Bio-Security

- a. The show will be conducted in compliance with the COVID precautions in force at the time. The latest restrictions will be posted before the show and during the show day.
- b. Competitors are advised not to bring horses to the show that exhibit any symptoms of illness.
- c. Competitors are advised not to share equipment between horses.
- d. Direct contact between horses is discouraged.
- e. Competitors are advised as to the risk of grazing horses where other horses have grazed.
- f. Stalls will be cleaned.
- g. If you have a horse that shows any indication of illness you must notify the competition office. Examples:
 - An equine with a body temperature more than 39°C;
 - Persistent cough and/or labored breathing at rest;
 - Abnormal nasal discharge;
 - An equine that is ataxic or recumbent;
 - An equine with persistent diarrhea;
 - An equine with oral or coronary band vesicular or ulcerative lesion; and
 - An equine that demonstrates either aggressive behavior or stupor.
- h. As directed by competition management, owners will be asked to quarantine horses that show signs of illness.

Equestrian Canada - Statement of Principles

Horse Welfare

- 9. EC supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction.
- 10. EC is committed to:
 - a) upholding the welfare of the horse, regardless of monetary value, as a primary consideration in all activities;
 - b) requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect, and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment;
 - c) ensuring that owners, trainers, and exhibitors and their agents exercise appropriate care and responsibility in the handling, treatment, and transportation of their horses, as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose;
 - d) providing for the continuous wellbeing of the horse by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, and safety;
 - e) continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
 - f) requiring owners, trainers, and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions; and,
 - g) reviewing, revising, and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.
- 11. In determining whether conduct or treatment is cruel, abusive or inhumane, the standard to be applied will be the conduct or treatment expected of a reasonable person who is informed and experienced in equine training and exhibition procedures.
- 12. Individuals who interact with horses must also adhere to EC's policies as they relate to horse welfare

Entrance and stall fees must be paid in full at time of entry:

\$20.00 per horse, administration fee

\$15.00 per in hand, junior exhibitor, performance or other regular class

\$25.00 per championship class

\$4.00 per horse Medical Certification Fee (drug testing)

\$45.00 per weekend per horse or tack stall (Belongings must be kept in a tack stall or removed from the barn.)

Championship Performance Classes Champion: \$15 Reserve \$10

Post entries: Accepted from closing date to two hours before class

Horses may be moved into the barns Friday afternoon July 15, 2023. Baled Shavings are available for purchase from the PLP. Exhibitors are free to bring their own shavings or sawdust from home. Straw, peat moss or other forms of bedding are not

permitted. If another form of bedding is required for health reasons, the exhibitor must contact the Show Centre manager in advance of the show.

General Rules

Rule reference numbers are included throughout this document, you can look up the rules in detail, for free, at https://www.equestrian.ca/programs-services/rules. For General Rules see Sec. A, for Breed Rules see Sec. B.

1. ABUSE OF HORSES WILL NOT BE TOLERATED.

- 2. Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location. A802
- 3. Competitors' numbers must be worn and visible at all times in the schooling and exercise rings, as well as the competition ring. (A814). There will be a charge of \$5.00 each for back numbers. This will be refunded when the numbers are returned to the show secretary at the end of the show.
- 4. All horses must be the bonafide property of the exhibitor or under legal lease (copy of which must be provided). Horses purchased on time are permitted to be shown and entered in any class under the Purchaser's name providing a written contract of sale can be produced to the Show Secretary.
- 5. All cheques are to be made payable to the NB MORGAN HORSE CLUB. No postdated cheques will be accepted after the official closing date for entries.
- 6. Owner's full name, complete address, and postal code must be on entry form.
- 7. There is no fee for Championship In-Hand classes, horses must qualify for entry. The first and second place horses will be called back for the championship classes.
- 8. Ribbons will be awarded to five places. Trophies or prizes may be presented in some classes. Perpetual Trophies must be returned the following year, if you have one of these trophies please bring it with you.
- 9. An open class is one which is open to all horses of any age irrespective of the ribbons previously won and in which there are no qualifications for the rider/driver.
- 10. All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 519, Vaccinations. All horses attending the EC sanctioned competition must have met the requirements of Article A519, vaccinations. It is also strongly recommended horses be inoculated against rabies and strangles. Any persistent coughing or obviously ill horse will be barred from the show grounds. It is also strongly recommended that horses have a current negative coggins test.
- 11. The judge must order from the ring any unruly or unsafe horse or rider.
- 12. There will be no refund of class fees unless the horse is withdrawn due to serious illness or injury to the horse (veterinary certification required) or serious illness, injury or death in the exhibitor's family. In these cases, 75% of entry fees and 100% of equine medications, stabling and number fees will be refunded. There is no refund on the administration fee. If horse is on competition grounds only 75% of entry fees will be refunded. A suitable horse may be substituted with no added fee.
- 13. <u>Scratches</u> Exhibitors **must** notify the show secretary and/or in-gate attendant in advance if they withdraw their entry from a class or change rider/driver. Classes begin no later than <u>5 minutes</u> after the last horse leaves the ring from the previous class.

