Carmaz Stables Horse Show is a sanctioned Bronze competition, member of Equine Canada, 308 Legget Dr, Suite 100, Ottawa Ontario, K2K 1Y6 and is governed by the rules of EC.

Statement of Principal

Equine Canada, the National Federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction.

Equine Canada is committed to:

Upholding the welfare of horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities. Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment.

Ensuring that owners, trainers, exhibitors and their agents use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for Any Purpose.

Providing for the continuous well being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, sanitation and safety as a matter of standard operating procedures

providing current information on Code of Practice for the Care and Handling of Equines and other equine health and welfare initiatives.

Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare

Requiring owners, trainers and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules and to work with industry regulations in all equestrian competitions.

Reviewing, revising and developing competition rules and regulations the protect the welfare of horses.

The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a responsible person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive nor inhumane.

Code of Conduct

Safety of horse and human athlete
Administration of competitions
Code of conduct for officials and competitors
Drug and medication control
Individual breed and discipline rules

Show Rules

- 1) Entries are asked to be in by Aug 21st. Any entry received after that Thursday will be considered a late entry and subject to the \$15 per horse late fee on top of the regular fees.
- 2) All information must be completed on the show form and all forms signed for the entry to be accepted
- 3) Cheques are made payable to "Carmaz Stables Horse Show" No postdated cheques please. NSF cheques will be charged a \$50 admin fee. For the convenience of the competitors will be also

- accept emailed entries if only accompanied or followed by an email money transfer. Please send to rinzlercarole@mail.com
- 4) Entries can be mailed to Carmaz Stables c/o show secretary, 45933 Homestead road, River Glade nb, E4Z 6J4
- 5) All entries must be made in writing (Article 801.4) Show numbers will not be issued if all the required signatures are not complete. Must also send in copies of memberships (ec bronze and pso) and proof of vaccinations (rabies, flu, rhino, and tetanus)
- 6) Official protests must be made in writing to the secretary of the competition, signed and accompanied by a \$100 cash deposit within 48 hours of completion of the class (EC Article A1206)
- 7) Competition numbers must be worn and visible at all times in the show ring and in the warmup ring (EC Article A814)
- 8) Ribbons to 6th and some classes may have money payouts or prizes
- 9) Scratches will not be reimbursed
- 10) Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of Equine Canada and will be held and judged in accordance with the Equine Canada rule book. Any incident requiring a ruling which cannot be referenced to the EC rule book, will be rendered by the show committee.
- 11) Post entries will be accepted up to one hour prior to the class and will be subject to an additional charge of \$5 on top of the regular class fee or division fee
- 12) Entry forms must be signed by the exhibitor, owner and person responsible. If the owner or exhibitor is under 19 years of age, the entry must be signed by a parent or legal guardian who assumes all responsibility and risk as stated on the form and by these rules and regulations. The entry form for all sanctioned competitions shall also be signed by the person responsible fir the care, training, custody and performance of the horse. The person responsible may be the trainer, owner, rider, agent or coach. The parent or guardian must sign the form if there is no other person responsible. The person responsible must be present at the competition and if they cannot attend, must appoint a representative who is present on the show grounds and must notify the competition secretary (Article A1011) With the exception of a parent (see A214.2), the person responsible who signs an entry form must hold a EC or USEF individual license (see A203.5) Foreign entries must sign an affidavit (Article A404)
- 13) Management has the right to expel any rider, owner or spectator deemed to be in their sole discretion disruptive to the show at any time
- 14) We ask that no dogs be on the property.
- 15) Bronze classes do not require passports or jump Canada levy. Bronze sport licenses are required for all bronze classes and can be purchased at www.equinecanada.ca.
- 16) Entry fees are \$12/class or \$30/division. Stake classes are \$20. Carmaz Classic is \$30
- 17) First Aid kit located in the porch in the canteen.
- 18) Limited stalls are available. Please call ahead for availability. Preference will be given to those traveling the furthest. Can also contact local barns if our barn gets full. \$35 for Sunday. \$55 for sat night and Sunday (arrival after 6pm sat). \$75 for fri night, sat for the CSHA inspection and for the show sunday.
- 19) Canteen on site
- 20) Any horse, in any class at the competition, may, while on the grounds, be selected for equine medication control testing (Article A1006)
- 21) All riders, grooms, attendants and handlers must be neatly dressed on entering the ring. Article G109 Dress. Dress code for jumpers G109 polo shirts are acceptable attire in the jumper ring. Per Article A801, every entry at an EC sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and each horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in

any capacity in EC sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed be the competition.

