The Foshay South competition July 26th is sanctioned Bronze/Gold. They are competition members of Equestrian Canada (EC), c/o House of Sport 2451 Riverside Drive Ottawa, ON Canada K1H 7X7 and are governed by the rules of EC. "Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book."

STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLE

Statement of Principles –EC is committed to:

- a) upholding the welfare of the horse, regardless of monetary value, as a primary consideration in all activities:
- b) requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect, and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to maltreatment;
- c) ensuring that owners, trainers, and exhibitors and their agents exercise appropriate care and responsibility in the handling, treatment, and transportation of their horses, as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose;
- d) providing for the continuous wellbeing of the horse by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, and safety;
- e) continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- f) requiring owners, trainers, and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions; and,
- g) reviewing, revising, and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

SHOW RULES

Administration:

- 1) All entry forms due no later than five (5) days prior to the show as entries may need to be limited in some classes for safety and management purposes.
- 2) Any late entries received after 5 days prior to the show date will be charged an additional administration fee of \$35.00 per horse.
- 3) All information must be completed and all forms signed for the entry to be accepted.
- 4) Drop off or mail show forms to: Foshay South Eventing 21 Gallagher Road Lakeside, NB E5N 7K2
- 5) Make all cheques payable to "Foshay South Eventing Inc".
- 6) All cheques must accompany entry form(s).
- 7) Scanned entries are accepted with e-transfer payment. Email suzannestevenson@nb.sympatico.ca autodeposit is turned on.
- 8) All payment must accompany entry form(s). As well as copies of Bronze or Gold sport license, NBEA membership, negative coggins (within 1 year) and proof of vaccinations (Flu, Rhino.Tetanus, Strangles). No post dated cheques accepted. NSF cheques will be charged \$50 administration fee.
- 9) All entries must be made in writing (Article A801.4). The show numbers will not be issued if all the required signatures are not complete.
- 10) Hunter Classes are paid by division only whether you enter one or all classes.
- 11) Jumper Classes are paid for on a class basis.
- 12) Post entries will be accepted up to one hour prior to the class and will be subject to an additional \$10 charge per class or division.
- 13) Scratches will not be reimbursed.
- 14) Official protests must be made in writing to the secretary of the competition, signed and accompanied by a \$110.00 cash deposit within 48 hours of completion of the class, Equestrian Canada Article A1204.
- 15) Ribbons 1st to 6th place. Championship prizes for all divisions.
- 16) Equestrian Canada Rule A814: Competition numbers must be worn and visible at all times in show ring and in exercise areas.

- 17) Entries in height-restricted classes in competitions where Horse Recordings are required must have the information recorded in the Horse Recording or a temporary measurement card available prior to the start of the class or the entry will not be allowed to compete. See G111 Pony Measurement. All foreign ponies must have an EC pony measurement card. If you have a pony which needs to be measured contact competition management before the day of competition to arrange a time.
- 18) Show Committee reserves the right to measure any pony or horse entered in the show.
- 19) Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of Equestrian Canada and will be held and judged in accordance with the Equestrian Canada Rule Book. Any incident requiring a ruling which cannot be referenced to the EC Rule Book, will be rendered by the Show Committee.
- 20) If less than four entries are received for any class, the show committee reserves the right to cancel or combine classes.
- 21) Entry forms must be signed by exhibitor, owner and person responsible. If the owner or exhibitor is under 19 years of age as of January first, the entry must be signed by a parent or legal guardian who assumes all responsibility and risk as stated on the form and by these rules and regulations. The entry form for all sanctioned competitions shall also be signed by the person responsible for the care, training, custody and performance of the horse. The person responsible may be the trainer, owner, rider, agent or coach. The parent or guardian must sign the entry form if there is no other person responsible. The person responsible is to be present at the competition and if they cannot attend, must appoint a representative who is present on the show grounds and must notify the competition secretary. Article A1011-The person responsible who signs an entry form must hold an EC or USEF individual sport license except parent/guardian. Foreign entries must sign an affidavit (Article A213).
- 22) Management has the right to expel any rider, owner or spectator deemed to be in their sole discretion disruptive to the show at any time.
- 23) Dogs must be leashed or caged while on the show grounds. The Owners are solely and expressly responsible for their dogs and the dog's behavior. Owners of loose dogs will be charged \$75.00 to retrieve their pets.
- 24) Absolutely "NO" smoking permitted on show grounds.
- 25) The show office will open one (1) hour prior to the start of the show and close 1/2 hour at the end of the show.
- 26) Horse Recordings: To compete at the Gold level, all Canadian entries are required to hold an EC Horse Recording and have paid the EC Horse Recording annual Activation Fee to compete. A temporary horse registration must be purchased through the competition office if there is no Horse recording. Foreign entries must sign an affidavit. Results achieved while competing with a temporary horse registration will not be used to qualify for Year End Awards or Championship. EC Horse Recordings and jump levy are not required for Bronze level.
- 27) Memberships: All Gold level competitors are required to have the following memberships: NBEA or PTSO, EC Gold sport license. Owners of a horse competing at the Gold level must have the following memberships: NBEA or PTSO, EC Gold sport license. All Bronze level competitors are required to have the following memberships: NBEA or PTSO and EC Bronze sport license. Owners of a horse competing at the Bronze level must have the following memberships: NBEA or PTSO and Equestrian Canada Bronze sport license. The Person Responsible (see details -above) Proof of the Rider, Owner and Person Responsible memberships (photocopies) must be included with the entry form; otherwise entry will be subjected to an incomplete entry fee.. Also those holding a Bronze EC sport license may purchase an upgrade. Competitors in classes restricted by age and/or amateur status must be able to provide proof of eligibility. Amateur status is issued by EC it must be completed and is on file with the competition Secretary.
- 28) Substitutions A horse/pony may compete with a substitute athlete providing the athlete is eligible to enter