- 14. <u>Tack holds</u> Exhibitors must notify the show secretary and/or in-gate attendant a minimum of three classes prior to the hold. Conduct of hold: The gate will be closed after previous class exits ring and will stay closed until the competitor who requested the hold is ready or the allotted time has expired. The gate will then be opened, and all competitors will enter the ring. Tack hold will be an additional <u>three minutes</u> added to time between classes.
- 15. The indoor show ring will be open for use 12:00 noon the day prior to the commencement of the show and will close at 9:00 PM that night. Other schooling times TBA.
- 16. Priority in the warm-up ring is for horses in the next class. No lunging in permitted in the arena when a mounted rider is present, there is also no lunging in the warmup ring during competition hours. There will be no conduct in the warm-up area or in-gate area, which disturbs or creates a hazard to the horses or handlers. Bag whips, noise makers, rattlers, chains, buckets and cans with rocks, or other equipment, devices or objects which might disturb a horse or exhibitor or create a hazard to horses or handlers in the paddock or in-gate area are prohibited. Please clear the ingate area promptly when exiting the ring to allow the next entries to enter safely.
- 17. Competitors' numbers must be worn and visible at all times in the schooling and exercise rings, as well as the competition ring. There will be a charge of \$5.00 each for back numbers. This will be refunded when the numbers are returned to the show secretary at the end of the show.
- 18. Horses shall be shown at all gaits both ways of the ring. In harness classes, drivers shall remain seated until all entries have been inspected and judged. One attendant without whip must head each horse in Park and Pleasure Driving classes. In Pleasure classes horses may be asked to back. Stallions MUST always be under control and shown by a competent handler.
- 19. Junior Exhibitors are prohibited from showing stallions in any class or division at this competition.
- 20. The show reserves the right to cancel a class if there are less than three entries. Hors Concours entries are not permitted in the competition.
- 21. Parking is available on the grounds. Please park horse trailers between Barn 3 and the hockey arena or next to the barns to keep the warm-up area uncluttered. Travel trailers parked by the outdoor ring may not be moved during competition hours.
- 22. Entries may leave the show grounds following their last class.
- 23. As per Equine Canada rule A805, the show committee reserves the right to refuse or limit any entry, except as provided in EC Rule A805.2.
- 24. Payment for professional services or consultations performed by the Show Veterinarian, Farrier or Photographer will be the responsibility of the exhibitor. The New Brunswick Morgan Horse Club, show committee or other representatives are not responsible for payment of these services.
- 25. For insurance purposes, all horses must have a stall. Tying to trailers is not permitted.
- 26. Entry forms must be signed by the exhibitor, owner and person responsible. If the owner or exhibitor is a junior, the entry must be signed by a parent or legal guardian. The entry form for all sanctioned competitions shall also be signed by the person responsible for the care, training, custody and performance of the horse. By definition, the Person Responsible is the individual responsible and accountable for the care, training, custody and performance of the horse. The Person Responsible may be the trainer, owner, rider, driver, agent or coach. The Person Responsible must be an adult who holds a valid EC Sport License. The person responsible is to be present at the competition and if they cannot attend must appoint a representative and notify the competition secretary. Parents/guardians are not required to have an EC Sport License provided they agree to abide by the rules and penalties contained in the Rule Book and acknowledge that they are liable under the penalty provisions of the Rules for any violations of the EC Rules by their minor child.
- 27. Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book. This show will run in accordance with the Code of Ethics of Equine Canada. Any situation requiring a ruling which cannot be referenced according to the Equine Canada rules will be rendered by the Show Committee.

