pattern. The start of the figure eight is in the middle of the eight facing the call judge. b. Perform a serpentine at the direction of the judge with a salute at the beginning and end of the pattern. The finish of the pattern will be a halt facing the call judge with the wheel hub in line with the cone.

2. Drivers are asked to perform reinsmanship skills on the rail as a group. They will be asked, in addition to working both ways of the arena at a walk, collected trot, and working trot, to perform according to the judge's calls. Judge may select one, several or all of the following maneuvers and may repeat the same maneuver as many times as desired to determine driver's reinsmanship skills:

a. Stop on the rail, pause and stand quietly until judge calls to move forward at a walk or collected trot.

b. Stop on the rail, back 2 or 3 steps, stand quietly, then proceed in the direction of go when judge calls to move forward at a walk or collected trot.

c. Reverse on the rail at a walk or collected trot.

d. Stop on the rail, do a 90 degree pivot turning inward and pause, standing quietly. Upon judge's call, return with a 90 degree pivot back to the rail in the original direction of go. Move forward at a walk or collected trot per judge's call.

e. Stop on rail, do a 90 degree pivot turning inward and pause, standing quietly. Upon judge's call, continue to turn with a 90 degree pivot to end up on the rail in the reverse of the original direction of go. Move forward at a walk or collected trot per judge's call.

Class Specifications

DRIVING CLASS GENERAL RULES

A. Horses to enter ring at a trot. Horses must be serviceably sound and all driving horses must be three (3) years or older.

B. Drivers should strive to present an appropriate turnout indicated by the balance and pleasing appearance of the combination of horse to vehicle.

C. The only person to control the horse is the driver, under penalty of disqualification. No change of driver is permitted during any class.

D. Drivers and their passengers should conform to the type of turnout and Suggested appropriate attire: Gentlemen to wear a hat, coat or jacket, shirt and pants, and tie; ladies to wear a dress, tailored suit, skirt or slacks with blouse, vest or jacket. Hats optional. Gloves and aprons or lap robes are optional in all classes. All exhibitors may choose to wear a helmet instead of a hat.

F. Boots or wraps of any description and ear plugs shall not be used on any horse in the show ring.

G. An appropriate driving whip shall be carried (in hand or in vehicle) at all times while driving. Failure to do so will result in disqualification. The overall length of the whip for a single horse should be long enough to reach its shoulder. Excessive length beyond the shoulder is not allowed. H. Safety

1. No horse shall be left unattended while put to a vehicle. Disqualification for the balance of the show may result at the show manager's discretion.

2. Drivers must drive on the rail at a safe distance behind horse and cart in front. Passing is permissible but the driver should return to the rail as soon as possible.

3. A judge must excuse from competition any unsafe vehicle, equipment, or horse for that class.

4. Headers: A header is an appropriately attired (no shorts or tank tops and should always be neat and clean.) capable person 16 years of age or over. This attendant shall take NO action that will affect the performance of any Miniature Horse or Small Equine. Only one header is allowed per horse. The header must not have a whip and shall remain at least two (2) paces distant from the head of the horse when the judge is inspecting the horse, and at all other times unless assistance in controlling the horse is needed. Adult (19 years of age or older) headers are mandatory for all youth drivers and optional for all other drivers.

5. Blinders are required.

6. No entry may leave the ring after judging has begun without permission from the judge. If an accident or equipment failure occurs which needs medical attention or repair, those involved shall remain in position and all other entries shall move to the center of the arena.

7. During a class, minor adjustments to harness may be made upon permission from the judge. A groom may assist with the adjustment without penalty. After judging has begun, no attendant may enter the arena without the permission of the judge. Only one time out per class/per horse once horse has entered the ring. Maximum time not to exceed three (3) minutes. Official time outs must be declared by the judge. More than one time out per exhibitor shall result in disqualification.

9. No youth may drive a stallion.

10. All persons involved in driving competition must have safety foremost in their minds.

11. A driver must never allow passengers to enter a vehicle until he/she is seated with the reins in hand and must never dismount while passengers are in the vehicle.

12. It is permissible to talk to your horse(s) in a subdued tone of voice. "Clucks" for starting, "walk on", "trot", "whoa" and "back" are the more accepted terms. Any tendency on the part of the driver to shout, whistle, or talk loudly to the horse should be curtailed. In the arena, the less said the better. The driver should strive to control the horse's movements with minimal vocal aids.

13. Check reins optional -in all classes.

39. SMALL EQUINE OBSTACLE DRIVING (Timed event cones course)

To be driven over a prescribed course of obstacles. The number of obstacles shall be proportionate to the dimensions of the driving area. Not to exceed 20 obstacles. 2. After passing the starting line, the driver shall proceed through each obstacle in order to the designated finish line. 3. Course faults are assessed as penalty seconds and are added to the driver's elapsed time. Placings are determined on a low total time basis. Ties for first will be decided by a drive-off

41. SMALL EQUINE DRIVING WORKING

To be judged primarily on the suitability of the horse to provide a pleasure drive. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, slow trot, working trot, and strong trot. To stand quietly both on the rail and while in lineup and to rein back. All entries chosen for a workout may be worked both ways of the ring at any gate requested by the judge, and may be asked to execute a figure of eight. To be judged: 70% on performance, manners and way of going of the horse; 20% on the condition, fit of harness and vehicle; 10% on neatness of attire.

WALK – a four beat gait -A free, regular and unconstrained walk of moderate extension is ideal. The walk is energetically, but calm, with an even determined pace.

TROT –a two beat diagonal gait.