the class and pays any substitution fee required by the show organizer. An athlete may compete with a substitute horse/pony providing the horse/pony is eligible to enter the class and the athlete pays any substitution fee required by the show organizer. The substitution fee required to substitute horse/pony or athlete is \$50 after the closing date. If the substitution is requested after the start of the competition the show committee reserves the right to refuse.

Services Offered

- 1) A limited number of Box Stalls are available at a cost of \$40.00 per stall per night, bagged shavings available for \$10.00 per bag. Stalls are to be cleaned out at the end of the show. First priority will be given to exhibitors traveling from outside the Saint John/Sussex area.
- 2) Hay is available at \$10.00 per bale.
- 3) Warm up area will be available on the show grounds.
- 4) Foshay South main ring is 235' x 155'.
- 5) There will not be a canteen on the grounds but food services are available in Hampton.
- 6) Warm up classes will be available for the start of the jumper division and at the beginning of each hunter division. Cost is 10\$ per round and tickets are available at the show office or at the in-gate. Management reserves the right to cancel warm-up rounds if number of entries limit time available.

Directions:

To get to Foshay South from Saint John take the Hampton exit and turn Right onto Hall Road. From Sussex turn Left onto Hall road. Follow Hall road for a few KMs and turn Right onto Kelly St where the junction has a bank of mailboxes. Go ½ km and turn Left onto Alison St. Go ¼ km and turn Right onto Gallagher Road. The farm is just ahead on the left 21 Gallagher Road.

Exhibitor Requirements

- Equestrian Canada Bronze Sport License and NBEA membership are required to compete in Bronze classes. Foreign entries must sign an affidavit (Article A404). Equestrian Canada Bronze License is NOT required for exhibitors competing only in Lead Line. Equestrian Canada Gold license is required to compete in the Gold classes.
- 2) Exhibitors are to send a photocopy of the rider's Equestrian Canada and owner's Equestrian Canada number as well as NBEA membership with the entry form.
- 3) Bronze memberships may be purchased online at www.equestrian.ca. Your receipt will be proof of memberships. Temporary one-day memberships are no longer available.
- 4) Any horse, in any class at a competition, may, while on the competition grounds, be selected for equine medication control testing. (Article A1006) Medication testing fees are \$4.00 per horse for bronze and \$8.00 for gold division of the show.
- 5) Copies of negative Coggins test must be included with the entry. Coggins tests with a stamped date within last 12 months will be accepted.

- 6) All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations."
- 7) Non-showing horses: All horses brought on the property during the competition must have a signed entry blank and owners/riders must have a current NBEA membership. Anyone riding non competing horses which have been brought on to the show grounds must wear a number issued by the office.
- 8) Horse Recordings are not required for the bronze division of the show.
- 9) As per Equestrian Canada rule article A805, the Show Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry, except as provided in A805.2 (a, b, c, d, e).
- 10) The show will refund 50% of the entry fee less the fees for classes completed if the horse entered is withdrawn due to unsoundness or sickness provided a veterinarian's certificate is produced, dated no later than the closing day of the show and received within 10 days of the show date.
- 11) All riders, grooms, attendants and handlers must be neatly dressed on entering the ring. ARTICLE G109 DRESS. Dress code for jumpers G109 polo shirts are acceptable attire in the jumper ring.
- 12) When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self coached. Coaches from other countries, must be in good standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General

SAFETY RULES:

- 1) ARTICLE G102 HEADGEAR
 - At all EC-sanctioned competitions, <u>all competitors</u>, including foreign competitors in EC National classes, must wear approved helmets, with safety harness correctly fastened, at all times while mounted on the competition grounds.
 - b. Juniors showing any horse in a jog for soundness must wear approved protective headwear with the attached safety harness fastened.
 - c. Failure to comply with G102.1 in the exercise area and/or the competition arena will result in the following penalties:
 - i. 1st violation at competition: warning.
 - ii. 2nd violation at same competition: disqualification from the competition and forfeiture of all fees and prize monies.
 - d. EC makes no representation or warranty expressed or implied about any protective headgear and cautions riders that serious injury or death may result despite wearing such headgear as all equestrian sports involve inherent dangerous risk and adds no protective helmet can protect against all foreseeable injuries.
 - e. All violations which occur outside the competition arena will be reported to the judge/jury who will levy the applicable penalty.
 - f. All violations which occur in the competition arena will be acted upon by the judge(s) who will levy the applicable penalty.
 - g. For all competitors, if the harness comes undone or the hat falls off, the rider must retrieve and/or do up the hat, with assistance if necessary, before the next obstacle is taken. There will be no penalty other than the loss of time. Failure to do up the harness or retrieve protective headgear immediately results in elimination.
- The show committee does not accept responsibility for accidents or illness to horses, riders, grooms, spectators or any other persons.

3) Exhibitors competing for provincial points are requested to enter the animal in the name of the member of the family who is the official Equestrian Canada member.

4) ARTICLE G101 EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES

It is mandatory that all national and provincial competitions have on site emergency medical services with a minimum of advanced first aid and basic cardiac life support (BCLS). Jumping in competition and warm-up areas should be suspended if the sole medic onsite is handling an emergency she/he cannot leave.

5) ARTICLE G103 FALLS

After being eliminated for a fall, the rider may not remount in the ring. Any rider who does remount in the ring after a fall will be eliminated from all classes in that ring for the remainder of the day. A rider who remounts after a fall and takes another obstacle will be disqualified from the remainder of the show. In the case of a fall of an Athlete anywhere within the grounds of the event during the hours of competition operation, the Athlete must be checked by the Competition's medical service, before the Athlete may continue to compete in the next round or Competition. The competitor is solely responsible for ensuring the onsite medical assessment takes place. This rule is applicable to all competitors (including foreign) at EC sanctioned events and applies to falls/accidents that occur at the event location.

6) ARTICLE G104 IN-GATE

In all classes, trotting or cantering through the in-gate without prior permission is forbidden. The penalty for contravening this rule is either a fine or elimination from the class, at the discretion of the judge. Under special circumstances, a steward or judge may give permission for a horse to trot into the ring, but not out of the ring.

7) ARTICLE G105 STALLIONS

- 1. Junior B and C riders must not ride or handle stallions anywhere on the competition grounds. Jr. A riders may ride manageable stallions in jumper classes only.
- 2. Manageable stallions ridden by seniors are eligible for all senior classes. A stallion ridden by a Junior must be accompanied at all times by a competent adult/handler Person Responsible.

8) ARTICLE A808 and G501 HORS CONCOURS

- 1. "Hors Concours" entries may be accepted at the competition committee's discretion but are subject to the same scoring rules as a regular entry with respect to falls, elimination etc. Such entries are not judged and are not eligible for the jump off.
- 2. A horse or pony that has competed "Hors Concours" is not allowed to compete subsequently in the same ring on the same day. A horse or pony may only compete "Hors Concours" once in the same ring on the same day.
- 3. "Hors Concours" entries will follow the last regular entry in the class.
- 4. "Hors Concours" is not allowed in the EC Hunter Division but is in the Jumper division. G201.3
- Cell phones, iPods, etc. are not recommended to be used while riding. See ARTICLE G114 COMMUNICATION and use of earbuds
- 10) Any horse that becomes out of control shall be eliminated from the competition at the discretion of the Judge and Steward . A1307.8 A judge must order from the ring any unruly or unsafe horse and/or rider or driver or anyone whose actions threaten to endanger other competitors, their entries or the public. A1311.2d Stewards PREVENT problems by: Barring unmanageable horses or ponies from the schooling rings.
- 12) Lunging will not be permitted in the warm-up ring if there is more than one rider in the ring.
- 13) Schooling Rules: reference Hunter/Jumper schooling rules see Annex 1 page 107 Section G rule book. FEI schooling rules will be in force.

Per Article A801, every entry at an EC sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not

participate in this EC sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition."