- 28. Per Article A801, every entry at an EC-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC-sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC- sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition.
- 29. PRESENTATION OF THE SIGNED ENTRY FORM SHALL BE DEEMED AS ACCEPTANCE OF THESE RULES, AND ALL RULES OF EQUINE CANADA. Equine Canada Rules are available free online at www.equinecanada.ca
- 30. When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries, must be in good-standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments.
- 31. Hors Concours entries will not be permitted in the competition

Morgan Breed Division Rules

- 1. A copy of the registration papers showing recorded ownership or proof of lease with CMHA, AMHA or BMHS must be submitted with the entry form. Horses must be entered under the names of the owner(s) or lessee of record. Horses shown in this division that are owned by a Canadian resident for longer than twelve months must be purebred and registered with the Canadian Morgan Horse Association, if under one year of age, be eligible for registration and be entered under their full registered name.
- 2. All owners of Canadian owned Morgans who show in Morgan classes at EC-sanctioned shows must hold a current Canadian Morgan Horse Association membership or be current members of an organization having reciprocity. Exemptions: Exhibitors in Leadline and Walk/Trot classes are exempt from this requirement. Additionally, a parent/guardian signing an entry for a minor is not required to be a member.
- 3. Amateur number and cards must be present for Amateur to Ride/Drive/ Handle classes (including Classic).
- 4. The Morgan shall be shown in all its NATURAL beauty with full mane, forelock, and tail. Braiding is permitted in Hunter, Jumper, Dressage, and Carriage classes or in classes when shown under proper hunter or dressage tack and attire.
- 5. Riders in classes for Junior Exhibitors must not have reached their 18th birthday as of Dec. 1 of the previous year. The age of an individual on Dec. 1st will be maintained throughout the following competition year. The age requirements set out in this rule defining adults and juniors shall supersede the definition for junior(s) and adult(s) set out in all EC rules, regulations, agreements and policies applicable to the Morgan Division.
- 6. An open class is one which is open to all horses of any age irrespective of the ribbons previously won and in which there are no qualifications for the rider/driver.
- 7. Except for weanlings and yearlings which must be shown barefoot, horses may be shod or barefoot. If shod, shoes must be without rocker bars or Memphis bars. Bars must not extend below the bottom of the plane of the shoe. Weight attached to the exterior of the hoof is prohibited. Barium or standard screw-in caulks are allowed. There are three different length and/or weight restrictions according to the section or class within the Morgan Division. In Classic Pleasure classes, full pads are prohibited, horses may be shown with or without rim pads. Rim pads must follow the inner and outer edge of the shoe and the connection at the heel must not be wider than any aspect of the shoe. The entire sole and frog of the foot must be visible with the exception of that connection. The length of toe including shoe and pads must not exceed 4-1/2 inches. In Pleasure (except Classic Section), Pleasure Driving and Natural Park classes, there are no specific shoe weight limits but the length of toe must not exceed 5 inches including pad and shoe. In all In-Hand classes, Parade, Park Saddle, Park Harness, Hunter, Jumper, Eventing, Cutting, Reining, Carriage, Equitation and all other Morgan classes, there are no specific shoe weight limits but the length of toe must not exceed 5-3/4 inches including pads and shoe.
- 8. At all competitions where an EC Steward is officiating Champions and Reserve Champions must have one foot measured immediately upon leaving the ring except in classes where points are accumulated to determine Championships.

- 9. When the terms "prohibited," "not permitted," "mandatory," "must" or "obligatory" are used in these rules, any competitor who fails to comply MUST BE ELIMINATED by the judge, unless another penalty is stipulated. When the terms "should" or "shall" are used in these rules, and no penalty is prescribed, any competitor who fails to comply MAY BE PENALIZED by the judge.
- 10. Appointments shall be appropriate for horses shown in the particular class. Boots and artificial appliances are forbidden except in Reining, Working Western, Roadster, Jumper, Hunt Seat Equitation, and Stock Seat (Pattern/Reining) Equitation where **boots** are permissible (B5207.3). An inconspicuous tongue tie is permitted in all Morgan sections except Carriage Driving, Dressage, Hunter over Fences, Hunt Seat Equitation Over Fences, Reining Seat Equitation, Western Seat Equitation, Working Western, Trail, Reining and Western Pleasure (B5207).
- 11. Any competitor may wear protective headgear in any class without penalty from the judge. (B5208.2) **Junior Exhibitors are to wear protective headgear during schooling and warm up.** Juniors participating in classes which allow western hats or derbies may change from protective headgear while dismounted when the preceding class enters the arena.