Class Descriptions

<u>Hunter Divisions:</u> Miscellaneous, not rated for ec awards. Open to seniors riding horses or large ponies and juniors on horse or pony. A pony shown by an adult must not be shown by a junior at the same competition. Juniors of any age may show any height of pony in misc, not point classes. Article G306 2&3. Distances will not be adjusted for ponies. G201, G202. Must have completed one over fences class to qualify for the under saddle class. G318

<u>Crossrail Division:</u> Classes 1, 2, & 3. Shown at a trot or canter over 7-8 crossrails no higher than 18". Emphasis will be placed on a) horses ridden in a safe and controlled manner b) a correct and effective path to and away from the fences c) jumping style

<u>Intro Division:</u> Classes 4, 5, &6. Shown at a trot or canter over 7-8 low verticals or oxers no higher than 22" Emphasis will be placed on a) horses ridden in a safe and controlled manner b) a correct and effective path to and away from the fences c) jumping style

<u>Beginner Division:</u> Classes 7, 8 &9 Shown at a canter over 8-10 fences. Verticals and Oxers with a max height of 2'6". To be judged on obedience, form and general way of going.

<u>Low Division:</u> Classes 10, 11&12 Shown at a canter over 8-10 fences. Max height 2'9". To be judged on obedience, form and general way of going.

<u>Carmaz Classic:</u> Class 13. Shown at a canter over 8-12 fences for first round and a shortened course for those who qualify for round 2. May include combinations, broken lines and roll backs. Max height 2'6". Top 8 from round one to return in order of 8^{th} position up to 1^{st} with both rounds receiving scores. Top score from both rounds will be the winner. This class has a payout of \$220 total. 1^{st} -\$75, 2^{nd} - \$50, 3^{rd} -\$45, 4^{th} -\$30, 5^{th} -\$20

<u>Jumper Divisions:</u> Equine Canada rules G701-708 FEI Article 201-227 Miscellaneous jumper divisions. Not rated for EC awards. See EC jumper rules. Junior, amateur or non pro riders may not compete in draw reins G502. A horse/rider combination is permitted upward movement through divisions, but downward movement is restricted to only one level. These movements are based on the level of the first class in which they compete. G604.3 Each class is paid on a per class basis of \$12/class

<u>.80 Meter Jumper:</u> Immediate jump off, not rated for EC awards. Class 14 – Welcome class, Table A2.2, FEI Article 238. Class 15 – Speed class, Table C, FEI Article 239

<u>.90 Meter Jumper:</u> Immediate jump off, not rated for EC awards. Class 16 – Welcome class, Table A2.2, FEI Article 238. Class 17 – Speed class, Table C, FEI Article 239

<u>1 Meter Jumper:</u> Immediate jump off, not rated for EC awards. Class 18 – Welcome class, Table A2.2, FEI Article 238. Class 19 – Speed class, Table C, FEI Article 239

<u>1.10 Meter Jumper:</u> Immediate jump off, not rated for EC awards. Class 20 – Welcome class, Table A2.2, FEI Article 238. Class 21 – Speed class, Table C, FEI Article 239

<u>3 Year Old Canadian Bred:</u> Class 22. Line class, they must be shown in a bridle. Must provide a copy of papers. Miscellaneous.

<u>Equitation Classes – Flat:</u> Classes 23-26. Juniors may show ponies G1001-G1009. Riders to be judged on equitation. Ages for equitation classes G1006.2 a,b,c. Individuals are juniors until the end of the calendar year in which they turn 18. Junior A – a rider who is 15, 16, 17 on jan 1^{st} 2014

Junior B – a rider who is 12, 13, 14 on jan 1st 2014

Junior C – a rider who is under 12 on jan 1st 2014

<u>Hack Division:</u> No breastplates, whips, martingales, flash or drop nosebands, boots or bandages of any kind. No saddle suits, no Kentucky jodphers and no saddle seat tack. EC G chapter 12-13. Hack division price \$30 for the 2 regular classes and the equitation where you fit. Stake classes are \$20 each <u>Open Pleasure & Road Hack:</u> Classes 30 & 35. Open to all juniors and seniors riding horses. Ponies to enter Pony classes, classes 31 & 36 G1201, G1204, G1205

Pleasure classes 27-31: Shown at a flat footed walk, normal trot, easy canter; not to gallop, light contact with the horses mouth; judged on manners, performance and conformation.

Road havk classes 32-36: Shown on a light to medium contact at walk, normal and strong trot, canter and controlled hand gallop.

Stake class payouts: 1^{st} – \$50, 2^{nd} - \$40, 3^{rd} - \$35, 4^{th} - \$30, 5^{th} - \$25
