SAFETY, INCLUSIVITY, & EXCELLENCE

Your guide to the latest updates for the competition season in Canada

IMPORTANT CHANGES have been implemented to enhance the safety and inclusivity of equestrian sport. Whether you're an athlete, parent, coach, official, or competition staff, your role is crucial in upholding these standards. Here's what you need to know:

SAFE SPORT TRAINING PREREQUISITE:

 The two free EC Safe Sport training modules must be completed before purchasing a Sport Licence. Check your training status on MyEC by clicking on the ECampus button.

DISCONTINUED TEMPORARY LICENCES AND TEMPORARY HORSE REGISTRATIONS:

 Temporary EC Sport Licences are now discontinued at competitions. All riders, owners, and coaches must possess an EC Sport Licence to participate in events. All horses must have a Horse Recording where level and division require.

AVAILABLE SHOW LEVEL UPGRADES:

 Explore higher-level competitions with temporary upgrades via your MyEC Portal. Note: National Rankings Points are not tabulated for upgraded results.

COACH STATUS REQUIREMENTS:

- All coaches at EC-sanctioned events require EC Licensed Coach Status. For upgrading from Registered to Licensed Status, coaches can apply for a Temporary Coach Status (TCS) to fulfill the requirement for each event.
- New for 2025: A TCS may be purchased conveniently online via the MyEC Portal only. Each TCS is valid for a single event.

EMPOWERING SELF-COACHED ATHLETES:

 Athletes without a coach on-site can declare themselves as self-coached by providing their name and EC Sport Licence number on their entry form. Coaches that are not present at the event with the athlete are not to be listed on the entry form.



When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries, must be in good-standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments. 77

STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES

Statement of Principles – EC is committed to:

- a) upholding the welfare of the horse, regardless of monetary value, as a primary consideration in all activities.
- b) requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect, and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to maltreatment.
- c) ensuring that owners, trainers, and exhibitors and their agents exercise appropriate care and responsibility in the handling, treatment, and transportation of their horses, as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose.
- d) providing for the continuous wellbeing of the horse by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, and safety.
- e) continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare.
- f) requiring owners, trainers, and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions; and,
- g) reviewing, revising, and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

SHOW RULES

Administration:

- 1) All entry forms are due no later than three (3) days prior to the show as entries may need to be limited in some classes for safety and management purposes.
- 2) Any late entries received after 3 days prior to the show date will be charged an additional administration fee of \$40.00 per horse.
- 3) Drop off, mail show forms to: Carmaz Stables, 45933 Homestead Rd, River Glade, NB E4Z 6J4
- 4) Make all cheques payable to "Shawna Rinzler-Johnston".
- 5) Emailed entries are accepted with e-transfer payment. Email carmazstables@mail.com
 password: showcase
- 6) Entry will only be accepted when payment, all required information, and all forms signed are received. Entry form must be accompanied by copies of bronze sport license, PSO membership, and proof of vaccinations (Flu, Rhino, Tetanus, Strangles). No postdated cheques accepted. NSF cheques will be charged a \$50 administration fee.
- 7) All entries must be made in writing (Article A801.4). The show numbers will not be issued if all the required signatures are not complete.
- 8) As per Equestrian Canada rule article A805, the Show Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry, except as provided in 805.2 (a,b,c,d,e).
- 9) All hunter classes to be paid on a class or division basis.
- 10) Post entries will be accepted up to one hour prior to the class and will be subject to an additional \$10 charge per class.