12. Tack and appointments:

- a. For the Morgan **Hunter Pleasure** saddles must be **forward or balanced seat** with or without a shaped pad. Bits include **snaffle, pelham, kimberwick or full bridle** (**curb and snaffle).** Curb or Pelham bits with cheek pieces exceeding 5 ½" in total length are prohibited. The length of the shank is measured from the uppermost part of the headstall slot to the rein ring. Ornamented bridles, browbands or cavessons are not permitted. Reins may be braided, laced or plain when used with a snaffle, pelham or hunting double bridle. Breastplates are permissible, but martingales are prohibited. Mane and tail may be braided in traditional hunter style. No discrimination will be made against a full, unbraided mane and tail. (B5902)
- b. For **English Pleasure**, **Classic Pleasure** classes a **flat** English saddle is appropriate. Forward seat, western and dressage saddles are forbidden. A **full bridle** (**curb bit and bridoon**) will be proper. Spurs and whips are optional. Martingales are not permitted. (B5602.1, B5702.1)
- c. **Western** entries shall be shown with **stock saddle** but silver equipment will not count over a good working outfit. A sidesaddle shall be considered legal equipment. Tapaderos are prohibited. There shall be no discrimination against any standard Western bit. (See B5084.2 for definition and other bit information.) (B5803 B5804)
- d. For **Sport Horse Under Saddle** a **dressage-type snaffle bridle with snaffle bit**, or **hunter-type snaffle or Pelham bridle** is acceptable. A **dressage-type double bridle is permitted when using a dressage saddle**. Converters on Pelham bridle are not permitted and two reins are required. Snaffles may be with or without cheeks, keepers allowed. Unconventional bits may be penalized at the discretion of the judge. Cavesson nosebands are preferred, but flash nosebands are acceptable with a dressage snaffle bridle with snaffle bit. Martingales are not permitted. A **dressage, forward seat or English all-purpose saddle** is to be used. (B6609)
- 13. Rider's attire should be suitable to the saddle being ridden (EC Rule B5208.1).
 - a. Riders in **Western** tack (B5803.1) must wear suitable western hat, a long-sleeved shirt with any type of collar; a necktie, kerchief, bolo tie or pin; trousers or pants (a one piece equitation suit acceptable provided it has a collar) and boots. Riders must wear chaps, shotgun chaps or chinks. A vest, jacket, coat, and/or sweater may also be worn. Spurs are optional. Approved protective headgear with harness is optional in all classes; not required to be of Western style.
 - b. For **English Pleasure** (B5602.2), **Classic Pleasure** (B5702.2) and **Park Saddle** (B5502.2) informal attire is a saddle suit or day coat with contrasting jodhpurs, vest, boots and appropriate derby, soft hat or approved protective headgear. Formal attire is worn only after 6:00 PM and consists of a tuxedo style saddle suit, formal shirt with appropriate tie, vest or cummerbund, and boots. Gloves are optional for informal and formal attire.
 - c. **Hunter Pleasure** (B5903) Informal attire should include traditional hunter-style jacket, breeches or hunter jodhpurs, dark hunting cap, derby or approved protective headgear, and appropriate boots. A stock choker or four-in-hand tie with any color shirt is correct. Formal attire consists of a hunter shadbelly with buff or canary breeches, stock tie, canary vest, top hat and hunt boots. Formal attire is optional for female competitors after 6:00 PM or in Championship classes. Gloves, hunter crop or bat, spurs and appointments are optional. It is not mandatory for junior competitors to wear approved protective headgear harness.
 - d. For Sport Horse Under Saddle (B6610) attire will be either dressage or hunter. Dressage attire will be defined as

white or light colored breeches, short riding coat of conservative color, with tie, choker or stock tie, boots, a hunt cap, derby, top hat or protective headgear. Hunter attire will be defined as light colored breeches, short riding coat of conservative color, with tie or choker, boots or smooth leather half-chaps and hunt cap or protective headgear. It's recommended that attire reflect the appointments on the horse. Gloves of conservative color are optional for either style. Spurs and whip are optional. If a whip is used, it must conform to the style of attire used.