SLOW TROT: The horse should maintain forward impulsion while showing submission to the bit. The trot is slower and have some collection There should be willingness to be driven on the bit while maintaining a steady cadence.

WORKING TROT: The pace between the strong and the slow trot, more round than the strong trot. The horses go forward freely and straight. The hind feet touch the ground in the foot prints of the fore feet. The degree of energy and impulsion displayed at the working trot denotes clearly the degree of suppleness and balance of the horses.

STRONG TROT: This is a clear, but not excessive, increase in pace and lengthening of stride while remaining well balanced. Excessive speed will be penalized.

HALT: Horses and vehicle to be brought to a complete stop without abruptness or veering. The horses should stand attentive motionless and straight. The weight should be evenly distributed over all four leg. The horse should be ready to move off at the slightest aid from the driver. REIN BACK: Rein back is a backward movement in which the legs are raised and set down simultaneously in diagonal pairs. First - The horse must

move backward at least four steps in an unhurried manner with head flexed and straight, pushing the vehicle back evenly in straight line the driver using quiet aids and light contact. Second - Move forward willingly to the first position using the quiet aids.

45. SMALL EQUINE PLEASURE DRIVING

The depiction, balance line and descriptive paragraph are to be used to define the "ideal" pleasure horse and are in no way intended to eliminate horses not capable of the ideal. Balance shall be 50% to rear. The ideal PLEASURE DRIVING horse shall be shown with light contact on the reins at all times. Head carriage should be in the bridle, with poll not lower than the withers and eye of the horse not higher than the withers. Stride flowing with a flat knee, minimal knee and hock action.

A. Pleasure Driving is a single horse driving class, hitched to show cart with either wooden or metal spoke wheels. A Basket is mandatory, a boot is optional.

To be judged on the following criteria, in the listed order: ATTITUDE PARAMOUNT Settled in the bridle, smooth gait transitions. MANNERS PARAMOUNT No gapping at the bit. Horse should appear willing to work. PERFORMANCE Steady in each gait and definite gait changes. QUALITY A "pretty" picture with appropriate action for class. CONFORMATION As correct for PLEASURE DRIVING. The ideal PLEASURE DRIVING horse should excel at all of the above items.

B. Class requirements:

Horse to be shown both directions in the arena at the Walk, Pleasure Trot, and the Working Trot. Horse will enter counter clockwise at the Pleasure Trot. Horse will be required to stand quietly and back readily.

C. Gait requirements:

1. WALK: A four beat, flat-footed and ground covering gait.

2. PLEASURE TROT: A two beat diagonal gait. Overall balance as shown above. Horse must demonstrate freedom of movement, be relaxed and easy going, demonstrating impulsion.

3. WORKING TROT: A lengthening of stride from the Pleasure Trot. Horse must demonstrate freedom of movement.

D. The use of a Martingale is optional.

60. SMALL EQUINE JR EXHIBITOR PLEASURE DRIVING

A. Same class specifications as class 45.

B. See Rule 8 for age definition

C. An attendant over the age of 19 may accompany the driver.

55. SMALL EQUINE REINSMANSHIP

A. Reinsmanship is shown to a two wheeled vehicle as described in B. Entries are judged primarily on the rein handling ability and skill of the driver. 75% of the score is on the handling of the reins and whip, control, posture, and overall working appearance of the driver. 25% is on the condition of the harness and vehicle and neatness of attire. Control is judged by the consistency of movement at various gaits; smooth, rapid gait changes consisting of three to four steps to be in the called gait; accuracy of performing the requested maneuver on the rail or by the complete, symmetrical pattern requested for individual work.

C. At no time should the horse appear to be out of control or heavily checked up.

D. Whip must be in hand at all times when the driver is in the ring.

E. Two methods of reinsmanship performance may be used as chosen by the judges:

1. Drivers are first judged as a group both ways of the arena at a walk, collected trot, halt, back, and working trot. Drivers are then asked to each do an individual "work off" or pattern set by the judge. Pattern to be used is not posted prior to the class, but is conducted as directed verbally by the judge during the class. The same pattern is driven by each participant in the class.

a. Perform a figure eight in the direction designated by the judge, with a salute at the beginning and end of the pattern. The start of the figure eight is in the middle of the eight facing the call judge. b. Perform a serpentine at the direction of the judge with a salute at the beginning and end of the pattern. The finish of the pattern will be a halt facing the call judge with the wheel hub in line with the cone.

2. Drivers are asked to perform reinsmanship skills on the rail as a group. They will be asked, in addition to working both ways of the arena at a walk, collected trot, and working trot, to perform according to the judge's calls. Judge may select one, several or all of the following maneuvers and may repeat the same maneuver as many times as desired to determine driver's reinsmanship skills:

a. Stop on the rail, pause and stand quietly until judge calls to move forward at a walk or collected trot.

b. Stop on the rail, back 2 or 3 steps, stand quietly, then proceed in the direction of go when judge calls to move forward at a walk or collected trot.

c. Reverse on the rail at a walk or collected trot.

d. Stop on the rail, do a 90 degree pivot turning inward and pause, standing quietly. Upon judge's call, return with a 90 degree pivot back to the rail in the original direction of go. Move forward at a walk or collected trot per judge's call.

e. Stop on rail, do a 90 degree pivot turning inward and pause, standing quietly. Upon judge's call, continue to turn with a 90 degree pivot to end up on the rail in the reverse of the original direction of go. Move forward at a walk or collected trot per judge's call.

f. Stop on rail, do a 180 degree pivot, pause, standing quietly. Then on judge's command, drive on in the reverse of the Then on judge's command, drive on in the reverse of the original direction at a walk or collected trot.