- 11) Each horse/rider combination may complete one schooling round at the height of their first division. Cost of a schooling round is \$15 on the entry form or \$20 cash in hand at the gate.
- 12) Scratches will not be reimbursed.
- 13) Official protests must be made in writing to the secretary of the competition, signed and accompanied by a \$110.00 cash deposit within 48 hours of completion of the class, Equestrian Canada Article A1204.
- 14) Ribbons will be awarded from 1st to 6th place. Champion and Reserve Champion will be awarded in each over fences division. If there is a tie for Champion or Reserve the horse that places higher in the over fences portion of the division will be determined as the winner.
- 15) An award will be given to each the high point junior horse/rider combination, the high point senior horse/rider combination, and the high point pony/rider combination who has amassed the highest amount of point during the hack portion of the competition (Classes 21-23, 25-27, 29, 32-34). Points for placings in individual classes are awarded as follows:

- 16) The competition organizing committee must provide every entry with a competition number that must be always worn and visible anywhere out of the stable, whether the horse is being hand walked or ridden. G Annex 1.1.2.
- 17) Entries in height-restricted classes in competitions where Horse Recordings are required must have the information recorded in the Horse Recording or a temporary measurement card available prior to the start of the class or the entry will not be allowed to compete. See G111 Pony Measurement. All foreign ponies must have an EC pony measurement card. If you have a pony which needs to be measured, contact competition management before the day of the competition to arrange a time.
- 18) The Show Committee reserves the right to measure any pony or horse entered in the show.
- 19) Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of Equestrian Canada and will be held and judged in accordance with the Equestrian Canada Rule Book. Any incident requiring a ruling which cannot be referenced to the EC Rule Book, will be rendered by the Show Committee.
- 20) If less than four entries are received for any class, the show committee reserves the right to cancel or combine classes.
- 21) Entry forms must be signed by the exhibitor, owner, and person responsible. If the owner or exhibitor is under 19 years of age as of January 1st of the current year, the entry must be signed by a parent or legal guardian who assumes all responsibility and risk as stated on the form and by these rules and regulations. The entry form for all sanctioned competitions shall also be signed by the person responsible for the care, training, custody, and performance of the horse. The person responsible may be the trainer, owner, rider, agent, or coach. The parent or

guardian must sign the entry form if there is no other person responsible. The person responsible is to be present at the competition and if they cannot attend, must appoint a representative who is present on the show grounds and must notify the competition secretary. Article A1011-The person responsible who signs an entry form must hold an EC or USEF individual sport license except parent/guardian. Foreign entries must sign an affidavit (Article A213).

- 22) Management has the right to expel any rider, owner or spectator deemed to be in their sole discretion disruptive to the show at any time.
- 23) Absolutely NO outside dogs will be permitted on the Carmaz Stables grounds at any point during the show day, please pass this information on to any spectators joining your party.
- 24) Absolutely NO smoking permitted on show grounds.
- 25) The show office will open one (1) hour prior to the start of the show and close 1/2 hour at the end of the show.
- 26) Horse Recordings: EC Horse Recordings and jump levy are not required for Bronze level.
- 27) Memberships: All Bronze level competitors are required to have the following memberships: NBEA or PTSO and EC Bronze sport license. Owners of a horse competing at the Bronze level must have the following memberships: NBEA or PTSO and Equestrian Canada Bronze sport license. The Person Responsible (see details -above) Proof of the Rider, Owner and Person Responsible memberships (photocopies) must be included with the entry form; otherwise, entry will be subjected to an incomplete entry fee. Temporary EC Gold Sport Licenses may be purchased through the competition office. Also, those holding a Bronze EC sport license may purchase an upgrade. Competitors in classes restricted by age and/or amateur status must be able to provide proof of eligibility. Amateur status is issued by EC. An eligible Temporary Sport License holder may compete in amateur classes provided an Amateur Affidavit has been completed and is on file with the competition Secretary.

Services Offered

- 1) A limited number of Box Stalls are available at a cost of \$40.00 per stall per night, bagged shavings available for \$10.00 per bag. Stalls are to be cleaned out at the end of the show. Priority will be given to exhibitors traveling from outside of the Moncton area. Limited number of stalls available offsite. Stalls are to be requested by contacting Carmaz Stables prior to submitting the entry form and will be confirmed by email. If you require a stall, send request by email to carmazstables@mail.com.
- 2) Warm up area will be available on the show grounds.
- 3) Carmaz Stables main ring is 225' x 125'.
- 4) There will not be a canteen provided on show day.

