EC SPORT LICENSING 2025

SAFETY, INCLUSIVITY, & EXCELLENCE

Your guide to the latest updates for the competition season in Canada

IMPORTANT CHANGES have been implemented to enhance the safety and inclusivity of equestrian sport. Whether you're an athlete, parent, coach, official, or competition staff, your role is crucial in upholding these standards. Here's what you need to know:

SAFE SPORT TRAINING PREREQUISITE:

- The two free EC Safe Sport training modules must be completed before purchasing a Sport Licence. Check your training status on MyEC by clicking on the ECampus button.

DISCONTINUED TEMPORARY LICENCES AND TEMPORARY HORSE REGISTRATIONS:

- Temporary EC Sport Licences are now discontinued at competitions. All riders, owners, and coaches must possess an EC Sport Licence to participate in events. All horses must have a Horse Recording where level and division require.

AVAILABLE SHOW LEVEL UPGRADES:

- Explore higher-level competitions with temporary upgrades via your MyEC Portal. Note: National Rankings Points are not tabulated for upgraded results.

COACH STATUS REQUIREMENTS:

- All coaches at EC-sanctioned events require EC Licensed Coach Status. For upgrading from Registered to Licensed Status, coaches can apply for a Temporary Coach Status (TCS) to fulfill the requirement for each event.
- New for 2025: A TCS may be purchased conveniently online via the MyEC Portal only. Each TCS is valid for a single event.

EMPOWERING SELF-COACHED ATHLETES:

- Athletes without a coach on-site can declare themselves as self-coached by providing their name and EC Sport Licence number on their entry form. Coaches that are not present at the event with the athlete are not to be listed on the entry form.

“When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries, must be in good-standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments.”

STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES

Statement of Principles – EC is committed to:

- a) upholding the welfare of the horse, regardless of monetary value, as a primary consideration in all activities.
- b) requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect, and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to maltreatment.
- c) ensuring that owners, trainers, and exhibitors and their agents exercise appropriate care and responsibility in the handling, treatment, and transportation of their horses, as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose.
- d) providing for the continuous wellbeing of the horse by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, and safety.
- e) continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare.
- f) requiring owners, trainers, and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions; and,
- g) reviewing, revising, and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

SHOW RULES

Administration:

- 1) All entry forms are due no later than five (5) days prior to the show as entries may need to be limited in some classes for safety and management purposes.
- 2) Any late entries received after 5 days prior to the show date will be charged an additional administration fee of \$35.00 per horse.
- 3) All information must be completed and all forms signed and accompanied by payment for entry to be accepted.
- 4) Drop off, mail show forms to: Jump YQM, 46740 Homestead Rd, Steeves Mountain, NB E1G 4N9
- 5) Make all cheques payable to "Jump YQM"
- 6) Emailed entries are accepted with e-transfer payment. Email jumpyqm@gmail.com password: jumpqym
- 7) All cheques or e-transfers must accompany the entry form.
- 8) **Entry will only be accepted when payment, all required information, and all forms signed are received. Entry form must be accompanied by copies of Bronze sport license, PSO**

membership, proof of negative Coggins test within 365 days of competition date, and proof of vaccinations (Flu, Rhino, Tetanus, Strangles) within 6 months before arrival at the event.

- 9) No postdated cheques accepted. NSF cheques will be charged a \$50 administration fee.
- 10) No entry will be accepted by telephone.
- 11) All entries must be made in writing or through online entry system (Article A801.4) and paid in full. The show numbers will not be issued if all the required signatures are not complete.
- 12) As per Equestrian Canada rule article A805, the Show Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry, except as provided in 805.2 (a,b,c,d,e).
- 13) For competitors competing in the Bronze Classes Administration Fee and drug fee will be charges (\$50 administration and \$4.00 for Bronze Drug Fee)
- 14) All hunter classes to be paid on a division basis.
- 15) All jumper classes are to be paid on a class basis
- 16) Post entries will be accepted up to one hour prior to the class and will be subject to an additional \$10 charge per class.
- 17) Scratches will not be reimbursed.
- 18) Official protests must be made in writing to the secretary of the competition, signed and accompanied by a \$100.00 cash deposit within 48 hours of completion of the class, Equestrian Canada Article A1204.
- 19) Ribbons will be awarded from 1st to 6th place. Champion and Reserve Champion will be awarded in each over fences division. If there is a tie for Hunter Champion or Reserve the horse that places higher in the over fences portion of the division will be determined as the winner (Article G505). If there is a tie for Jumper Champion or Reserve, the horse that places higher in the last class of the division will be champion (G505).
- 20) An award will be given to each of the high point junior horse or pony/rider combination, the high point senior horse or pony/rider combination who have accumulated the most points in any class during the show. Points for placings in individual classes are awarded as follows:

1 st	7
2 nd	5
3 rd	4
4 th	3

5 th	2
6 th	1

- 21) An award will be given for each the best Sportsmanship and best Horsemanship, this selection will be at the discretion of the judge and the show committee.
- 22) Equestrian Canada Rule A814: Competition numbers must be worn and visible at all times in show ring and in exercise areas.
- 23) Entries in height-restricted classes in competitions where Horse Recordings are required must have the information recorded in the Horse Recording or a temporary measurement card available prior to the start of the class or the entry will not be allowed to compete. See G111 Pony Measurement. All foreign ponies must have an EC pony measurement card. If you have a pony which needs to be measured, contact competition management before the day of the competition to arrange a time.
- 24) The Show Committee reserves the right to measure any pony or horse entering the show.
- 25) Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of Equestrian Canada and will be held and judged in accordance with the Equestrian Canada Rule Book. Any incident requiring a ruling which cannot be referenced to the EC Rule Book, will be rendered by the Show Committee.
- 26) If less than four entries are received for any class, the show committee reserves the right to cancel or combine classes.
- 27) Entry forms must be signed by the exhibitor, owner, and person responsible (Article A802). If the owner or exhibitor is under 19 years of age as of January 1st of the current year, the entry must be signed by a parent or legal guardian who assumes all responsibility and risk as stated on the form and by these rules and regulations. Parents and guardians are entitled to sign their children's entry forms without being EC members or holders of a Sport License. The entry form for all sanctioned competitions shall also be signed by the person responsible for the care, training, custody, and performance of the horse. The person responsible may be the trainer, owner, rider, agent, or coach. The parent or guardian must sign the entry form if there is no other person responsible. The person responsible is to be present at the competition and if they cannot attend, must appoint a representative who is present on the show grounds and must notify the competition secretary. Article A1011-The person responsible who signs an entry form

must hold an EC or USEF individual sport license except parent/guardian. Foreign entries must sign an affidavit (Article A213).

- 28) Management has the right to expel any rider, owner or spectator deemed to be at their sole discretion disruptive to the show at any time.
- 29) Absolutely NO outside dogs will be permitted on the 51 Acres Equestrian center grounds at any point during the show day.
- 30) Absolutely NO smoking permitted on show grounds.
- 31) The show office will open one (1) hour prior to the start of the show and close 1/2 hour at the end of the show.
- 32) Horse Recordings: EC Horse Recordings and jump levy are not required for Bronze level.
- 33) Memberships: Equestrian Canada Bronze Sport License and NBEA membership are required to compete in Bronze classes. Riders from the USA must have the equivalent USEF membership or otherwise purchase a temporary Sport License. Equestrian Canada Bronze License is NOT required for exhibitors competing only in Lead Line. An EC Sport License is required for competitors, owners or lessees and individuals accepting legal responsibility for an entry in EC sanctioned competitions. A203 Bronze memberships may be purchased online at www.equestriancanada.ca . Your receipt will be proof of memberships. Temporary one-day memberships are no longer available.

Services Offered

- 1) A limited number of Box Stalls are available at a cost of \$40.00 per stall per night and \$20 for the day, exhibitors must supply their own bedding, feed, hay and water bucket. Stalls are to be cleaned out at the end of the show. Priority will be given to exhibitors traveling from outside of the Moncton area. Stalls are to be requested by contacting Jump YQM prior to submitting the entry form and will be confirmed by email. If you require a stall, send request by email to jumpyqm@gmail.com.
- 2) Warmup arena is 75'x140'
- 3) 51 Stables competition ring is 250' x 125'.
- 4) There will not be a canteen provided on show day.

Directions:

To get to 51 Acres Equestrian Center from Nova Scotia travel west on Trans-Canada Route 2 take exit 450 in Moncton towards NB-126. At lights turn left onto NB-126. Continue on NB 126 for approximately 3 kms. 51 Acres Equestrian Center will be on your right.

