Declaration and Qualification

	Athletes must declare for the National Championships at the time of their Sport License renewal for the season. Athletes can upgrade or add a declaration to their file by going back into their MyEC account.

	* Declaration fees collected go directly to the host organizer(s) to support the delivery of the Championships. Declaration fees collected from the East go directly to support the East event and declarations fees collected from the West go directly to support the West event.				
Qualification Period	January 1 st – September 1 st , 2025				



Minimum of two scores achieved at EC Gold or Platinum sanctioned competitions held in Canada. Where a panel exists the panel score will be used for qualification. Scores must be from two different competitions.

Qualification scores must be from the test with the highest degree of difficulty in the division i.e. First level test 3. A complete list of the tests used for qualification for each division can be found in the below chart