Directions:

To get to Carmaz Stables from Nova Scotia travel west on Trans-Canada Route 2 take exit 433 in Salisbury and turn right onto Route 112. At the next intersection take a left-hand turn onto Homestead Rd. Continue on Homestead Rd. for approximately 6 km and Carmaz Stables will be located on your right.

To get to Carmaz Stables from <u>Saint John</u> travel East on Route 1 and take exit 239 at River Glade. Turn right onto route 106 in 3.5 kms continue straight onto the Homestead Road and in another 1.9 kms Carmaz stables will be on the left.

To get to Carmaz Stables from <u>Fredericton</u> travel East on Trans-Canada Route 2, take exit 423 to merge onto NB Route 1 West towards Saint John, in less than one kms take exit 239 at River Glade. Turn right onto route 106 in 3.5 kms continue straight onto the Homestead Road and in another 1.9 kms Carmaz stables will be on the left.

Exhibitor Requirements

- 1) Equestrian Canada Bronze Sport License and NBEA membership are required to compete in Bronze classes.
- 2) Exhibitors are to send a photocopy of the rider's Equestrian Canada and owner's Equestrian Canada number as well as PSO membership with the entry form.
- 3) Bronze memberships may be purchased online at www.equestrian.ca. Your receipt will be proof of membership. Temporary one-day memberships are no longer available.
- 4) Any horse, in any class at a competition, may, while on the competition grounds, be selected for equine medication control testing. (Article A1006) Medication testing fees are \$4.00 per horse for bronze and \$8.00 for gold division of the show.
- 5) All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations."
- 6) Non-showing horses: All horses brought on the property during the competition must have a signed entry form and owners/riders must have a current PSO membership. Anyone riding noncompeting horses which have been brought on to the show grounds must wear a number issued by the office.
- 7) Horse Recordings are not required for the bronze division of the show.
- 8) As per Equestrian Canada rule article A805, the Show Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry, except as provided in A805.2 (a, b, c, d, e).

Cancellations received prior to 72 hours before the beginning of the show will be refunded all fees except for the \$40 administration fee. After this date there will not be any refunds unless a medical or veterinarian certificate is received within 48 hours of the commencement of the show. In this case, fees will be refunded less a \$40 administration fee.

- 9) All riders, grooms, attendants, and handlers must be neatly dressed on entering the ring. ARTICLE G109 DRESS. Dress code for jumpers G109 polo shirts are acceptable attire in the jumper ring.
- 10) When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries must be in good standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General G102 Safe Sport Environment

SAFETY RULES:

1) ARTICLE G102 HEADGEAR

- a. At all EC-sanctioned competitions, all competitors, including foreign competitors in EC National classes, must wear approved helmets, with safety harness correctly fastened, always while mounted on the competition grounds.
- b. Juniors showing any horse in a jog for soundness must wear approved protective headwear with the attached safety harness fastened.
- c. Failure to comply with G102.1 in the exercise area and/or the competition arena will result in the following penalties:
 - i. 1st violation at competition: warning.
 - ii. 2nd violation at same competition: disqualification from the competition and forfeiture of all fees and prize monies.
- d. EC makes no representation or warranty expressed or implied about any protective headgear and cautions riders that serious injury or death may result despite wearing such headgear as all equestrian sports involve inherent dangerous risk and adds no protective helmet can protect against all foreseeable injuries.
- e. All violations which occur outside the competition arena will be reported to the judge/jury who will levy the applicable penalty.
- f. All violations which occur in the competition arena will be acted upon by the judge(s) who will levy the applicable penalty.
- g. For all competitors, if the harness comes undone or the hat falls off, the rider must retrieve and/or do up the hat, with assistance, if necessary, before the next obstacle is taken. There will be no penalty other than the loss of time. Failure to do up the harness or retrieve protective headgear immediately results in elimination.
- 2) The show committee does not accept responsibility for accidents or illness to horses, riders, grooms, spectators, or any other persons.
- 3) Exhibitors competing for provincial points are requested to enter the animal in the name of the member of the family who is the official Equestrian Canada member.
- 4) ARTICLE G101 EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES
 - It is mandatory that all national and provincial competitions have on site emergency medical services with a minimum of advanced first aid and basic cardiac life support (BCLS). Jumping in competition and warm-up areas should be suspended if the sole medic onsite is handling an emergency, she/he cannot leave.
- 5) ARTICLE G103 FALLS