To get to 51 Acres Equestrian Center from Saint John or Fredericton travel East on Route 2 and take exit 446 at Berry Mills Rd. Turn left off ramp onto NB 128. Turn right onto the ramp to NB 128 E (Homestead Rd). After 2.5 kms 51 Acres Equestrian Center will be on your left.

Exhibitor Requirements

- 1) Equestrian Canada Bronze Sport License and NBEA membership are required to compete in Bronze classes.
- 2) Exhibitors are to send a photocopy of the rider's Equestrian Canada and owner's Equestrian Canada number as well as PSO membership with the entry form.
- 3) Bronze memberships may be purchased online at www.equestrian.ca. Your receipt will be proof of membership. Temporary one-day memberships are no longer available.
- 4) Any horse, in any class at a competition, may, while on the competition grounds, be selected for equine medication control testing. (Article A602.5) Medication testing fees are \$4.00 per horse for bronze
- 5) All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A602.8, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations."
- 6) Non-showing horses: All horses brought on the property during the competition must have a signed entry form and owners/riders must have current PSO membership. Anyone riding noncompeting horses which have been brought on to the show grounds must wear a number issued by the office.
- 7) Horse Recordings are not required for the bronze division of the show.
- 8) As per Equestrian Canada rule article A805.2, the Show Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry, except as provided in A805.4
- 9) Cancellations received prior to 72 hours before the beginning of the show will be refunded all fees except for the \$50 administration fee. After this date there will not be any refunds unless a medical or veterinarian certificate is received within 48 hours of the commencement of the show. In this case, fees will be refunded less a \$50 administration fee. No refunds of any kind will be issued within 48 hours of the show start time.
- 10) All riders, grooms, attendants, and handlers must be neatly dressed on entering the ring. ARTICLE G109 DRESS. Dress code for jumpers G109 – polo shirts are acceptable attire in the jumper ring.
- 11) When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries must be in good standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General A102 Safe Sport Environment

SAFETY RULES:

1) ARTICLE G102 HEADGEAR

- a. At all EC-sanctioned competitions, all competitors, including foreign competitors in EC National classes, must wear approved helmets, with safety harness correctly fastened, always while mounted on the competition grounds.
- b. Juniors showing any horse in a jog for soundness must wear approved protective headwear with the attached safety harness fastened.
- c. Failure to comply with G102.1 in the exercise area and/or the competition arena will result in the following penalties:
 - i. 1st violation at competition: warning.
 - ii. 2nd violation at same competition: disqualification from the competition and forfeiture of all fees and prize monies.
- d. EC makes no representation or warranty expressed or implied about any protective headgear and cautions riders that serious injury or death may result despite wearing such headgear as all equestrian sports involve inherent dangerous risk and adds no protective helmet can protect against all foreseeable injuries.
- e. All violations which occur outside the competition arena will be reported to the judge/jury who will levy the applicable penalty.
- f. All violations which occur in the competition arena will be acted upon by the judge who will levy the applicable penalty.
- g. For all competitors, if the harness comes undone or the hat falls off, the rider must retrieve and/or do up the hat, with assistance, if necessary, before the next obstacle is taken. There will be no penalty other than the loss of time. Failure to do up the harness or retrieve protective headgear immediately results in elimination.

2) The show committee does not accept responsibility for accidents or illnesses to horses, riders, grooms, spectators, or any other persons.

3) Exhibitors competing for provincial points are requested to enter the animal in the name of the member of the family who is the official Equestrian Canada member.

4) Article A808 and G501 HORS CONCOURS: "Hors Concours" entries will not be accepted in the EC Jumper Divisions. "Hors Concours" entries are not allowed in the EC Hunter Division. G201.3

5) ARTICLE G101 EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES

It is mandatory that all national and provincial competitions have on site emergency medical services with a minimum of advanced first aid and basic cardiac life support (BCLS). Jumping in competition and warm-up areas should be suspended if the sole medic onsite is handling an emergency, she/he cannot leave.

6) ARTICLE G103 FALLS

After being eliminated for a fall, the rider may not remount in the ring. Any rider who does remount in the ring after a fall will be eliminated from all classes in that ring for the remainder of the day. A rider who remounts after a fall and takes another obstacle will be disqualified from the remainder of the show. In the case of a fall of an Athlete anywhere within the grounds of the event during the hours of competition operation, the Athlete must be checked by the Competition's medical service before the Athlete may continue to compete in the next round or Competition. The competitor is solely responsible for ensuring the onsite medical assessment takes place. This rule is applicable to all competitors (including foreign) at EC sanctioned events and applies to falls/accidents that occur at the event location.