New Brunswick Bronze competitors require NBEA membership. Bronze Membership may be purchased from Equestrian Canada. New Brunswick Gold competitors require NBEA membership. Gold Membership may be purchased from Equestrian Canada (www.equestrian.ca) – printed receipt will be accepted for proof of Equestrian Canada membership. EC Horse Recordings and Jump Canada Levy are not required for Bronze classes, but are for the Gold classes

Bronze classes will count as qualifiers for the 2023 NBEA Hunter/Jumper Bronze Championships. See www.nbea.ca for more details.

Note: Horses Entering Hunter Divisions may only enter 2 of 3 divisions in consecutive order. (i.e., Intro and 2'3" Hunter OR Beginner and Heritage Low Hunter).

See Equestrian Canada jumper rules. Junior, amateur riders may not compete in german martingales or draw reins. Section G Annex 1 # 4.2b pg 108 A horse/rider combination is permitted unlimited upward movement through divisions, but downward movement is restricted to only one level. These movements are based on the level of the first class in which they competed. G603 and G604.

- 19) Intro Hunter #1 (Over fences: A simple hunter course of at least 8 fences with no combinations. Emphasis of judging on jumping style, manners and way of going. G401.1. Trotting to fences will not be penalized. Distances not to be adjusted for horses and ponies. Maximum height and width to be 22" (0.55m). Fences may be low verticals or oxers. Majority of fences to be 18" (0.45m). Open to seniors riding horses or large ponies and juniors riding horses or ponies of any height.
- 20) Intro Hunter #2
- 21) Intro Hunter under Saddle (To be shown at walk, trot and canter, both ways of the ring. No more than eight to hand-gallop at one time. In order to maintain awards, horses/ponies must compete and complete the course in at least one fences class in their respective division.) G318.1

Entries in this division are limited to the Intro and 2'3" Hunter Divisions. A pony ridden by an adult must not be shown by a junior in the same competition. G201.2

PRE-BEGINNER HUNTER: (2'3") .70m – Miscellaneous, not rated for Equestrian Canada Awards.

Entry Fee: \$75 for division (2 over fences and 1 under saddle)

Prize: Prize for first Ribbons 1st to 6th

22) Pre-Beginner Hunter $\#1-(To\ complete\ a\ hunter-type\ jumping\ course\ of\ at\ least\ 8\ obstacles\ not\ to\ exceed\ 2'3"\ (0.70m)\ in\ height.\ To\ be\ judged\ on\ jumping\ style,\ manners\ and\ way\ of\ going\ G401.1.\ Open\ to\ seniors\ riding\ horses\ or\ large\ ponies\ and\ juniors\ riding\ horses\ or\ ponies\ .$ The course may, but is not required, to be adjusted in height and distance for ponies.) Juniors\ of\ any\ age\ may\ show\ any\ height\ of\ pony\ in\ miscellaneous,\ non-point\ classes.\ G306.

BEGINNER HUNTER- Miscellaneous, not rated for Equestrian Canada Awards.

Juniors of any age may show any height of pony in miscellaneous, non-point classes. G306.

Equitation classes are divided by age groups as follows: Individuals are juniors until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18. Article A901.

Routine on the flat: Article G1007. Riders will proceed at least once around the ring at each gait – walk, trot, sitting trot and canter, reverse and repeat. At the judge's discretion, they may be asked to execute an individual test.

37) Jr. "A" Hunter Seat (not to jump) Equestrian Canada

Riders are such from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16 until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18. Junior A: a rider who is 15, 16, 17 on January 1 G1006.2

38) Jr. "B" Hunter Seat (not to jump) Equestrian Canada

Riders are such from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 13 until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 15. 1 c) Junior B: a rider who is 12, 13 or 14 on January 1 G1006.2

39) J. "C" Hunter Seat (not to jump) Equestrian Canada

Riders are such until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 12. d) Junior C: a rider who is under 12 on January 1 G1006.2

40) Amateur/Senior Hunter Seat (not to jump) Equestrian Canada

Members will be classified as Senior from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 19.

Road Hack: Horses to enter ring at a walk. To be shown a flat-footed walk with a reasonably-loose rein, trot, strong trot, easy canter and hand gallop. Only 8 horses to hand gallop at one time. To be judged on performance, substance, conformation and manners.

- 3. If ridden by a junior, heights of ponies and age of riders to be the same as in pony hunters. Junior C riders will be judged and pinned separately from Junior A & B riders in Junior classes.

48) Walk-Trot Equitation: The class will proceed at least once around the ring at each gait – walk and trot and on command, reverse and repeat. Riders will then line up on command. The judge may ask questions about tack or horsemanship that would be suitable to the ability and age of the riders in the class.

An individual test may be requested prior to the group class routine on the flat. This pattern may include a simple figure of eight pattern or a simple pattern provided by the judge and posted at least one hour prior to the class. Riders who do not perform the individual test will not be eliminated and may proceed to the class routine on the flat.