After being eliminated for a fall, the rider may not remount in the ring. Any rider who does remount in the ring after a fall will be eliminated from all classes in that ring for the remainder of the day. A rider who remounts after a fall and takes another obstacle will be disqualified from the remainder of the show. In the case of a fall of an Athlete anywhere within the grounds of the event during the hours of competition operation, the Athlete must be checked by the Competition's medical service before the Athlete may continue to compete in the next round or Competition. The competitor is solely responsible for ensuring the onsite medical assessment takes place. This rule is applicable to all competitors (including foreign) at EC sanctioned events and applies to falls/accidents that occur at the event location.

6) ARTICLE G104 IN-GATE

In all classes, trotting or cantering through the in-gate without prior permission is forbidden. The penalty for contravening this rule is either a fine or elimination from the class, at the discretion of the judge. Under special circumstances, a steward or judge may give permission for a horse to trot into the ring, but not out of the ring.

7) ARTICLE G105 STALLIONS

Manageable stallions may be ridden by seniors only.

- 8) Cell phones, iPods, etc. are not recommended to be used while riding. See ARTICLE G114 COMMUNICATION and use of earbuds.
- 9) Any horse that becomes out of control shall be eliminated from the competition at the discretion of the Judge and Steward. A1307.8 A judge must order from the ring any unruly or unsafe horse and/or rider or driver or anyone whose actions threaten to endanger other competitors, their entries, or the public. A1311.2.d Stewards PREVENT problems by: Barring unmanageable horses or ponies from the schooling rings.
- 10) Lunging will not be permitted in the warm-up ring if there is more than one rider in the ring.
- 11) Schooling Rules: reference Hunter/Jumper schooling rules see Annex 1 page 107 Section G rule book. FEI schooling rules will be in force.
- 12) Hors Concours entries and substitutions not allowed at this competition.

Per Article A801, every entry at an EC sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition.

New Brunswick Bronze competitors require NBEA membership. Bronze Membership may be purchased from Equestrian Canada (www.equestrian.ca) – printed receipt will be accepted for proof of Equestrian Canada membership. EC Horse Recordings and Jump Canada Levy are not required for Bronze classes, but are for the Gold classes

See Equestrian Canada jumper rules. Junior, amateur riders may not compete in draw reins. Section G Annex 1 # 4.2b pg 109. A horse/rider combination is permitted unlimited upward movement through divisions, but downward movement is restricted to only one level. These movements are based on the level of the first class in which they competed. G603 and G604.

Class Descriptions

<u>Hunter Divisions</u>: G201, G202 Miscellaneous, not rated for EC awards. Open to seniors riding horses or large ponies and juniors on horse or pony. A pony shown by an adult must not be shown by a junior at the same competition. Juniors of any age may show any height of pony in misc, not point classes. Article G306 2&3. Distances will not be adjusted for ponies. All courses will be set on a 12 foot stride. To maintain awards, horses must compete and complete the course in at least one over fences class in their respective division, Article G318.1.

<u>Cross rail Division (Fee: \$50/Division or \$17/class):</u> Classes 1, 2 & 3. Shown at a trot of canter over 7-8 cross rails no higher than 18" (0.46m) at center. Emphasis will be placed on a) horses ridden in a safe and controlled manner b) a correct and effective path to and away from the fences c) jumping style.

<u>Intro Division (Fee: \$50/Division or \$17/class)</u>: Classes 4, 5 & 6. Shown at a trot or canter over 7-8 verticals or oxers no higher than 22" (0.55m). Emphasis will be placed on a) horses ridden in a safe and controlled manner b) a correct and effective path to and away from the fences c) jumping style.