7) ARTICLE G104 IN-GATE

In all classes, trotting or cantering through the in-gate without prior permission is forbidden. The penalty for contravening this rule is either a fine or elimination from the class, at the discretion of the judge. Under special circumstances, a steward or judge may give permission for a horse to trot into the ring, but not out of the ring.

8) ARTICLE G105 STALLIONS

Manageable stallions may be ridden by seniors only.

9) Cell phones, iPods, etc. are not recommended to be used while riding. See ARTICLE G114 COMMUNICATION and use of earbuds.

10) Any horse that becomes out of control shall be eliminated from the competition at the discretion of the Judge and Steward. A1307.8 A judge must order from the ring any unruly or unsafe horse and/or rider or driver or anyone whose actions threaten to endanger other competitors, their entries, or the public. A1311.2.d Stewards PREVENT problems by: Barring unmanageable horses or ponies from the schooling rings.

11) Lunging will not be permitted in the warm-up ring if there is more than one rider in the ring.

12) Schooling Rules: reference Hunter/Jumper schooling rules see Annex 1 page 105 Section G rule book. FEI schooling rules will be in force.

13) Hors Concours entries and substitutions not allowed at this competition.

Per Article A801, every entry at an EC sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to being bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition.

New Brunswick Bronze competitors require NBEA membership. Bronze Membership may be purchased from Equestrian Canada (www.equestrian.ca) – printed receipt will be accepted for proof of Equestrian Canada membership. EC Horse Recordings and Jump Canada Levy are not required for Bronze classes, but are for the Gold classes

See Equestrian Canada jumper rules. Junior, amateur riders may not compete in draw reins. Section G Annex 1 # 4.2b pg 106. A horse/rider combination permits unlimited upward movement through divisions, but downward movement is restricted to only one level. These movements are based on the level of the first class in which they competed. G603 and G604.

Horses may only enter a maximum of 2 consecutive Hunter divisions.

Class Descriptions

Hunter Divisions: G201, G202 Miscellaneous, not rated for EC awards. Open to seniors riding horses or large ponies and juniors on horses or ponies. A pony shown by an adult must not be shown by a junior at the same competition. Juniors of any age may show any height of pony in misc, non-point classes. Article G306 2&3. Distances will not be adjusted for ponies. To maintain awards, horses must compete and complete the course in at least one over fences class in their respective division, Article G318.1.

INTRO HUNTER: (22") 0.55m - Miscellaneous, not rated for Equestrian Canada Awards.

Entry Fee: \$60 for division (2 over fences and 1 under saddle)

Prize: Ribbons Only

1)Intro Hunter #1 – (Over fences: A simple hunter course of at least 8 fences with no combinations. Emphasis of judging on manners, obedience and style. Trotting to fences will not be penalized. Distances not to be adjusted for horses and ponies. Maximum height and width to be 22" (0.55m). Fences may be low verticals or oxers. Majority of fence to be 18" (0.45m). Open to seniors riding horses or large ponies and juniors riding horses or ponies of any height. G306.2 & 3.

2)Intro Hunter #2

3)Intro Hunter Under Saddle – (To be shown at walk, trot and canter, both ways of the ring. No more than eight to hand-gallop at one time. To maintain awards, horses must compete and complete the course in at least one over fences class in their respective division, Article G318.1.

Entries in this division are limited to the Intro and Beginner Hunter Divisions. A pony shown in judged classes by an adult may not be shown by a Junior in a judged class at the same competition.

PRE-BEGINNER HUNTER: (2'3") 0.70m – Miscellaneous, not rated for EC Awards

Entry Fee: \$60 for division (2 over fences and 1 under saddle)

Prize: Ribbons Only

4) Pre-Beginner Hunter #1

To complete a hunter-type jumping course of at least 8 obstacles not to exceed 2'3" (0.70m) in height. To be judged on obedience, jumping form and general way of going. The class is open to seniors riding horses or large ponies and juniors riding horses or ponies. The course may, but is not required, to be adjusted in height and distance for ponies. Juniors of any age may show any

height of pony in miscellaneous, non-point classes. G306.2&3. A pony shown in judged classes by an adult may not be shown by a junior in a judged class at the same competition

5) Pre-Beginner Hunter #2

6) Pre-Beginner Hunter Under Saddle: To be shown at walk, trot and canter, both ways of the ring. No more than eight horses will be asked to hand-gallop at one time. To maintain awards, horses must compete and complete the course in at least one over fences class in their respective division, Article G318.1.