<u>Pre-Beginner Division (Fee: \$50/Division or \$17/class)</u>: Classes 7, 8 & 9. Shown at a trot or canter over 7-8 low verticals or oxers no higher than 2'3" (0.70m) Emphasis will be placed on a) horses ridden in a safe and controlled manner b) a correct and effective path to and away from the fences c) jumping style

Beginner Division (Fee: \$50/Division or \$17/class): Classes 10, 11 & 12. Shown at a canter over 8-10 fences. Verticals and Oxers with a max height of 2'6" 0.75m. To be judged on obedience, form, and general way of going.

<u>Heritage Low Division (Fee: \$50/Division or \$17/class)</u>: Classes 13, 14 & 15 Shown at a canter over 8-10 fences. Max height 2'9" 0.85m. To be judged on obedience, form and general way of going.

<u>Carmaz Classic (Fee \$40):</u> Class 16. Shown at a canter over 8-12 fences. May include combinations, broken lines and roll backs. Max height 2'6". This class has a payout of \$310 total, which will be distributed the day of the competition. 1st -\$90, 2nd - \$70, 3rd - \$60, 4th - \$50, 5th - \$40.

<u>3-Year-Old Canadian Bred (Fee: \$17):</u> Class 17. Line class, they must be shown in a bridle. Must provide a copy of papers. Open only to horses, no ponies. Miscellaneous not rated for EC awards.

Sportpony Starsearch (Fee: \$17/Class): Classes 18,19,20,21, 32 & 33. Info about classes and

qualifications can be found at sportponystarsearch.wordpress.com. Jr and Sr Champion and reserve classes do not have an additional fee for those who qualify. 1st place in each class qualifies for the RAWF.

<u>Leadline (Fee: \$10)</u>: Class 22 for children under 12. Class fee \$10 Miscellaneous, not rated for EC awards Children in Leadline are not required to have an EC Sport License. The owners of horses competing only in this class are not required to have an EC Sport License. The handler for this Leadline rider must be an adult who has a PTSO membership and is appropriately dressed for the class. The minimum age for the rider in Leadline at this competition is four years old.

Equitation Classes (Fee: \$17/Class) – Flat: Classes 23, 24, 25 & 26. Juniors may show ponies G1001-G1009. Riders to be judged on equitation. Ages for equitation classes G1006.2 a, b, c, d. Individuals are juniors until the end of the calendar year in which they turn 18.

Junior A – a rider who is 15, 16, 17 on Jan 1st of current year.

Junior B – a rider who is 12, 13, 14 on Jan 1st of current year.

Junior C – a rider who is under 12 on Jan 1st of current year.

Senior – a rider who is over the age of 18 on January 1^{st} of the current year who are not earning remunerations from teaching or training in the horse industry.

<u>Hack Division (Fee: \$17/Class)</u>: No breastplates, whips, martingales, flash or drop nosebands, boots, or bandages of any kind. No saddle suits, no Kentucky jodhpurs, and no saddle seat tack. EC G chapter 12-13. Hack division price \$50 for the 2 regular classes and the equitation where you fit.

<u>Pleasure & Road Hack (Fee: \$17/Class)</u>: Open to all juniors and seniors riding horses. Ponies to enter Pony classes.

Classes 33 & 39 G1201, G1204, G1205

<u>Pleasure</u> classes 28, 29, 31: Shown at a flat-footed walk, normal trot, easy canter; not to gallop, light contact with the horse's mouth; judged on manners, performance, quality and conformation G1304.

<u>Road hack</u> classes 34, 35, 36: To be shown at a flat-footed walk with a reasonably loose rein, trot, strong trot, easy canter, and hand gallop. Only 8 horses to hand gallop at one time. Judged on performance, substance, conformation and manners."G1302

<u>Walk/Trot Division (Fee: \$17/class)</u> 26 & 30 - 12 yrs and under. Miscellaneous, not rated for EC awards. Riders who enter these classes may not cross enter, at the same competition, into classes which require the rider to canter or ride over fences.

Equitation will proceed at least once around the ring at each gait – walk and trot. Reverse and repeat. The judge may ask questions about tack and horsemanship suitable to the ability and age of the riders. Pleasure will be shown at a flat-footed walk and normal trot. To be judged on 45% performance, 40% manners and 15% conformation.