BEGINNER HUNTER: (2'6") 0.75m Miscellaneous, not rated for Equestrian Canada Awards.

Entry Fee: \$60 for division (2 over fences and 1 under saddle)

Prize: Ribbons Only

7) Beginner Hunter #1 – (To complete a hunter-type jumping course of at least 8 obstacles not to exceed 2'6" (0.75m) in height. To be judged on obedience, jumping form and general way of going. Open to seniors riding horses or large ponies and juniors riding horses or ponies. The course may, but is not required, to be adjusted in height and distance for ponies.) Juniors of any age may show any height of pony in miscellaneous, non-point classes. G306.

8) Beginner Hunter #2

9) Beginner Hunter Under Saddle

HERITAGE LOW HUNTER: (2.9) 0.85m Miscellaneous, not rated for Equestrian Canada Awards.

Entry Fee: \$60 for division (2 over fences and 1 under saddle)

Prize: Ribbons Only

10) Heritage Low Hunter # 1: 0.85m

11) Heritage Low Hunter #2

12) Heritage Low Hunter Under Saddle 10

Miscellaneous, not rated for Equestrian Canada Awards. Open to horses or large ponies ridden by a Junior or Senior rider. Horses judged on obedience, jumping and general way of going. Distances will not be adjusted. Over fences: To complete a hunter-style jumping course of at least 8 obstacles not to exceed 2'9" (0.85m) in height. Miscellaneous, not rated for Equestrian Canada Awards. Under Saddle: To be shown at walk, trot and canter, both ways of the ring. For under saddle classes to count for awards, a horse must show and complete at least one over-fences class in the corresponding divisions.

Jump YQM Stake (Fee \$30): Class 13. Open to any rider who has competed in a pre-beginner, beginner hunter and the low hunter division at this show. Shown at height. Open numerical scoring, to be judged on performance, manners, soundness and way of going. This class has a payout of \$220 total, which will be distributed the day of the competition. 1st - \$75, 2nd - \$50, 3rd - \$45, 4th - \$30.

Jump YQM Medal (Fee \$20): Class 14. Open to any rider competing in this show at heights of 2'3", 2'6", 2'9" and 3'. Shown at a canter over 8-10 fences at the rider's respective height. To be judged as a hunt seat equitation medal class. Rider's must have entered at least one hunter division at the same show.

EQUITATION DIVISION

Equestrian Canada rule section G1001-1009

Entry Fee: \$20 per class

Prize: Ribbons only

Equitation classes are divided by age groups as follows: Individuals are juniors until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18. Article A901.

Routine on the flat: Article G1007. Riders will proceed at least once around the ring at each gait – walk, trot, sitting trot and canter, reverse and repeat. At the judge's discretion, they may be asked to execute an individual test.

15) Jr. "A" Hunter Seat (not to jump) Equestrian Canada

Riders are such from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16 until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18.

16) Jr. "B" Hunter Seat (not to jump) Equine Canada

Riders are such from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 13 until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 15.

17) Jr. "C" Hunter Seat (not to jump) Equestrian Canada.

Riders are such until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 12.

18) Senior Amateur Hunter Seat (not to jump) Equestrian Canada

Members will be classified as Senior from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 19.

ENGLISH HACK DIVISION

Entry Fee: \$20 per class

Prize: Ribbons Only

Equestrian Canada rules Section G Article G1301-G1304

Tack and personal appointments as per G1204 and G1205.

English Pleasure (E.C.) Article G1303

English Pleasure: To be shown at a flat-footed walk, normal trot and easy canter and not to gallop; light contact with the horse's mouth to be judged on 45% performance, 40% manners and 15% conformation.

Road Hack (E.C.) Article G1302

Road Hack: Horses to enter ring at a walk. To be shown at a flat-footed walk with a reasonably loose rein, trot, strong trot, easy canter and hand gallop. Only 8 horses to hand gallop at one time. To be judged on 55% performance, 20% substance, 15% conformation and 10% manners

If ridden by a junior, the heights of ponies and age of riders to be the same as in pony hunters.

Junior C riders will be judged and pinned separately from Junior A & B riders in Junior classes.

19)Pony English Pleasure E.C.

20)Pony Road Hack E.C.

21)Junior English Pleasure, E.C.
